- Provide evidence of consultation and agreement with the owner(s) and/or beneficiaries of the adjoining lot containing airspace and vegetation in the foreground of the proposed sign and any vegetation management agreement.
- Address the assessment considerations relating to streetscape, setting and landscape In Schedule 5, Part 4 of the SEPP (Industry and Employment)
- Provide evidence of consultation with the artist and commissioning body of the existing public artwork along the railway fence and consider relevant impacts.
- Clarify inconsistencies between the Arborist letter, prepared by Naturally Trees and the Response to RFI, in relation to the Bismarck Palm, in terms of it obstructing views towards the proposed sign and ongoing maintenance noting it has a mature height of over 15 metres.
