# **Executive summary**

The NSW Department of Education engaged GML Heritage Pty Ltd (GML) to prepare an Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment report (ACHAR) for the proposed Gables Public School. This report forms part of the environmental assessment for the study area prepared under Part 5 of the NSW *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*.

This report aims to:

- identify, assess and report on Aboriginal heritage values within the study area;
- involve the Aboriginal community in decisions with respect to its heritage;
- determine whether, and how, the Gables Public School project may harm these Aboriginal heritage values; and
- establish the mechanism for conserving, and mitigating harm to, these values.

Based on the identification of potential issues, and an assessment of the nature and extent of the proposed development, it is determined that:

- The extent and nature of potential impacts are low and are unlikely to have significant adverse effects on the locality, community and the environment.
- Potential impacts can be appropriately mitigated or managed to ensure there is minimal effect on the locality, community and the environment.

The archaeological assessment, as reported herein, has identified nil to low potential for Aboriginal archaeological deposits based on the environmental and archaeological context. An analysis of historical activities, and previous archaeological and environmental investigations, has found that comprehensive ground disturbances have largely removed deposits with the potential to retain Aboriginal archaeological material. These activities have almost certainly removed any archaeological material that may have been present, and the study area would not be expected to hold Aboriginal objects, unless within a displaced context. We therefore advise that ground disturbance works can be undertaken, subject to caution.

The cultural heritage assessment of the study area has confirmed the identified social and cultural connections between the study area and the wider Aboriginal cultural landscape of Gables. The Registered Aboriginal Parties for the project provided several strategies for heritage interpretation and community involvement which could be incorporated into the design of the school.

# **1** Introduction

This Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment report (ACHAR) has been prepared by GML Heritage Pty Ltd (GML) on behalf of NSW Department of Education (DoE) (the Applicant) to assess the potential environmental impacts that could arise from the development of The Gables New Primary School at Lot 301 DP 1287967 on Fontana Drive, Gables (the site).

This report has been prepared to identify whether the study area possesses, or has the potential to possess, Aboriginal heritage archaeological sites, places, objects, landscapes or values, in accordance with the Heritage NSW guidelines for Aboriginal heritage assessment. This report provides a significance assessment of the identified archaeological Aboriginal sites, places, landscapes and/or other values. An impact assessment and management recommendations are provided to assist NSW Department of Education (DoE) with its future responsibilities for managing Aboriginal cultural heritage within the study area.

This report accompanies a Review of Environmental Factors (REF) that seeks approval for the construction and operation of a new primary school at the site, which includes the following works:

- Construction of school buildings, including learning hubs, a school hall and an administration and library building.
- Construction and operation of a public preschool.
- Delivery of a sports court and fields.
- Construction of car parking, waste storage and loading area.
- Associated site landscaping and open space improvements.
- Associated off-site infrastructure works to support the school, including (but not limited to) services, driveways and pedestrian crossings.

For a detailed project description, refer to the Review of Environmental Factors prepared by Ethos Urban.

#### 1.1 Site description

The site (referred to as the study area in this report) is located on Cataract Road, Gables, within The Hills Local Government Area (LGA), approximately 50km northwest of the Sydney CBD and 10km north of the Rouse Hill Town Centre. It comprises one lot, legally described as Lot 301 DP 1287967, that measures approximately 2.2ha in area. The site is bounded by Pennant Way to the north, Cataract Road to the east, Fontana Drive to the west and a vacant lot to the south.



An aerial image of the site is shown in Figure 1.2.

The site is located on Darug Country and lies within the Deerubbin Local Aboriginal Land Council (LALC) boundary. The Aboriginal cultural heritage of the study area was previously assessed prior to the preparation of this report. These previous reports established that the study area held nil to low archaeological potential but has intangible cultural heritage values which should be considered when designing the future school. In this report we aim to re-evaluate the study area in the context of the currently proposed development.

#### 1.1.1 Statement of Significance

Based on the identification of potential issues, and an assessment of the nature and extent of the proposed development, it is determined that:

- The extent and nature of potential impacts are low and are unlikely to have significant adverse effects on the locality, community and the environment.
- Potential impacts can be appropriately mitigated or managed to ensure there is minimal effect on the locality, community and the environment



# **1.2 Objectives of this Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment**

Our objectives for this ACHAR were to:

- understand and record Aboriginal heritage places and values, and determine whether these are part of a larger Aboriginal cultural landscape and/or Aboriginal traditions;
- identify and consult with local Aboriginal community members who can speak for Country;
- involve the local Aboriginal community in the process of assessing cultural heritage values, and determine best-practice options for the future management of the identified Aboriginal cultural heritage;
- determine how the proposed project may impact any identified Aboriginal cultural heritage values, and aim to minimise impacts through sensible and pragmatic site and land management; and
- provide clear recommendations for the conservation of Aboriginal heritage values and relevant impact mitigation strategies that benefit both Aboriginal cultural heritage and the proponent.

#### **1.3 Statutory context**

In NSW, Aboriginal heritage is principally protected under two Acts:

- the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974 (NSW) (NPW Act); and
- the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (NSW) (EPA Act).

#### 1.3.1 National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974

The NPW Act provides statutory protection for all Aboriginal 'objects' (consisting of any material evidence of the Indigenous occupation of New South Wales) under Section 90 of the NPW Act, and for 'Aboriginal Places' (areas of cultural significance to the Aboriginal community) under Section 84 of the NPW Act. In NSW Aboriginal objects and places are afforded automatic statutory protection whereby it is an offence (without the Minister's consent) to harm an Aboriginal object or declared Aboriginal Place.

The NPW Act defines an Aboriginal object as:

any deposit, object or material evidence (not being a handicraft made for sale) relating to the Aboriginal habitation of the area that comprises New South Wales, being habitation before or concurrent with (or both) the occupation of that area by persons of non-Aboriginal extraction, and includes Aboriginal remains.

The protection provided to Aboriginal objects and places applies irrespective of the level of their significance or issues of land tenure.



Sites of traditional significance that do not necessarily contain material remains may be gazetted as 'Aboriginal Places' and thereby be protected under the NPW Act. However, areas are only gazetted if the Minister is satisfied that sufficient evidence exists to demonstrate that the location was or is of special significance to Aboriginal culture.

A strict liability offence applies for harm to, or desecration of, an Aboriginal object or declared Aboriginal Place.<sup>1</sup> The definition of 'harm' includes destroying, defacing, damaging or moving an Aboriginal object or declared Aboriginal Place. The strict liability offence of harming Aboriginal objects has a number of defences. The two defences relevant to the proposed development are the statutory defence of due diligence through complying with an adopted industry code or compliance with the conditions of an Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP).

The potential for Aboriginal objects, sites, places and values within the study area, and for the proposed development to impact such objects, has been assessed and the results are presented in this report.

#### **1.3.2 Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979**

The EPA Act provides a statutory framework for the determination of development proposals. It provides for the identification, protection and management of heritage items through inclusion in schedules to planning instruments such as local environmental plans (LEPs) or state environmental planning policies (SEPPs). Most heritage items in planning instruments are historic sites but Aboriginal objects and places can also be listed, as can conservation areas and archaeological sites. The EPA Act requires that appropriate measures be taken for the management of the potential archaeological resource by means consistent with practices and standards adopted in meeting the requirements of the NPW Act.

The study area is in the Hills Shire local government area and comes under *The Hills Local Environmental Plan 2019*. No items within the study area are listed as heritage items.

#### 1.3.3 Approach to Aboriginal heritage management

In NSW, Aboriginal heritage assessment and management is underpinned by several guidelines and policies. Our approach is based on the following guidelines:

- Guide to Determining and Issuing Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permits, 2009;<sup>2</sup>
- Operational Policy: Protecting Aboriginal Cultural Heritage, 2009;<sup>3</sup>
- Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents 2010;<sup>4</sup>
- Due Diligence Code of Practice for the Protection of Aboriginal Objects in NSW, 2010 (the Due Diligence Code);<sup>5</sup>



- Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales, 2010 (the Code of Practice);<sup>6</sup>
- Guide to Investigating, Assessing and Reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in NSW, 2011;<sup>7</sup> and
- The Burra Charter: the Australia ICOMOS Charter for Places of Cultural Significance 2013 (the Burra Charter).<sup>8</sup>

#### 1.3.4 The Burra Charter process

The Burra Charter (Article 6) outlines a three-stage process for the assessment and management of heritage. The three stages are:

- 1 develop an understanding of heritage significance;
- 2 develop policy that is appropriate to the significance; and
- 3 undertake management in accordance with the policy.<sup>9</sup>

#### Definition of key terms

The Burra Charter's definitions of key heritage terms provide the basis for definitions used in this report. The Burra Charter's Indigenous Practice Note provides further guidance for applying the Burra Charter to Aboriginal heritage. We have used the following definitions:

#### Place

Place means a geographically defined area. It may include elements, objects, spaces and views. Place may have tangible and intangible dimensions. $^{10}$ 

'Place' includes locations that embody spiritual value (such as Dreaming places, sacred landscapes, and stone arrangements), social and historical value (such as massacre sites), as well as scientific value (such as archaeological sites). In fact, one place may be all of these things or may embody all of these values at the same time.<sup>11</sup>

#### **Cultural Significance Cultural significance**

Cultural significance means aesthetic, historic, scientific, social or spiritual value for past, present or future generations. Cultural significance is embodied in the place itself, its fabric, setting, use, associations, meanings, records, related places and related objects. Places may have a range of values for different individuals or groups.<sup>12</sup>

#### Use

Use means the functions of a place, including the activities and traditional and customary practices that may occur at the place or are dependent on the place. $^{13}$ 



#### Compatible Use Compatible use

Compatible use means a use which respects the cultural significance of a place. Such a use involves no, or minimal, impact on cultural significance.<sup>14</sup>

#### Setting

Conservation requires the retention of an appropriate setting. This includes retention of the visual and sensory setting, as well as the retention of spiritual and other cultural relationships that contribute to the cultural significance of the place.<sup>15</sup>

Places of significance to Indigenous people require a holistic approach to 'setting'. 'Setting' may encompass the broadest of experiential factors including a sense of 'intrusion' occasioned when people of the 'wrong' gender, age or level of initiation trespass on defined areas, as well as auditory and visual intrusion.

For some Indigenous peoples, nature and culture are indivisible. The social significance and spiritual significance of a place for Indigenous people may be wholly or partly dependent on the natural environment that the place forms a part of, including aspects such as biodiversity, and totemic and resource species.<sup>16</sup>

#### Application to the current assessment

To follow the Burra Charter process, we have undertaken the following steps.

#### Step 1—understand the place

This involved investigating the study area's environment, archaeology and history, and relevant heritage literature. Field survey was undertaken in collaboration with the Aboriginal community. The outcome of the step 1 investigations was the development of archaeological and landscape maps and plans that show the known sites, places and values connected to the study area. Our approach followed the notion that the study area is part of the Cumberland Plain Aboriginal cultural landscape, and the study area represents a small zone within that landscape.

#### Step 2—assess cultural significance

The assessment of cultural significance considered the study area's aesthetic, historic, scientific and social aspects. This assessment should be used for future management, noting both that 'cultural significance may change'<sup>17</sup> and 'tangible heritage should not be emphasised at the expense of intangible heritage'.<sup>18</sup>

#### Step 3—identify factors and issues

The results from steps 1 and 2 were used to identify key future management factors and issues. The issues and factors identified define future needs, opportunities and constraints connected with possible future compatible use.



#### Step 4—develop policy

The analysis that formed the outcome from step 3 was applied to develop appropriate management policy, in consultation with the Aboriginal community and in accordance with relevant NSW statutory processes outlined in Section 1.3.3 above.

# 2 Understanding the study area



### 2 Understanding the study area

The purpose of this chapter is to provide contextual information to inform our understanding of Aboriginal people's occupation, use and connections within the study area. This section is separated into the following parts:

- Section 2.1 identifies the traditional Aboriginal connections with the study area.
- Section 2.2 presents the outcomes of relevant prior Aboriginal heritage work.
- Section 2.3 provides an overview of the existing environmental setting.
- Section 2.4 details the recent history of land use.
- Section 2.5 outlines a predictive model of the archaeological potential of the study area, by synthesising the information from Sections 2.1 to 2.4.

#### 2.1 Aboriginal cultural background

The study area is situated on the traditional lands of the Darug (also spelt Dharug), a major language group that extended across Sydney's Cumberland Plain. The word Darug may have been a generic term for underground plant food, such as yams. The Darug were made up of numerous clans (or mobs). The land surrounding Gables is known to have been local to two clans: the Cattai and the Bidji. The Cattai clan occupied lands around the Cattai Creek catchment. The word Cattai (also spelt Caddie, Caddye or Cathai) means 'swampy land where the wide river flats give way to less hospitable Country'. The Bidji (meaning 'river-flat clan') are known to have occupied much of the modern-day Hills Shire.

#### 2.1.1 'Deep time' Aboriginal connections




Figure 2.1 Timeline showing indicative dates for Aboriginal occupation in Australia overall and Sydney specifically. The Holocene start date reflects a technological shift observed within Aboriginal stone artefact technology; the conventional date for the start of the Holocene is 11,700 years ago. (Source: GML 2021)

Aboriginal people today describe their traditions and origins as commencing in 'deep time'. Humans evolved from their early hominid predecessors around 250,000 years ago and we understand that the first physical evidence for Aboriginal presence in Australia dates to 65,000 years before present (BP) (Figure 2.1). Archaeological evidence of the long history of Aboriginal connections with the Sydney Basin dates back approximately 38,000 years, during the Pleistocene epoch. Our understanding of Pleistocene Aboriginal cultures and traditions is limited; there are very few confirmed Pleistocene Aboriginal 'sites' in Sydney. During the Holocene (the last 11,700 years), Aboriginal society appears to have become increasingly complex with intertwined social, spiritual and economic relationships. These relationships were directly associated with the physical geography of Country.

Throughout the last 38,000 years the environment has changed dramatically. Sydney's landscape, watercourses and woodlands have not been static elements. They varied considerably over time and were influenced by changing climatic conditions, including long-term temperature and sea level fluctuations. If we are to understand these changes, and the effects they may have had on Aboriginal culture and society, we need to examine the deep time archaeological and paleoenvironmental record of the region. This could provide an understanding of how Aboriginal connections to the study area have changed through time.

#### Pleistocene

The Pleistocene is a geological epoch lasting from 2.58 million years BP until 11,700 BP. Across the Pleistocene, there were at least 20 glacial and interglacial cycles; these refer to changes from an ice age, with large and extensive polar ice caps (i.e. glacial), to warmer conditions when polar ice melted rapidly (i.e. interglacial), and then back to colder (glacial) conditions again. Of particular importance is the Last Glacial Maximum (LGM; approximately 27,000 to 17,000 BP). Sea levels were around 120m lower than today's, exposing the now-submerged continental shelf of Australia. The world's climate was considerably colder (temperatures were 5–10 degrees Celsius colder than today's averages<sup>1</sup>) and drier.

Understanding Aboriginal people's connections to the landscape during the Pleistocene epoch is difficult because of the length of time that has passed. Confirmed Pleistocene sites in Sydney tend to be associated with ancient rivers, such as the Hawkesbury-Nepean and Parramatta rivers. The Hawkesbury-Nepean appears to have been particularly significant as a source of raw IMSTC materials for lithic production during this period. These rivers may have been a focus for Aboriginal activities as areas providing



rich, consistent freshwater and terrestrial resources. It is possible that as Aboriginal people visited moved through the landscape and utilised the area, and nearby watercourses, for resource collection or other traditional activities, they also visited the study area.

#### **Terminal Pleistocene**

The terminal Pleistocene is defined in this report as the stretch of time following the LGM until the beginning of the Holocene (approximately 17,000–11,700 BP). Following the LGM, the climate warmed, melting icesheets across the planet and causing rapid sea level rise. Sea level rise resulted in the loss of the inner continental shelf, inundating approximately 11,000km<sup>2</sup> of terrestrial resources. Coastal Aboriginal people were forced far inland as the range of habitable landforms was reduced to formerly raised plains and upper ridgelines. This caused a major reorganisation of social and spatial boundaries.<sup>2</sup> The terminal Pleistocene therefore represents a time of rapid climatic change to which Aboriginal people were forced to adapt.

The relatively rapid drowning of coastal plains and river valleys meant that a substantial amount of time was required for environments to stabilise and be useful for resource exploitation. It has been suggested that it took Aboriginal societies a significant length of time to recover from these rapid climatic changes.<sup>3</sup> The Hawkesbury-Nepean River would have been a refuge because of its stable, elevated terraces, which were favoured for occupation, and because much of the surrounding marginal land was unused. Archaeological excavations in Parramatta have found that Aboriginal people may have made ephemeral visits to that area during the terminal Pleistocene, but they did not systematically use and occupy the area until after climatic conditions had stabilised. This may indicate that systematic occupation and land use within Gables similarly did not occur, or resume, until the Holocene.

It should be noted that these models are based on the current knowledge and understanding of the archaeological record within Sydney, which largely lacks soil or sedimentary deposits of this age. It is likely future archaeological research will increase our understanding of Aboriginal occupation during this time.

#### Holocene

The Holocene began around 11,700 BP and has been characterised by a wetter and warmer climate. Post-LGM sea level rise continued during the early Holocene. Current sea levels were reached around 7,700 BP and continued to rise to a high point of 1m to 2m above today's sea level by at least 7,400 BP, only receding to current levels around 1,500 BP.



The Holocene signalled the beginning of a more continuous archaeological record of Aboriginal occupation within the Sydney Basin. A stabilised climate allowed for more consistent ecological communities to develop across much of the Sydney Basin, which presented greater opportunities for resource exploitation. This, in turn, allowed for systematic landform use, which is reflected in the archaeological record, also coinciding with an increase in social and religious complexity. Most of the dated Aboriginal archaeological sites on the Cumberland Plain date to the mid to late Holocene, although it should be noted the region rarely retains soil or sediment deposits of older ages.

Sydney's archaeological record provides an enduring and extensive assemblage of cultural materials that reflect Aboriginal people's occupation of the region. Sydney Basin had significant sources of raw stone materials: silcrete, IMSTC and quartz. These materials were used by Aboriginal people to manufacture stone artefacts. The presence of materials is linked to their source and changing frequency and preferences for use over the Pleistocene and Holocene. This sequence of stone use is referred to as the Eastern Regional Sequence (ERS), with demonstrated changes over the last 10,000-plus years. Artefact variation across Sydney likely reflects changing clan and language boundaries as well as evolving trade networks throughout the region. Changes in artefact typology, raw material type and density are noted throughout the Cumberland Plain and provide a key record of the nature and character of Aboriginal connections to this landscape.

Archaeological evidence from throughout the Cumberland Plain has found a strong relationship between Aboriginal land use and landforms adjacent to watercourses. This provides an indication that these areas were occupied repeatedly and for extended periods of time for a variety of reasons, for example camping. The freshwater and woodland ecosystems of the area would have provided abundant food, water and timber resources. Archaeological field surveys and excavations within Gables have found grinding grooves and assemblages of stone artefacts, evidence of Aboriginal occupation and land use in association with Cataract Creek. Given the study area's proximity to Cataract Creek, it is possible that the study area was repeatedly occupied by Aboriginal people. Aboriginal Elders have also commented on the cultural and social significance of the creek as a location for fishing and swimming.

#### 2.1.2 Post–1788 Aboriginal connections

The establishment of European colonies within the Sydney Basin were the earliest indicators of an increasingly forcible imposition of European laws and ways of life on Aboriginal people. Europeans first reached the area around Gables in 1791 during an expedition to determine if the Hawkesbury and Nepean rivers were connected. While camping near modern-day Vineyard, the expedition encountered an Aboriginal man named Ber-ee-wan or Bur-ro-wai of the Boorooberongal clan.



This is the earliest recorded encounter between Europeans and Aboriginal people near Gables. By the time Europeans reached Gables, the local Aboriginal population was likely already significantly reduced following the 1789 smallpox epidemic. In 1790, Bennelong estimated to Governor Arthur Philip that over half of Sydney's original Aboriginal population had died during the epidemic.

The Darug were amongst the first Aboriginal peoples to experience the profound disruption and social, cultural and environmental impacts of colonisation. Colonisation caused significant physical and social dislocation through the loss of access to traditional lands and resources, exacerbated by the introduction of new diseases and colonial violence. The colonial settlements of Vinegar Hill (now Rouse Hill) and Green Hills (roughly Pitt Town to Windsor) were the first permanent European presences in the vicinity of Gables and would become the centre for early interactions between colonists and the local Aboriginal peoples. Their establishment marked the beginning of great environmental, cultural, demographic and economic upheaval for Aboriginal groups living in and around Parramatta.

In this region several early conflicts between Aboriginal people and European colonists were recorded. Colonists' attacks on and conflicts with Aboriginal people are seldom balanced; the British principally recorded events when they were aggrieved. In 1794, settler Joseph Burdett was killed by Aboriginal warriors. Burdett owned a farm in an area around the South Creek–Eastern Creek confluence, an area with known cultural significance to local Darug peoples. Several violent incidents occurred in modern-day McGraths Hill during the late 1790s. In 1799, for instance, an Aboriginal man named Terribandy reportedly killed a settler. On another occasion warriors demanded a kangaroo from a convict who had been hunting in the area. When the convict refused, he was killed.

This period also saw some of the earliest attempts to Europeanise Aboriginal people. In 1814, the Parramatta Native Institute was established. This was the first governmentsponsored attempt to Europeanise Aboriginal people and signalled the beginning of successive waves of intervention into Aboriginal lives. Protectionism, segregation, assimilation and self-determination would characterise later government policies towards Aboriginal people. The establishment of the NSW Aboriginal Protection Board in 1883 would prove to be particularly damaging. However, Aboriginal people continued to live in Sydney and were joined by other Aboriginal people from across NSW to live, work and forge new lives in urban communities.

The first land grants in Gables were released in the early 1800s. Land clearing for agricultural use removed natural resources and made traditional hunting and foodgathering areas inaccessible, placing considerable pressure on Aboriginal people. As colonial land use intensified, Aboriginal people's access to food, water and other resources was drastically limited.



There is very little information about how Aboriginal people lived in the area during the nineteenth or twentieth centuries. No historical documentation of Aboriginal people in association with Gables was identified during the preparation of this report.

#### 2.2 Previously identified Aboriginal heritage

# 2.2.1 Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System register




Figure 2.2 AHIMS search results. The patterning shows the presence of stone artefact sites in proximity to the study area, along with other site types, notably shelters to the east within the sandstone banks of the incised creek systems. (Source: Heritage NSW AHIMS data with GML overlay)

The Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) database, which is managed by Heritage NSW, was searched on 24 February 2023 (reference number 23-0060; see Appendix B). The search covered a zone from 33.6524°S, 150.8464°E to 33.5981°S, 150.9702°E. The results of the search are shown in Table 2.1, Figure 2.1 and Figure 2.2. In total 115 Aboriginal sites and places were identified. Forty-five of these sites have been destroyed by development impacts, and a further two are partially destroyed. These are nonetheless included in the analysis as they provide information about the distribution of site types throughout the landscape.

There are no previously recorded Aboriginal objects or places located within the study area.

Six Aboriginal sites have been registered within the wider Gables area: five stone artefact sites and one grinding groove. Over half of the Aboriginal sites in the AHIMS search results are artefact sites (54% of AHIMS sites).



Artefact sites consist of open artefact scatters, isolated finds and subsurface artefact assemblages found within intact topsoil A-horizons. Flaked-stone tools are the primary artefact type and silcrete is the dominant material, although silicified tuff/chert and quartz are also found. Spatially, they tend to be associated with lower slopes, alluvial terraces and flats bordering waterways, particularly in relatively undisturbed areas. These watercourses provided a reliable source of food and water for Aboriginal people, and previous studies on areas throughout the Cumberland Plain have noted the strong association between artefact sites and permanent watercourses. The study area is within 1km of several creeks, most notably Cataract Creek, 70m to the east. Historical imagery shows that the creek likely flowed through, or adjacent to, the southeast of the study area. Therefore, the study area was in a landform context associated with artefact sites. However, the significant historical disturbances both in and surrounding the study area would have heavily disturbed or removed topsoils, making intact archaeological material unlikely.

Also abundant throughout the region are sandstone shelters (18% of AHIMS sites). Shelters have been recorded in association with Aboriginal art, grinding grooves and artefact deposits. They are found in outcrops of sandstone and shale bedrock, particularly on Hawkesbury sandstone ridgelines. However, there are no suitable outcrops in the study area, so this site type cannot be present. Similarly, grinding grooves will not be found because there are no suitable bedrock outcrops within the study area, although the presence of a grinding groove site to the north does demonstrate the cultural significance of Cataract Creek.

Potential archaeological deposits (PADs) have been recorded across the region (15% of AHIMS sites). We note that a PAD is not necessarily an Aboriginal site, but an area designated as having potential to contain Aboriginal objects. Therefore, the presence and distribution of PADs reflects the potential for an intact A horizon on landforms with proven archaeological sensitivity (such as alluvial terraces, floodplains and lower slopes). Several sites in Gables were initially designated as PADs before excavations confirmed the presence (or otherwise) of an archaeological deposit, which resulted in their reclassification as artefact sites.

#### 2.2.2 Previous heritage investigations of the study area

The study area has been subject to prior Aboriginal archaeological and cultural heritage assessments. These assessments were conducted by Kelleher Nightingale Consulting (KNC) as part of the rezoning proposal and subsequent development of the Box Hill North (now Gables) area. Several Aboriginal archaeological and cultural heritage assessments have also been undertaken for the proposed Gables Public School study area, including a Connecting to Country assessment undertaken by Yarrawalk, and a due diligence report by GML.

Aboriginal archaeological and cultural heritage assessments and their associated field surveys and excavations have identified no Aboriginal sites within the study area, although the intangible values of the study area and surrounds has been noted. This section provides an outline of each assessment and their associated works.



#### Kelleher Nightingale Consulting, 2013—Box Hill North Planning Proposal: Aboriginal Heritage Assessment

In 2013 KNC prepared an Aboriginal Heritage Assessment for APP Corporation to assist in a planning proposal for rezoning Box Hill North (now Gables) for residential development. This assessment was undertaken in accordance with Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH; now Heritage NSW) requirements including the Code of Practice and the Due Diligence Code of Practice.

During its initial assessment of Aboriginal heritage, KNC conducted a review of previous archaeological literature and the distribution of AHIMS sites in the area. At the time no Aboriginal sites had been recorded within Gables. KNC's review led to the conclusion that Aboriginal sites may be present in Gables and would likely consist of open artefact scatters or isolated finds on lower slopes, alluvial terraces and floodplain landforms associated with waterways. KNC expected silcrete to be the dominant artefact raw material, along with silicified tuff, quartz, and chert. The presence of grinding grooves was also noted as a possibility due to sandstone outcrops in the north and south of the development area.

As part of KNC's assessment, an archaeological field survey was undertaken in 2013 encompassing the entirety of Gables, including the study area. The aim of the survey was to identify unrecorded Aboriginal archaeological sites. The wider survey identified one grinding groove, one isolated artefact, and two open artefact scatters. No sites were identified within the study area. During this survey an assessment of archaeological potential was also undertaken. The KNC zoning plan is shown in Figure 2.4. This assessment was based primarily on the landform context and the degree of historical disturbance. Four areas were identified as having high potential because of their association with landforms known to be archaeologically sensitive: specifically lower slopes, terraces and valley flats associated with Cataract Creek. The study area was assessed as having low archaeological potential, largely due to a significant degree of historical disturbance.






Figure 2.5 The 2013 KNC archaeological zoning plan for Gables. The study area is in an area of low Aboriginal archaeological potential. (Source: KNC 2013, Figure 8)

# Kelleher Nightingale Consulting, 2014—Box Hill North Aboriginal Archaeological Assessment: Test Excavation Report

Because the proposed residential development was expected to impact areas of known or potential archaeological significance, KNC recommended that an AHIP would be required. To inform the AHIP proposal, archaeological test archaeological excavations were undertaken in 2014. These excavations aimed to determine the extent, nature and integrity of identified archaeological sites in addition to investigating the three areas noted as having high archaeological potential. The excavation report, prepared for APP Corporation on behalf of E.J. Cooper and Son, identified subsurface archaeological deposits in all areas, four of which showed further potential.

Areas in proximity to Cataract Creek were found to have high densities of archaeological material: primarily silcrete flaked-stone artefacts. The surrounding lower slopes had lower artefact densities, suggesting different, less intensive land use. Areas with significant historical disturbances or flooding were found to have nil or low artefact densities. The results of these excavations indicate that areas of Gables adjacent to Cataract Creek were used extensively by Aboriginal people. If relatively undisturbed, these areas could retain evidence of these activities in the form of archaeological deposits.



## Kelleher Nightingale Consulting, 2015—Box Hill North: Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report

To further support the AHIP application, KNC prepared an ACHAR for APP Corporation on behalf of E.J. Cooper and Son. This document summarised the findings of the project's initial heritage assessment, the test excavations and KNC's recommendations for the future management of heritage within Gables. The full Aboriginal community consultation process (outlined in Section 4) was followed, and community recommendations were incorporated into the report. KNC concluded that the grinding groove site should be conserved due to its significant cultural, social and scientific values. All other archaeological sites were determined to have low to moderate scientific value and it was recommended that salvage archaeological excavations take place in areas with moderate potential to fully investigate their nature.

#### Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit C0001213

In 2015 an AHIP was granted for the Box Hill North precinct (now Gables) residential development (AHIP C0001213). The AHIP allowed for impacts to identified Aboriginal sites within Gables, excluding the grinding groove. Salvage excavations were required for four sites (45-5-4298, 45-5-2999, 45-5-4501, 45-5-4502) as they had shown further archaeological potential during test excavations. Between 2015 and 2017 KNC undertook these excavations, and all sites listed for impact have since been destroyed by development.

AHIP C0001213 remains active over Gables and allows for development associated with the new school. Celestino has recently undertaken development works (likely including topsoil stripping) within the study area, as approved by this AHIP.

#### Yarrawalk, 2023—The Gables (Box Hill) Connecting with Country

In 2023 Architectus engaged Yarrawalk to undertake a Connecting with Country assessment for the development of Gables (Box Hill) new Public School. The findings of this report will be utilised by the architects to inform how they may incorporate the intangible cultural heritage values of the area into the design of the school. As part of this process, a Walk to Country was conducted at the site on 9 February 2023. This walk was attended by representatives of Muru Mittagar. The findings of this walk, provided in a report to DoE, are as follows:

- The nearby waterways of Cattai Creek, Cataract Creek, Dyarubbin (Hawkesbury River) and Mother Creek (South Creek) hold cultural and social significance for Aboriginal people. It was noted that Cataract Creek was used for fishing and swimming in the past. The presence of artefacts and grinding grooves near the creek are direct evidence of Aboriginal life.
- The importance of the landscape and sustainability in the design were expressed. Sandstone should be mined naturally and taken from Country rather than 'destroying one area to bring to another'. The importance of incorporating materials that do not get heated in sunlight (such as timber) was also noted, as was using native flora and fauna (potentially as a community garden to be taken care of by the students).
- It was emphasised that the portrayal of the violence inflicted on Aboriginal peoples by colonists should be considered, in a way that both teaches students and pays respect to the suffering that is still experienced today.

The report outlined how the design of the public school could incorporate aspects of Aboriginal cultural heritage. For example, the importance of enabling the continuing connection between local Aboriginal communities and the study area was highlighted. This could be achieved by inviting the participation of Aboriginal people in ceremonies on school grounds, providing employment opportunities during the construction, management and operation of the school, and holding staff cultural training days.



# GML Heritage, 2023—Gables Public School, Preliminary Indigenous Heritage Assessment Impact Report

In 2023, DoE engaged GML Heritage to undertake a preliminary Indigenous heritage assessment impact (PIHAI) report, otherwise identified as a Due Diligence report, for the development of Gables Public School. A desktop study and site inspection were undertaken to investigate the Aboriginal cultural landscape and the environmental and archaeological contexts.

The study area was found to contain nil to low Aboriginal archaeological sensitivity due to the high levels of historical disturbance to the landforms and soils of the study area. The site inspection, undertaken with a Deerubbin LALC representative, found the entire study area is underlain by imported material, which holds no Aboriginal archaeological potential.

No further archaeological assessment or works were recommended. It was determined that the construction of the school could proceed subject to an unexpected finds protocol.

#### 2.3 Environmental setting of the study area

The study area's 'environment' forms a component of the Darug traditional lands and Country. The study area's 'environment' forms a component of the Darug traditional lands and Country. Understanding the study area's environmental setting through the geology, soils, landforms, water and ecology is important to understand the context of long-term Aboriginal connections to the land. Combining basic environmental information with the study area's history and contemporary connections starts to provide an understanding of the local and regional cultural landscape. Describing and mapping the landscape contextualises the physical data and underpins the intangible connections inherent in most Aboriginal cultural landscapes. An overview of the baseline datasets for geology, soil, landforms, water, the climate and ecology are provided in this section.

#### 2.3.1 Geology and soil landscapes

The study area is within the Cumberland Plain, a biogeographical region characterised by gently rolling hills and low-lying plains which cover much of the southern half of the Sydney Basin. Ashfield shales—a subdivision of the Wianamatta Group defined by black to grey shales and laminite of Middle Triassic Age—underlie the study area.

The study area is within the Blacktown soil landscape (Figure 2.7). This is a residual soil landscape derived from the in situ weathering of Wianamatta Group bedrocks, in this case Ashfield shales. Soils generally consist of red and brown podzolic soils on upper slopes, crests and well-drained areas, with yellow podosols on the lower slopes and in poorly drained profiles. Soil profiles are generally moderately deep, although often not



exceeding 1m in depth. Like the wider Cumberland Plain region, this soil landscape is characterised by a gentle topography; slopes do not exceed 5% and local relief is up to 30m.

As a residual soil landscape, any archaeology present tends to be in situ, subject to bioturbation. Archaeology tends to be restricted to the upper A topsoil horizons as there is usually no mechanism for the deeper penetration of material through the profile. Historical disturbances, such as construction activities or ploughing, can disturb or destroy archaeological deposits. The shallow nature of the profiles in the Blacktown soil landscape makes it particularly susceptible to surface disturbances.

#### 2.3.2 Landforms

The study area is situated among gently undulating low hills with a modal terrain slope of 3–4%. Historical aerial imagery shows that the study area was once situated in lower slope and valley flat landforms associated with Cataract Creek. Current and historical aerial imagery shows that these landforms have been modified or even removed by historical activities. The most notable of these is a large dam built south of the study area in the 1960s, where the landform has been entirely removed.



The recent rezoning and residential development of Gables has also significantly altered the landscape through the construction of new roads, residential estates and subsurface services. These developments would have involved the levelling and excavation, and thus partial (if not total) removal of topsoils and landforms across the area. The study area itself was part of an active construction zone; aerial imagery shows landscaping works under way and a temporary road running through it (see Figure 2.13 in the following section). This has significant implications for the chances of preservation of archaeological material. It is highly likely that most of the natural soils, and any archaeological material they contained, have been significantly disturbed or removed altogether.

#### 2.3.3 Water resources

The availability of water had significant implications for the range of resources available and the suitability of an area for human occupation. An area's proximity to water affected access to food and water resources and defined the types of landforms present. This in turn has significant implications for the type and nature of associated archaeological assemblages. The study area today reflects late Holocene conditions, which were considerably different to the Pleistocene and early to middle Holocene.




Figure 2.8 Hydrology and contours across the study area. (Source: GML 2023)

The study area is in proximity to several small creeks. The closest, Cataract Creek, is a tributary of Cattai Creek and flows in a northeasterly direction approximately 50m east of the study area. Historical imagery shows that Cataract Creek was once much closer to, and potentially within, the study area (see Figure 2.8). Previous Aboriginal archaeological assessments and excavations in Gables have found that Aboriginal sites, such as artefactual assemblages and grinding grooves, are present on landforms associated with this creek, particularly floodplains and terraces. This is indicative of extensive Aboriginal land use in the vicinity of Cataract Creek. Aboriginal elders have emphasised the cultural and social importance of the creek, particularly for fishing and swimming.

#### 2.3.4 Ecology

The exact nature of the pre-1788 ecology of the study area is difficult to reconstruct because historical activities have had a disastrous effect on the region's ecological communities. Historically the Gables area has been used for grazing, cropping and hobby farming and most of the natural forests have been cleared to enable agricultural production and urban development. Aerial imagery shows that the entirety of Gables had been cleared by the 1950s (Figure 2.9). Despite this, patches of natural forests and woodlands have been observed in the area, in various stages of canopy regeneration, providing an indication of its natural ecology. Subsequent residential development across the past decade has largely removed these species.

In the northwestern corner of Gables, remnant Cumberland Plain Woodland was observed. These savannahs consist of open eucalypt canopies with grass and herb groundcover. Some species found within this ecological zone are known to be used by Aboriginal people. For example, the seed pods of the Parramatta Wattle (Wadanguli; *Acacia parramattensis*) were steamed and eaten during its flowering period from November to April.



To the north of the study area, remnant Shale Sandstone Transition Forest is found surrounding Cataract Creek. Given the landform and hydrological context (Sections 2.3.2 and 2.3.3), this vegetation community provides the most likely candidate for the original ecological community within the study area. These forests consist of a wide variety of eucalypt species, with an understorey consisting of various smaller tree, shrub, herb and grass species. One key species found is Basket Grass (Bamuru; *Lomandra longifolia*), which was used in a variety of ways. The leaves were used to weave eel nets, the bases of the plant were chewed for energy, and roots were used as a medicine for insect bites.

Aboriginal Elders have noted that the nearby Cataract Creek was used for fishing well into the twentieth century. Shortfin Eel (Burra; *Anguilla australis*) and Longfin Eel (Burra; *Anguilla reinhardtii*) would migrate from the Pacific upstream into the freshwater rivers of eastern Australia to mature. They served as a staple food source for Aboriginal people throughout Sydney. The Pacific Black Duck (Yurungay; *Anas superciliosa*) lived on the freshwater tributaries of the Dyarubbin and were also a staple food source.

#### 2.4 History of recent land use

Prior to invasion, the study area would have been covered by woodlands and/or forests. Following European arrival at Sydney Cove in 1788, colonists launched expeditions throughout what is now Sydney in search of land for crops and stock. In 1791, an expedition to determine whether the Hawkesbury and Nepean Rivers were connected was the first to traverse the area around Gables. However, it was not until a decade later that the nearby suburb of Rouse Hill (then known as Vinegar Hill) was established. The first land grants in Gables and Box Hill were made in the following decades. Early colonisers cleared the native vegetation for grazing land and other agricultural uses. This remained the primary land use of Gables until the twenty-first century.

Gables was a large dairy farm for several decades. Split into two sections, called Red and Blue Gables, this farm gives the suburb its name. Initial land clearance and stock grazing would have resulted in minor disturbances to topsoils by leaving the soils more vulnerable to erosion. A 1955 aerial image (Figure 2.9) shows Gables entirely cleared of native woodlands for pasture. Several unsealed roads had been constructed, but otherwise the area was relatively undisturbed from an archaeological perspective. The study area is directly northwest from Cataract Creek, which may have meandered into the eastern corner of the study area.




Figure 2.10 1961 aerial photograph of the study area. Note the construction of a dam in its southern reaches. (Source: NSW Spatial Collaboration Portal 2022 with GML overlay)

The second half of the twentieth century saw more intensive land modifications to support stock grazing and other agricultural uses. By the 1960s several dams and levee banks had been constructed, which significantly altered the landscape by removing entire landforms and their soils within the dam's footprint (Figure 2.10).

Of relevance to the study area is a particularly large dam and levee bank constructed to the south of the study area. This has caused significant disturbance to topsoils, and thus any archaeological material, in the study area. The flow of Cataract Creek was modified to accommodate the dam's construction. The Creek continued to flow north from an outlet in the dam, although this outlet changed from the northeast to northwest of the dam. By 1986 the creek was more closely following its original alignment, notably running through the study area until at least 1994. By 2005 its new path appears to have been infilled, indicating that at least some of the study area is/was underlain by fills or fluvial sediments (Figure 2.12).

The late twentieth century also saw the subdivision of the properties into smaller land parcels. A greater variety of agricultural land uses was therefore evident in Gables during this time. By 1986 the surrounds of the study area were used primarily for cropping, the study area itself being the site of a small house, shed and yard (Figure 2.11). Ploughing and other activities associated with cropping would have churned soils throughout the area, and the construction of buildings would have likely partially truncated topsoils.

To accommodate the increasing population and intensity of land use within the area, several new roads (including Red Gables Road), houses and associated services were also constructed. These activities would have removed or truncated topsoils and disturbed any archaeology within them.

In the early 2010s E.J. Cooper and Son, working with the Department of Planning and Environment and The Hills Shire Council, proposed the rezoning of Gables to allow for residential development. This proposal was part of a wider plan for development in Sydney's northwest as part of the North West Growth Centre. The rezoning proposal was accepted, and development began during the latter half of the decade.

These works have drastically altered the landscape. The construction of roads and houses, dam dewatering and infilling, the installation of sewage lines and other subsurface services, and associated site works all would have involved the levelling and excavation of landforms and the complete removal of topsoils throughout much of Gables. The study area itself has been subject to these works; aerial imagery shows that it underwent levelling and landscaping works and had a road running through it (Figure 2.13). These works likely removed all remnant topsoils within the study area, and any archaeology they may have retained.

### 2.5 Archaeological predictive models

Aboriginal heritage predictive modelling provides an understanding of how Aboriginal sites, places and objects were distributed within a wider landscape.<sup>4</sup> Through a process of landscape characterisation, Aboriginal people and archaeologists can infer those locations most frequently visited and used in the past. Such assessment may be used to interpret long-term subsistence and habitation patterns. Based upon the landscape context, land use history, regional and local archaeological patterns, it is possible to provide a predictive statement for the likely occurrence of Aboriginal archaeological sites/places connected with the study area (Table 2.2).

The study area is situated among the gently undulating low hills of the Cumberland Plain. Prior to European arrival, the landscape would have been dominated by woodlands and forests, possibly like the remnant Shale Sandstone Transition Forest that now borders Cataract Creek. These ecosystems would have provided local Aboriginal people with abundant food, water and timber resources. It is unknown to what extent Aboriginal



people used the study area for resource collection purposes. No Aboriginal objects or sites have been identified within the study area, and there are no historical records of traditional Aboriginal land use in connection with the study area pre- or post-1788. However, the study area may have been in a landform context that has been associated with consistent Aboriginal occupation and land use within Gables.

The AHIMS search results show a strong spatial relationship between archaeological evidence of Aboriginal occupation and permanent waterbodies. Archaeological field surveys and excavations undertaken by KNC identified extensive assemblages of lithics on the alluvial landforms that border Cataract Creek. A grinding groove was also identified adjacent to the creek line. This suggests that Aboriginal activities within Gables were spatially focused on Cataract Creek, which would have provided consistent freshwater resources for exploitation. These activities have resulted in the deposition of archaeological material, primarily artefactual deposits. It is possible that the study area was also associated with similar activities due to its position near Cataract Creek.

However, this landscape has been heavily modified by historical activities including successive phases of land clearing, cropping, construction and other development. Recently the study area has been subject to topsoil stripping. These disturbances significantly reduce the potential for archaeological material, which has also been noted by previous archaeological assessments of the study area. The landform and surface no longer reflect the natural soil formation processes. It is highly likely that previous disturbances have impacted or removed the shallow Blacktown soils. As a result, these works have almost certainly removed any archaeological material that could have been present.

In summary, predictive modelling indicates that the study area holds nil to very low potential for in situ Aboriginal archaeological material. If present, any archaeological material present would almost certainly have been relocated from its original context.

# 3 Investigations of Aboriginal heritage



### 3 Investigations of Aboriginal heritage

This section presents the results of our investigations into the Aboriginal heritage of the study area, informed by the nature of the local environment, the extent of prior heritage works, and known Aboriginal connections to the study area. The outcomes combine to describe the overarching cultural landscape and provide the basis for the Aboriginal heritage values assessment.

### 3.1 Geotechnical Investigations

### Douglas Partners, 2022—Gables Public School, Report on Geotechnical Investigation

In 2022, Douglas Partners undertook geotechnical boreholing and contamination trenching across the study area. These investigations produced the following stratigraphic profile:

- Fill—found in all boreholes to depths of between 2.6m and 7.2m. Fills were generally deeper in the northern half of the site and generally consisted of sandy and/or silty clays, with crushed sandstone layers noted. These fills were likely deposited on site as levelling fills by Celestino.
- Residual clays—silty clay to clay with some gravelly clay layers (largely ironstone and sandstone gravels), generally encountered at depths of 5–8.5m. They were interpreted as buried Blacktown soils. The report does not specify whether these soils are A or B horizons but on a cursory examination, most of the boreholes appear to describe B horizon subsoils. Gravelly clay layers are likely C horizons. It should also be noted that environmental investigations undertaken by Geotechnique and JBS&G prior to Celestino's activities noted that 'natural' soils appear to be heavily reworked.
- Shale and sandstone bedrock.

### 3.2 Study area inspection

On 5 September 2023, DoE held a site walk at the study area and all project RAPs were invited to attend. Representatives from seven RAP groups attended. Also in attendance was Jacob Kiefel, Heritage Consultant, from GML, and a representative from DoE.



The purpose of the site walk was to provide the project RAPs with information about the proposed school design, and to outline the currently proposed methods for incorporating Aboriginal cultural heritage values into the design. The walk also aimed to record any evidence of former land use and development activities that have led to the designation of no to very low Aboriginal archaeological potential. It aimed to provide a platform for the project RAPs to express their opinions, comments and recommendations for the new Gables Public School and the incorporation of Aboriginal archaeological and cultural heritage values into the design.

The outcomes of the site walk are as follows:

- The inspection observed significant and comprehensive disturbances across the entire study area. No Aboriginal objects or areas with archaeological potential were identified. This supports the results of the 2013 KNC field survey and the 2023 GML site inspection.
- No specific local Aboriginal places or sites in connection with the study area or concerns about impacts to these values were raised. However, project RAPs emphasised the social and cultural significance of the wider region. It was noted that the study area's proximity to Cataract Creek could have meant the area may have been used for traditional activities in a similar way as represented by archaeological sites recorded nearby.
- Project RAPs highlighted the opportunity that the design presents to incorporate Aboriginal cultural heritage values. Specific suggestions included:
  - There are employment opportunities for local Aboriginal organisations during the construction and management of the school. This would enable the continuing connection between the Aboriginal community and the study area by enabling them to provide meaningful contributions. Specific mention was made of the planned gardens. Members of the local Aboriginal community could aid in developing suitable planting and management strategies for the gardens and landscape features that are planned.
  - The importance of truth-telling and accurately representing the traditional connections and values to this specific place was emphasised. This would help to avoid 'generic' attempts to incorporate values into the design.
  - A recommendation was made that a further session of consultation is taken with local Aboriginal individuals. This could be undertaken at a later stage in the Masterplan to enable feedback on the proposed concept designs.

These themes are more comprehensively explored in Yarrawalk's Connecting with Country report for Gables Public School.



### 3.3 Designation of Aboriginal archaeological zoning

Aboriginal archaeological sensitivity refers to the possibility that intact or remnant soil horizons could contain Aboriginal objects. The following assessment is based on the regional Aboriginal archaeological record (AHIMS), past land disturbance and development (as assessed in Section 3.2), past Aboriginal archaeological and cultural heritage assessments (as outlined in Section 2.2.2), and the study area inspection.

The entire study area has been zoned as having very low or nil archaeological potential because the landforms in the study area have been substantially disturbed or modified and would not be expected to hold Aboriginal objects, unless within a displaced context.

### **4** Aboriginal community consultation

### 4.1 Introduction

Aboriginal community consultation is required to make a valid assessment of Aboriginal heritage 'values', especially with regard to the memories, stories and associations that Aboriginal people hold toward their traditional lands or Country. Aboriginal people frequently express an enduring connection to their Country, a connection that transcends generations, both past and present. The connection is frequently expressed as a sense of belonging, which may manifest through physical objects or place; alternatively, it may be presented as an intangible idea, where an appreciation of an unseen quality or non-materialistic value connects a place in the landscape, tradition, observance, custom, lore belief or history to the person or group describing the item, event or value. The notion of intangible, social or community values is essential to Aboriginal people as 'the effective protection and conservation of this heritage is important in maintaining the identity, health and wellbeing of Aboriginal people'.<sup>1</sup>

To gather community views and opinions with respect to Aboriginal heritage, and to address Aboriginal heritage values, Heritage NSW requires proponents to adhere to the guideline document *Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Consultation Requirements for Proponents 2010.*<sup>2</sup> This guideline provides a mechanism for engaging the local Aboriginal community, and its directives must be followed for any study that might eventually be used to support an application for an AHIP under Part 6 of the NPW Act.

GML recognises and acknowledges the continuing Indigenous ownership of the traditional knowledge, traditional cultural expressions, practices, innovations and intellectual property rights in the materials provided by Aboriginal and Indigenous people, on which research and assessments in our reports may be based. We endeavour to protect the privacy, integrity and wellbeing of participants in this research.

### 4.2 The process of consultation

The Heritage NSW-prescribed consultation guidelines set out a process for identifying, registering, engaging and consulting Aboriginal peoples who may hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the significance of an Aboriginal object or place.

Adhering with the guidelines involves following several stages, which include:

- 1 Informing Aboriginal people about the nature and scope of the proposal.
- 2 Understanding what might be present in the landscape and its cultural significance.
- 3 Determining the potential impacts and the proposed strategies to deal with them.



4 Providing Aboriginal people with the opportunity to review the report.<sup>3</sup>

Aboriginal groups are invited to register interest as a party to consultation by responding to local press advertisement(s) placed by the proponent, or via direct contact. Responses are sought from the Registered Aboriginal Parties (RAPs) on the proposed assessment methodology, and they are provided an opportunity to comment on the assessment reports and recommendations. The guidelines specify timeframes for each stage of the consultation process. These stages are described below in Section 4.2.1 to Section 4.2.3.

The Aboriginal community consultation for this project has been carried out in accordance with the above guideline. This section provides specific details of Aboriginal community consultation with regard to the heritage assessment of the study area.

Appendix A provides a log of all communications between GML and RAPs, and all letters, responses and details pertaining to this consultation.

### 4.2.1 Stage 1: Notification of project

The aim of Stage 1 is to 'identify, notify and register Aboriginal people who hold cultural knowledge relevant to determining the cultural significance of Aboriginal objects and/or places in the area of the proposed project'.<sup>4</sup> The identification process involves:

- sending letters to select government agencies to determine relevant Aboriginal stakeholder groups to contact; and
- placing notices in the local press, inviting Aboriginal people who hold relevant cultural knowledge to register in the process of community consultation.

A letter notifying all Aboriginal people and the local Aboriginal land council (in this case, the Deerubbin LALC) about the proposed project must be sent to each individual and group identified through the above stages. Aboriginal people have a minimum of 14 days after the letter is sent or the notice published in the press to register an interest in the project.

The outcome of Stage 1 is a list of Aboriginal people who have registered to be involved in consultation. These are the project's RAPs. The RAPs are to be involved for the remainder of the project; consultation with Aboriginal groups or persons outside of RAPs is not required.

Letters requesting contact details for Aboriginal people or organisations who may hold cultural knowledge and may identify heritage issues relevant to the study area were sent via email on 30 May 2023 to:

- Heritage NSW;
- Deerubbin LALC;
- Office of The Registrar, Aboriginal Lands Right Act 1983;
- National Native Title Tribunal;



- Native Title Service Corporation;
- The Hills Shire Council; and
- the Greater Sydney Catchment Management Authority (Greater Sydney Local Land Services).

Responses were received from the following groups:

- Heritage NSW;
- Office of The Registrar;
- National Native Title Tribunal; and
- The Hills Shire Council.

Subsequently, those Aboriginal people who were identified during the Step 1 notifications were contacted via letter on 21 June 2023, providing information regarding the project and inviting them to register an interest (Step 1 notifications). A notification was also placed in *The Daily Telegraph* on 22 June 2023, inviting registrations of interest by Aboriginal people with cultural knowledge relevant to the study area.

### The project's Registered Aboriginal Parties

In line with the outcomes of Stage 1, and the Heritage NSW consultation guidelines,<sup>5</sup> the project's RAPs are:

- Yulay Cultural Services;
- Anonymous RAP #1; and
- Anonymous RAP #2

A copy of the notification and the details of the RAPs were provided to Heritage NSW and the Deerubbin LALC on 10 July 2023.

### 4.2.2 Stage 2 and 3: Presentation and gathering of Information

A letter has been sent to all RAPs informing them of the project outline, anticipated impacts, timeline and milestones. It included a methodology for undertaking the project's assessment and a request for any information on culturally sensitive areas of local traditional knowledge relating to the study area. Stage 2 allowed 28 days for the RAPs to respond.



Each RAP group was provided with written details of the proposed project by email on 13 July 2023. All comments received agreed to the proposed methodology. No comments relating to cultural information were received.

Further details of the Aboriginal consultation undertaken for the study area are provided in Appendix A.

### 4.2.3 Stage 4: Review of draft report

The report was issued to project RAPs on 18 October 2023 for the 28-day review period which closed on 15 November 2023. All comments received agreed with the recommendations for the management of Aboriginal cultural heritage outlined in Sections 6.3 and 6.4. Table 4.1 presents a summary of heritage aspects and values identified by the local Aboriginal community during the ACHAR review period.

Future consultation with the RAPs should include the following steps.

- Copies of the final report should be sent to all registered Aboriginal groups.
- Any future work relating to the Aboriginal archaeological mitigation, or any significant changes to the development, should include consultation with the relevant Aboriginal stakeholders.

# 5 Aboriginal heritage significance assessment



### 5 Aboriginal heritage significance assessment

The best-practice guide to managing heritage places in Australia is the Burra Charter. It defines cultural significance as:

Cultural significance means aesthetic, historic, scientific, social or spiritual value for past, present or future generations. Cultural significance is embodied in the place itself, its fabric, setting, use, associations, meanings, records, related places and related objects. Places may have a range of values for different individuals or groups.<sup>1</sup>

An assessment of aesthetic and social/spiritual values of Aboriginal cultural significance can only be made by the relevant Aboriginal community because Aboriginal people are the primary source of information about their cultural heritage values. To ensure the appropriate management of impacts to Aboriginal cultural heritage values, the relevant local Aboriginal people must be involved. Consulting with Aboriginal people at an early stage of the assessment process ensures they have opportunities to fulfil their heritage obligations. Aboriginal people must have control of their cultural knowledge and how it is used and shared. Restriction of cultural knowledge may be an important part of the value of the cultural knowledge.<sup>2</sup>

In line with the Burra Charter's four principal values (social, historic, scientific and aesthetic) and the guideline *Assessing Heritage Significance*,<sup>3</sup> four assessment criteria can be used to assess the Aboriginal heritage values of a study area.<sup>4</sup> The four criteria are:

- social value: `an item has strong or special association with a particular community or cultural group in NSW (or the local area) for social, cultural or spiritual reasons';<sup>5</sup>
- historic value: `an item is important in the course, or patterning, of NSW's cultural or natural history (or cultural or natural history of the local area)';<sup>6</sup>
- aesthetic value: `an item is important in demonstrating aesthetic characteristics and/or a high degree of creative or technical achievement in NSW (or the local area)';<sup>7</sup> and
- scientific value: `an item has potential to yield information that will contribute to an understanding of NSW's cultural or natural history (or the cultural or natural history of the local area)'.<sup>8</sup>

Consulting with the RAPs, investigating the history of the local region, assessing the study area and reviewing relevant prior archaeological works have all helped to develop an understanding of the key social, historical and scientific values associated with the study area. Following the *Guide to Investigating, Assessing and Reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in NSW*,<sup>9</sup> values are graded according to a basic ranking of high,



moderate or low. This ranking is based upon the research potential, representativeness, rarity and educational potential of each value. The grading is stated at the end of each value assessment below.

### 5.1 Significance assessment

### 5.1.1 Social value

During consultation, RAPs agreed that the wider Gables area is part of a culturally and socially significant area. The study area can be considered a component of the wider Cumberland Plain Aboriginal cultural landscape and holds values as part of that landscape. At the local scale, the study area is associated with nearby stone artefact sites and the grinding groove site near Cataract Creek. The local Aboriginal community has expressed that these items hold social value.

### 5.1.2 Historic value

The wider region holds historical connections for the local Aboriginal community through the history of land dispossession. However, the study area is not identified with any location-specific event, person or place from the post-1788 context.

The study area does not meet this criterion.

### 5.1.3 Scientific value

The landforms in the study area have been substantially disturbed or modified and would not be expected to hold Aboriginal objects, unless within a displaced context. As such, the study area holds no research potential, and any material would almost certainly be from a secondary context. This means that even if archaeological material is present, it cannot be definitively associated with the Aboriginal cultural landscape of Gables.

The study area does not meet this criterion.

### 5.1.4 Aesthetic value

Gables is a highly modified suburban landscape that contrasts dramatically against the Country managed and occupied by Aboriginal people prior to 1788.

The study area does not meet this criterion.



### 5.2 Statement of Significance

The study area can be considered a component of the wider Cumberland Plain Aboriginal cultural landscape. It holds values as part of that landscape, but does not contain known or identified Aboriginal objects, or specific historical connections. Gables is now visually divorced from its pre-1788 context due to comprehensive landscape modification, particularly during its development as a suburb. This modification has also drastically reduced the chance that archaeological material could be present.

An overview of how these cultural values are manifest within the study area is presented in Table 5.1.

# 6 The proposed project activity



### 6 The proposed project activity

This section provides a description of the proposed project activity, its timing and objectives, and the Aboriginal heritage values that it may (directly or indirectly) harm. Aboriginal heritage management policy has been developed to guide and minimise impacts to Aboriginal heritage values.

### 6.1 Proposed activity

DoE proposes to construct a public school consisting of:

- Up to 40 teaching spaces;
- up to 3 support learning home bases;
- 1 hall;
- core facilities, including an administration building and library;
- outdoor play space;
- provision for future expansion of learning hubs; and
- a pre-school.

The exact nature of these works is yet to be defined but would involve the construction of these buildings, the installation of services and associated landscaping works. These works would likely extend across the entire study area and involve significant ground disturbance that would impact and alter the landscape of the study area.

### 6.2 Harm to Aboriginal objects and values

The study area has been subject to comprehensive ground disturbance. Because the landforms in the study area have been substantially disturbed or modified, they would not be expected to hold Aboriginal objects, unless within a displaced context. Any archaeological materials that may have been present have already been harmed through their displacement or removal from their original depositional context.

The proposed activity is unlikely to harm the Aboriginal values associated with the study area. The intangible social and cultural values of the study area and surrounds provide key opportunities for heritage interpretation and facilitation of the meaningful involvement of the local Aboriginal community throughout the design, construction and management of the school. These opportunities have been assessed as part of Yarrawalk's Connection to Country report and their recommendations will be incorporated into the final design of the school.



### 6.3 Aboriginal heritage management policy

The following proposed management and mitigation strategies are based on consideration of:

- legal requirements under the terms of the NPW Act, as amended—which states that it is illegal to harm or desecrate an Aboriginal object without first obtaining an AHIP from the Director-General, Heritage NSW;
- the Code of Practice for archaeological works connected with heritage mitigation;
- the requirements for considering Ecologically Sustainable Development (ESD) principles, i.e. applying the concept of intergenerational equity to the study area;
- the cautious approach to place management outlined in the Burra Charter;
- the assessment of the Aboriginal cultural heritage values;
- consideration of cumulative impacts to Aboriginal heritage and the consequences of continued loss of Aboriginal heritage values;
- the interests of the local Aboriginal community members who participated in this project; and
- the size of the study area, the extent of Aboriginal heritage values and likely impacts posed by the project proposal.

Because the study area has been comprehensively impacted by historical activities and would not be expected to retain in situ archaeological material, no further archaeological investigations are proposed.

### 6.3.1 Proceed with caution

The Aboriginal archaeological assessment has determined that there is very low to nil potential for Aboriginal objects or sites within the study area. The proposed development can proceed with caution.

If, during the process of works, an Aboriginal site or object is suspected or identified, the following unexpected finds protocol for Aboriginal cultural heritage should be enacted:

- Stop work order—all works should cease immediately in the area surrounding the suspected objects. Any identified Aboriginal object(s) should be left in situ and not disturbed in accordance with the requirements of Section 89A of the NPW Act. Heritage NSW and GML Heritage should be notified immediately and an archaeologist experienced in the identification of Aboriginal cultural material should inspect the objects.
  - If the suspected objects are not Aboriginal in origin or manufacture (as defined under the NPW Act), they should be recorded, and the location noted. Works may continue.



- If the objects are confirmed to be of Aboriginal origin, the site should be registered on the AHIMS database administered by Heritage NSW.
- If they are Aboriginal objects, the current AHIP for the wider Box Hill North (now Gables) precinct should be referred to for the purpose of Aboriginal cultural heritage management. Provided this AHIP remains valid, and Aboriginal heritage management actions fall under the conditions of the AHIP, no further statutory approval would be required.
- Should a new AHIP under Section 90 of the NPW Act be required, the extent of any works exclusion zone would need to be determined through discussion with Heritage NSW and Aboriginal community representatives.
- In the unlikely event that human remains were to be discovered at any time during the works, they must cease immediately in the surrounding area. The findings would need to be reported immediately to the New South Wales Coroner's Office and/or the New South Wales Police.

### 6.4 Heritage interpretation

The project provides an opportunity for public dissemination of local Aboriginal cultural and heritage values. Although the study area itself may not hold Aboriginal archaeological deposits or sites, Gables did (and still does, at the grinding groove site) hold significant values. The new school represents an opportunity to disseminate the values and sites associated with the cultural landscape of Gables.

Specific ideas and strategies for this have been suggested by Aboriginal community representatives during the preparation of this report (Sections 3.2 and 4.2.3) and in the Connecting with Country report undertaken by Yarrawalk. The outcomes of these assessments could be incorporated to formulate a location-specific interpretation plan and strategy.










Figure 1 The general location of the study area. (Source: SixMaps with GML overlay)

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


Figure 1 The general location of the study area. (Source: SixMaps with GML overlay)



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
