NOTICE OF EXHIBITION OF DEVELOPMENT APPLICATION DA 22/5186 DIGITAL ADVARTISING SIGNAGE PRINCES HIGHWAY. LOFTUS

Thank you for referring the abovementioned modified application dated 26 May 2021 to Transport for NSW (TfNSW) for concurrence under Clause 2 of Section 3.16 of State Environmental Planning Policy (Industry and Employment) 2021.

TfNSW has reviewed the submitted documentation and provides concurrence to the proposed digital signage, subject to the approval of the Department of Planning and Environment and the following requirements being included in the development consent:

- 1. All sign structures, together with any improvements integral to the future use of the site are to be wholly within the freehold property (unlimited in height or depth), along Princes Highway.
- 2. The proposed signs shall be in accordance with the Transport Corridor Outdoor Advertising and Signage Guidelines 2017 and relevant Australian Standards.
- 3. The images displayed on the sign must not contain/use:
 - Flashing or flickering lights or content;
 - Animated displays, moving parts or simulated movement;
 - Complex displays that hold a driver's attention beyond "glance appreciation";
 - Displays resembling traffic control devices by use of colour, shape or words that can be construed as giving
 instruction to traffic for example, red, amber or green circles, octagons, crosses, triangles and words such as
 'stop' or 'halt';
 - o A method of illumination that distracts or dazzles; and
 - o Dominant use of colours red or green.
- 4. Dwell times between displays shall be no shorter than 10 seconds.
- 5. The digital sign for its operation must comply with the requirements in Transport Corridor Outdoor Advertising and Signage Guidelines 2017 (refer to Section 2.5.8, Table 3 and Section 3.3) and relevant Australian Standards, as amended from time to time.
- A Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) should be obtained from Transport Management Centre for any works that may impact on traffic flows on Princes Highway during construction activities.
