TAB A

- The digital advertising sign will be located above the lanterns and is visible when viewed by an approaching vehicle from the north, particularly vehicles travelling in lane 2 & 3 and could be a distraction to drivers if the luminance levels of the sign are brighter than the traffic signal lanterns. In this regard it should be conditioned that the brightness of the sign display should not impact the visibility of the traffic signals at any time and shall be in accordance with the Transport Corridor Outdoor Advertising and Signage Guidelines 2017 and relevant Australian Standards.
- The images displayed on the sign must not contain/use:
 - a) Flashing or flickering lights or content;
 - b) Animated displays, moving parts or simulated movement;
 - c) Complex displays that hold a driver's attention beyond "glance appreciation";

d) Displays resembling traffic control devices by use of colour, shape or words that can be construed as giving instruction to traffic for example, red, amber or green circles, octagons, crosses, triangles and words such as 'stop' or 'halt';

- e) A method of illumination that distracts or dazzles;
- f) Dominant use of colours red or green
- The digital sign for its operation must comply with the requirements in Transport Corridor Outdoor Advertising and Signage Guidelines 2017 (refer to Section 2.5.8, Table 3 and Section 3.3) and relevant Australian Standards, as amended from time to time.
- Construction and maintenance activities shall be undertaken wholly within the private property of the site. If this is not possible Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) should be obtained from Transport Management Centre for any works that may impact on traffic flows on Castlereagh Road during installation.
