## 1. Proposal and Site Details

**Description of Proposal** 


The proposal involves:

- Creation of an approximate 635m<sup>2</sup> hardstand carparking / turning area for the storage of Council plant *i.e.* operational vehicles and trailers.
- Retention of a shipping container to the south of the existing covered stables for the storage of small plant, equipment and materials. *NB: already installed*
- Construction of a metal shed (9 metres x 7.5 metres with a 3 metre awning on either side) on concrete slab with power and stormwater connection.

#### <u>Site</u>

- The proposed activity would occur in the southern area of the Milton Showground.
- The proposed activity would occur over Lot 1 DP630910 which is owned by Shoalhaven City Council and is community land with a sportsground designation under the NSW *Local Government Act 1993*.
- The site is managed under the Plan of Management Milton Showground
- The vegetation on the site is comprises pasture grasses, herbs and forbs typical of the area *e.g.* White Clover, Paspalum, Kikuyu, *Rumex, etc.* No native vegetation would be impacted.
- The land is managed by Swim Sport and Fitness (SSF) who is the proponent of the proposed activity.

# 4. Safeguards and Mitigation Measures

# Note that safeguards and mitigation measures are prescribed as requirements unless otherwise stated.

Safeguard / Measure		
1.	Exclusion fencing (or similar) shall be installed around the site prior to commencement of construction activities, to prevent access by the public during works.	
2.	Prior to any earthworks being undertaken, erosion and sediment mitigation devices are to be erected in a manner consistent with the 'Bluebook' (Landcom 2004) to prevent erosion and off-site migration of sediment. Erosion and sediment controls shall be maintained in good working order for the duration of the works and subsequently until the site has been stabilised and the risk of erosion is minimal.	
3.	The stables shall remain available for large animal evacuation operations during emergencies.	
4.	Any waste material which is brought to or stored on the site, including engineering fill, must comply with relevant Resource Recovery Orders and associated Exemptions.	
5.	Waste generated from the site shall be reused in accordance with applicable POEO Resource Recovery Orders and associated Exemptions or otherwise disposed of at a licenced waste facility.	



## 5. SIGNIFICANCE EVALUATION & DECISION STATEMENT

This Review of Environmental Factors has assessed the likely environmental impacts, in the context of Part 5 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, of a proposal by Shoalhaven City Council for the establishment of a Swim Sport and Fitness Central Precinct maintenance depot at the Milton Showground.

In consideration of the proposal as described and assuming the implementation of all prescribed safeguards and mitigation measures, it is determined that:

- 1. It is unlikely that there will be any significant environmental impact as a result of the proposed work and an Environmental Impact Statement is not required for the proposed works.
- 2. The proposed activity will not be carried out in a declared area of outstanding biodiversity value and is not likely to significantly affect threatened species, populations or ecological communities, or their habitats, and a Species Impact Statement / Biodiversity Deveelopment Assessment Report is not required.
- 3. No statutory approvals, licences, permits or external government consultations are required.
- 4. The proposed activity may proceed.

In accepting and adopting this REF, Shoalhaven City Council commits to ensuring the implementation of the proposed safeguards and mitigation measures identified in this report (Section 4) to minimise and/or prevent detrimental environmental impacts.
