### Decision

### Reasons for decision

The following matters were taken into consideration in making this decision:

- the relevant matters listed in section 4.15 of the Act and the additional matters listed in the statutory context section of the Department's Assessment Report;
- the prescribed matters under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2000*;
- the objects of the Act;
- all information submitted to the Department during the assessment of the development application and any additional information considered in the Department's Assessment Report;
- the findings and recommendations in the Department's Assessment Report; and
- the views of the community about the project (see Attachment 1).

The findings and recommendations set out in the Department's Assessment Report were accepted and adopted as the reasons for making this decision.

The key reasons for granting consent to the development application are as follows:

- the project is permissible with development consent under the *State Environmental Planning Policy (Precincts - Regional) 2021* and is consistent with NSW Government policies including the *South East and Tableland Region Plan 2036* aim to increase visitation to NSW ski resorts;
- the impacts on the community and the environment can be appropriately minimised or managed to an acceptable level, in accordance with applicable NSW Government policies and standards. The consent authority has imposed conditions relating to construction standards, environmental considerations, post construction certification and rehabilitation;
- no issues were raised by the community during exhibition of the proposal; and
- weighing all relevant considerations, the project is in the public interest.

## Attachment 1 – Consideration of Community Views

The Department's Community Participation Plan, November 2019, prepared in accordance with Schedule 1 of the Act requires applications to be exhibited for a period of fourteen (14) days where development applications under the Precincts - Regional SEPP are not wholly internal to a building or where the site is not located more than fifty (50) metres away from a tourist accommodation building. The Department exhibited the application between 27 October to 9 November 2021 as the works include external alterations to an existing tourist accommodation building within fifty (50) metres of other tourist accommodation buildings.

The Rural Fire Service provided comments pursuant to section 4.46 of the Act as integrated development requiring approval under section 100B of the *Rural Fires Act 1997* for works to tourist accommodation on bush fire prone land. The Rural Fire Service issued a bush fire safety authority on 7 December 2021 approving the works subject to conditions.

Comments were also received from the National Parks and Wildlife Service.

The matters raised by the Rural Fire Service and the National Parks and Wildlife Service are addressed in detail in the Department's Assessment Report.

No public submissions were received during the exhibition period. Accordingly, there were no community views advised to the Department that needed to be taken into consideration in making this decision.
