

# Notice of decision

## Section 2.22 and Clause 20 of Schedule 1 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979*

### Decision

### Reasons for decision

The following matters were taken into consideration in making this decision:

- the relevant matters listed in section 4.15 of the Act and the additional matters listed in the statutory context section of the Department's Assessment Report;
- the prescribed matters under the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Regulation 2021*;
- the objects of the Act;
- all information submitted to the Department during the assessment of the development application and any additional information considered in the Department's Assessment Report;
- the findings and recommendations in the Department's Assessment Report; and
- the views of the community about the project (see Attachment 1).

The findings and recommendations set out in the Department's Assessment Report were accepted and adopted as the reasons for making this decision.

The key reasons for granting consent to the development application are as follows:

- the project is permissible with development consent under the *State Environmental Planning Policy (Precincts - Regional) 2021* and is consistent with NSW Government policies including the *South East and Tableland Region Plan 2036* and the *Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct Master Plan* which aim to facilitate appropriate development and increase visitation to NSW ski resorts;
- the impacts on the community and the environment can be appropriately minimised or managed to an acceptable level, in accordance with applicable NSW Government policies and standards. The consent authority has imposed conditions relating to construction standards, environmental considerations, post construction certification and rehabilitation;
- no issues were raised by the community during exhibition of the proposal;
- the issues raised by agencies have been considered and adequately addressed by the Applicant and in the Department's Assessment Report; and
- weighing all relevant considerations, the project is in the public interest.

## **Attachment 1 – Consideration of Community Views**

The Department's Community Participation Plan, November 2019, prepared in accordance with Schedule 1 of the Act requires applications for nominated integrated development to be exhibited for a period of 28 days. The Department exhibited the application between 11 May 2022 and 7 June 2022 and notified all lodges within Thredbo Village of the works.

Pursuant to s. 4.46 of the EP&A Act (integrated development) the application was referred to the Department of Environment – Water (DPE -Water) as consideration is required for development on waterfront land (within 40 metres of a water course) in accordance with the *Water Management Act 2000*.

Pursuant to s. 4.15 of the Precincts - Regional SEPP the application was referred to the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) for land within an alpine resort within KNP.

Comments received from DPE – Water (General Terms of Approval for the development) and the NPWS have been considered and addressed in detail in the Department's Assessment Report.

There were no community views that needed to be taken into consideration in making this decision as no issues were raised by the community and no public submissions were received during the exhibition period.
