



Council Notification - Scope of Works

We wish to advise that Bega Valley Shire Council is receiving a referral via the NSW Planning Portal. Please provide any of Council's comments via the NSW Planning Portal.

Proposal: Demolition of existing structures, consolidation of 2 lots into 1, removal of trees, construction of 10 independent living seniors housing units comprising 6 x 1 bedroom and 4 x 2 bedroom units, at grade parking for 5 vehicles and associated stormwater and landscaping works.
