RE: Re-Notification of Activity – Temporary use of helipad Shoalhaven Emergency Management Centre, 92 Albatross Road, South Nowra

NSW Health Infrastructure (HI), is proposing to temporarily use the existing helipad at the Shoalhaven Emergency Management Centre, 92 Albatross Road, South Nowra (Lot 1 DP 860791) for a period of up to three (3) years commencing in early June 2023 and ending by June 2026. The recent State Significant Development DA for the Shoalhaven Hospital Redevelopment has now been determined and during the construction of the Acute Services Building a temporary helipad will be required to ensure rapid transportation is still available for critically ill patients in need of urgent medical care while the new hospital is being built. Once the Acute Services Building is completed in 2026, a new rooftop helipad will become operational.

While this proposal does not require development consent from Council, we are required to assess its likely impacts in accordance with Part 5 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*. In accordance with section 2.52(7) of the *State Environmental Planning Policy (Transport and Infrastructure) 2021*, we are notifying Council of our intention to carry out the activity and ask that you provide any comments on the proposal within 21 calendar days of the date of this letter. These comments will then be considered in our assessment of the proposal.

For your information, a plan indicating the location the Shoalhaven Emergency Management Centre and its helipad is included over the page. Generally, the proposed activity comprises the temporary use of the helipad by NSW Ambulance / Toll Ambulance Rescue Helicopter Service. The service will be supported by NSW Ambulance Service road-based ambulances which will traffic / ferry patients relying upon the helicopter to/from Shoalhaven Hospital. Up to 10-15 helicopters are anticipated per month. Minor ancillary works are proposed to install a windsock, light pole, and firefighting equipment in proximity of the helipad. Removal of the tree at the corner of Albatross Road and Coral Sea Drive may also be required.
