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EXECUTIVE AND PLAIN ENGLISH SUMMARY

Artefact Heritage has been engaged by Mirvac Homes to develop an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) required for the shared pathway along the foreshore at the Mirvac Riverlands housing development in Milperra. The construction will consist of a foreshore cycleway and pedestrian access path along the foreshore of the Georges River, including a cyclist and pedestrian bridge over the mangroves and the Northern creek, and ancillary works.

The project is being managed as a Designated Development under the Environmental Planning & Assessment Act 1979. The Department of Planning & Environment requires that Planning Secretaries Environmental Assessment Requirements (SEARs) are undertaken for the development. The SEARs relating to Aboriginal Heritage require that this Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report (ACHAR) be prepared in accordance with relevant guidelines, identifying, describing, and assessing any impacts for any Aboriginal cultural heritage values on site.

Location and Country

The study area is located within the Bankstown-Canterbury Local Government Area (LGA) and within the boundaries of the Gandangara LALC and is situated along the low lying and flood prone eastern shores of the Georges River in Milperra. The study area contains land that had previously been used for sand mining, farming, timber getting, and which has been historically cleared of trees. The study area connects to the former Riverlands Golf Course to the east The language groups occupying the current study area are thought to have been the Bidjigal clan of the Darug people, the Dharawal, and the Gandangara (Attenbrow 2010).

Consultation

Aboriginal community consultation has been conducted in accordance with the Consultation Requirements (DECCW 2010b) and the *National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019*. A consultation log has been maintained which details all correspondence with the registered Aboriginal parties. A total of 15 individuals / organisations have registered interest in this project.

Known Aboriginal sites

A search of the Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) was carried out for the study area and the wider surrounds. This search noted a total 25 Aboriginal sites registered for the search area, and no sites within the study area. The sites in the search area included a total of 16 Modified Trees and three areas of Potential Archaeological Deposit (PAD). Further investigation revealed that 15 of these Modified Trees had been assessed as not the result of Aboriginal cultural modification and were listed on AHIMS as 'Not a Site'. One of the three areas of PAD had also been reassessed and listed on AHIMS as 'Not a Site'. As a result, there were no registered AHIMS sites within 400 metres of the study area.

Previous reporting

The study area and surrounds has been the subject of several previous archaeological surveys and one archaeological test excavation. These found that while there was archaeological potential associated with the raised terrace of the Golf Course, the study area was low lying and flood-prone, and therefore of low archaeological potential. Artefact Heritage (2022) carried out test excavations on this raised terrace of the Golf Course to the east of the study area and located only two artefacts out of 7.75 square metres excavated. The soils in which these artefacts were found were likely transported by water. As a result, the archaeological potential of the test location was rated as low, and the location of the current study area is likely to be of even lower archaeological potential.

Site survey

Site survey was undertaken on the 9 June 2023 by Michael Lever (Heritage Consultant, Artefact Heritage) with the following representatives from Gandangara LALC and Mirvac Homes; Bronwyn Partell (Gandangara LALC), Stacey Gilbert (Gandangara LALC), Tessa Kore (Mirvac Homes), Larissa Tomlin (Mirvac Homes), and Damien Chand (Menai Civil Contrators).

The study area is divided by a creek, several areas of swamp and is densely vegetated with thick layered grasses and rushes at head-height, regrowth of casuarinas and several areas of mangrove resulting in nil ground surface visibility overall.

No Aboriginal objects or locations of PAD were identified as a result of the site survey which found that although the study area is located within 200m of water, it is in a flood prone location that is unlikely to have been of a preferred location for use by Aboriginal people in the past.

Overview of results

The following results and recommendations are based on consideration of:

- The requirements of Aboriginal heritage guidelines including:
 - The Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales (DECCW 2010a) – known as The Code of Practice
 - Guide to investigating and assessing and reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in New South Wales (OEH 2011) – known as ACHAR guidelines.
 - The Aboriginal Cultural Heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010 (OEH 2010b)- known as Consultation Guidelines)
- The results of Aboriginal stakeholder consultation
- The results of in-depth background research and archaeological survey

It was found that:

- Previous archaeological assessments of the study area found that there was no archaeological potential due to its position on a flood-prone plain (AHMS 2012, Comber 2019)
- No previously unrecorded Aboriginal locations of Potential Archaeological Deposit or Aboriginal objects were identified within the study area during a survey carried out on 9 June 2023 in conjunction with Bronwyn Partell and Stacey Gilbert of Gandangara Local Aboriginal Land Council (LALC)
- The study area was identified as having low elevation (500mm 1m) above the Georges
 River
- Vegetation through most of the study area comprised swamp species, including mangrove and extensive rush
- This report concurs with the findings of previous archaeological assessments, that the study area is not likely to be of archaeological potential.



• The study area is close to the Georges River which was described in the consultation process as a highly sensitive and significant area for Aboriginal People.

Recommendations

Based on the results of this assessment and in accordance with Aboriginal heritage guidelines, the following recommendations are made:

- The portion of the study area which overlaps with AHIP 5014 is subject to the condition of the permit.
- Ground disturbing works within the footprint of the current design may proceed without further formal archaeological assessment.
- If changes are made to the proposal that may result in impacts to areas not assessed by this ACHAR further assessment would be required.
- Interpretation of the importance of the Georges River to Aboriginal People should be considered for the study area.
- If changes to design were made when more than six months had transpired since last project communication with Registered Aboriginal Parties (RAPs), a new consultation process would be required to assess the new design.
- Unexpected Aboriginal objects are protected by the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974. If
 any such objects, or potential objects, are uncovered in the course of the activity, all work in
 the vicinity should cease immediately. A qualified archaeologist should be contacted to assess
 the find and Heritage NSW and Gandangarra LALC must be notified in accordance with the
 Unexpected Finds Policy.
- If human remains, or suspected human remains, are found in the course of the activity, all
 work in the vicinity should cease, the site should be secured, and the NSW Police and
 Heritage NSW should be notified in accordance with the Unexpected Finds Policy.

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Project brief



The SEARs relating to Aboriginal Heritage require that this ACHAR be prepared in accordance with relevant guidelines, identifying, describing, and assessing any impacts for any Aboriginal cultural heritage values on site.

1.2 Description of the study area

The study area is shown in (Figure 1). It covers the eastern bank of the Georges River in Milperra at 56 Prescott Parade, 123 & 123A Raleigh Rd, & 80A Auld Ave (Lot 10 in DP731859, Lot 23-27 in DP7304 & Lot 21 in DP749985). The study area is located within the Parish of Bankstown and County of Cumberland and within the Bankstown-Canterbury Local Government Area (LGA) and within the boundaries of the Gandangara LALC. The study area contains land that had previously been used for sand mining, farming, timber getting, and connects to the former Riverlands Golf Course. Currently, the southern end on the riverbank is covered in part by mangroves and parts of the surrounding area are used for cattle grazing.

1.3 Aims and objectives

The aims of this ACHAR are to:

- Confirm the presence of Aboriginal objects within the study area.
- Gather sufficient evidence to assess significance of such Aboriginal objects.

The objectives of this ACHAR are to:

- Assess the Aboriginal cultural heritage values of the study area, including archaeological and Aboriginal cultural values, and the significance of any identified values
- Identify Aboriginal cultural heritage values that may be impacted by the proposed works including consideration of cumulative impacts, and measures to avoid significant impacts
- Ensure appropriate Aboriginal community consultation in the assessment process
- Identify any recommended further investigations, mitigation and management measures required.

This ACHAR has been undertaken in accordance with the following guidelines:

- Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales
 2010 (the Code of Practice) (Department of Environment Climate Change and Water
 [DECCW] 2010a).
- Guide to Investigating, Assessing and Reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in NSW [the Guide] (OEH 2011).
- Aboriginal cultural heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010 [the Consultation Requirements] DECCW 2010b).
- The Burra Charter 2013 (Australia ICOMOS 2013).

1.4 Limitations and constraints

Site survey for this ACHAR was subject to limitations on access due to dense vegetative cover and landform constraints including waterbodies and mangrove swamp.

1.5 Secretary's Environmental Assessment Requirements

The SEARs were issued in connection with this project (SEAR 1440 - updated) on 3 November 2022. In addition to the Standard SEARs for Cultural recreation and tourist facilities' which stipulate that under Section 19, the EIS must address the Aboriginal cultural heritage significance of the study area. The specific SEARs require consideration of the Aboriginal heritage values of the study area including:

an Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report prepared in accordance with relevant guidelines, identifying, describing and assessing any impacts for any Aboriginal cultural heritage values on the site



The requirements of the SEARs specific to Aboriginal heritage are listed in Table 1.

2.0 PROJECT FRAMEWORK

2.1 Commonwealth legislation

2.1.1 Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999

The Environment and Heritage Legislation Amendment Act (No.1) 2003 amends the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act) to include 'national heritage' as a matter of National Environmental Significance and protects listed places to the fullest extent under the Constitution. It also establishes the National Heritage List (NHL) and the Commonwealth Heritage List (CHL).

The Australian Heritage Council Act 2003 (AHC Act) establishes a new heritage advisory body - the Australian Heritage Council (AHC) - to the Minister for the Environment and Heritage and retains the Register of the National Estate (RNE).

The Australian Heritage Council (Consequential and Transitional Provisions) Act 2003 repeals the Australian Heritage Commission Act 1975, amends various Acts as a consequence of this repeal and allows the transition to the current heritage system.

Together the above three Acts provide protection for Australia's natural, Indigenous and non-Indigenous heritage. The new features include:

- NHL of places of national heritage significance
- CHL of heritage places owned or managed by the Commonwealth
- the creation of the AHC, an independent expert body to advise the Minster on the listing and protection of heritage places.
- continued management of the Register of the National Estate (RNE).

A summary of register searches is outlined below:

- There are no places listen on the NHL within the study area.
- There are no places listen on the CHL within the study area.
- There are no places listen on the RNE within the study area.

2.1.2 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Protection Act 1984

The Commonwealth Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Heritage Protection Act 1984 (ATSIHP Act), deals with Aboriginal cultural property (intangible heritage) in a wider sense. Such intangible heritage includes any places, objects and folklore that 'are of particular significance to Aboriginal people in accordance with Aboriginal tradition. These values are not currently protected under the NPW Act.

There is no cut-off date and the ATSIHP Act may apply to contemporary Aboriginal cultural property as well as ancient sites. The ATSIHP Act takes precedence over state cultural heritage legislation where there is conflict. The Commonwealth Minister who is responsible for administering the ATSIHP Act can make declarations to protect these areas and objects from specific threats of injury or desecration. The responsible Minister may make a declaration under Section 10 of the Commonwealth Act in situations where state or territory laws do not provide adequate protection of intangible heritage.

Where an Aboriginal individual or organisation is concerned that intangible values within the proposal are not being adequately protected, they can apply to the Minister for a declaration over a place.

A search of the Federal Gazette of Legislation was carried out on 7 August 2023 for declared Aboriginal Places within the study area. No such places were identified in the study area as a result of this search.

2.1.3 Native Title Act 1993

The main purpose of the *Native Title Act 1993* is to recognise and protect native title. Native title is the rights and interests in land and waters that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders have under their traditional laws and customs.

The following list is indicative of the type of land, which might be subject to native title:

- vacant Crown land and any other public or Crown lands including oceans and inland waterways, beaches and foreshores, State forests, national parks and public reserves
- pastoral leases
- land held by government agencies
- land held in trust for Aboriginal communities.

Under the amended Native Title Act 1993, Native Title is extinguished by the following:

- private freehold land, valid grants of private freehold land or waters
- residential, commercial or exclusive possession leases
- mining dissection leases
- community purpose leases (e.g. religious, sporting or charitable purposes)
- scheduled interests that give exclusive possession
- public works (e.g. schools, public amenities, hospitals etc.).

Section 24KA of the *Native Title Act 1993*, requires that native title claimants are notified of any 'future act' which may result in a change in land use for Crown lands affected by claims. A 'future act' is defined in section 233 of the Act as a proposed activity or development on land and/or waters that may affect native title, by extinguishing (removing) it or creating interests that are inconsistent with the existence or exercise of native title. If, after one month, there were no response to the notification, then the proponent will be deemed to have fulfilled their obligations under the Act.

The Consultation Requirements stipulate that consultation must be conducted with Native Title holders or registered Native Title claimants. A search of the National Native Title Tribunal database was completed on 11 May 2023. At the time this report was prepared there were no Native Title claims registered in the study area.



2.2 State legislation

2.2.1 National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974

The National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974 (NPW Act), administered by Heritage NSW provides statutory protection for all Aboriginal 'objects' (consisting of any material evidence of the Aboriginal occupation of NSW), and for 'Aboriginal Places' (areas of cultural significance to the Aboriginal community).

The protection provided to Aboriginal objects applies irrespective of the level of their significance or issues of land tenure. However, areas are only gazetted as Aboriginal places if the Minister is satisfied that sufficient evidence exists to demonstrate that the location was and/or is of special significance to Aboriginal culture.

There are no gazetted Aboriginal places in the study area. All Aboriginal objects, whether recorded or not, are protected under the NPW Act.

Section 86 of the NPW Act identifies that it is an offence to harm or desecrate an Aboriginal object and/or an Aboriginal place. Section 86 outlines penalty units applicable where it is identified that a person or corporation is in breach of Section 86.

The NPW Act defines harm to an object or place as any act or omission that:

- (a) destroys, defaces or damages the object or place, or
- (b) in relation to an object moves the object from the land on which it had been situated, or
- (c) is specified by the regulations, or
- (d) causes or permits the object or place to be harmed in a manner referred to in paragraph (a), (b) or (c)

A section 90 permit is the only Aboriginal Heritage Impact Permit (AHIP) available under the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974* and is granted by Heritage NSW. Various factors are considered by Heritage NSW in the AHIP application process, such as site significance, Aboriginal consultation requirements, Ecological Sustainable Development (ESD) principles, project justification and consideration of alternatives. The penalties and fines for damaging or defacing an Aboriginal object were increased in 2010.

2.2.2 Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979

The EP&A Act establishes the framework for cultural heritage values to be formally assessed in the land use planning, development assessment and environmental impact assessment processes. Part 3, Division 3.4 deals with the development of Local Environmental Plans (LEPs). Planning decisions within Local Government Areas (LGAs) are guided by LEPs. Each LGA is required to develop and maintain an LEP that includes Aboriginal and historical heritage items which are protected under the EP&A Act and the *Heritage Act 1977*. The study area is located within the boundaries of the Canterbury-Bankstown LGA and is covered by the Bankstown LEP.

The Bankstown LEP 2015 (Part 5, Clause 5.10) makes standard provision for the protection of Aboriginal objects and Aboriginal places of heritage significance. There are no listed Aboriginal heritage items within the study area on the Bankstown LEP 2015.

2.2.3 NSW Native Title Act 1994

The *Native Title Act 1994* was introduced to ensure that the laws of NSW are consistent with the Commonwealth *Native Title Act 1993*. Native Title claims, registers and Indigenous Land Use Agreements are administered under the Act.

A search of the National Native Title Vision database was completed on 5 May 2023. At the time this report was prepared there were no Native Title claims registered in the study area.

A geospatial search was also requested of the Native Title databases and was undertaken on 26 May 2023 with no Native Title Claims, Applications, Determinations or Indigenous Land Use Agreements being found.

2.2.4 Aboriginal Lands Right Act 1983

The Aboriginal Land Rights Act 1983 (ALR Act) established Aboriginal Land Councils (at State and Local levels). These bodies have a statutory obligation under the ALR Act to:

- (a) take action to protect the culture and heritage of Aboriginal persons in the council's area, subject to any other law, and
- (b) promote awareness in the community of the culture and heritage of Aboriginal persons in the council's area.

The study area is within the boundary of the Gandangara LALC.

2.2.5 Register of the National Estate

The Register of the National Estate (RNE) is a list of natural, Aboriginal and historic heritage places throughout Australia. It was original established under the Australian Heritage Commission Act 1975. Under the Act, the Australian Heritage Commission entered more than 13,000 places on the register. Following amendments to the Australian Heritage Council Act 2003, the RNE was frozen on 19 February 2007 and ceased to be a statutory register in February 2012. The RNE is now maintained on a non-statutory basis as a publicly available archive and education resource.

There is one indicative place listed on the RNE within the proposed cycleway footprint along the Georges River Foreshore:

• Georges River Wetlands, Henry Lawson Dr, Padstow Heights, NSW (Place ID 18397).

3.0 SUMMARY OF CONSULTATION

Aboriginal community consultation has been completed and was conducted in accordance with the Consultation Requirements (DECCW 2010b) and the *National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019*. A consultation log has been maintained which details all correspondence with the registered Aboriginal parties for the ACHAR. The consultation log and copies of correspondence are included in the appendices.

3.1 Stage 1

3.1.1 Agency letters: Step 4.1.2

In accordance with Step 4.1.2 of the Consultation Requirements (DECCW 2010b) letters requesting information on Aboriginal persons or groups with knowledge pertinent to the study area were sent on 26 May 2023 to the following agencies, requesting response by 9 June 2023.

- Heritage NSW
- National Native Title Tribunal
- NTS Corp
- Office of the Registrar Aboriginal Lands Right Act NSW
- City of Canterbury Bankstown
- Greater Sydney Land Office
- Gandangara LALC

3.1.2 Advertisement: Step 4.1.3

In accordance with Step 4.1.3 of the Consultation Requirements (DECCW 2010b) an advertisement was published on 7 June 2023 in the Canterbury Bankstown Torch, announcing the project and calling for Registrations of Interest by Aboriginal parties. Registrations of Interest were requested by 21 June 2023.

3.1.3 Registration of Aboriginal parties

In accordance with Section 4.1.3 of the Consultation Requirements, invitations to register an interest in the project were sent by email or letter to all those people identified by the agencies or advertisement. Responses were requested by 5 July 2023 (an earlier letter had been issued erroneously requesting response by 5 June 2023).

As a result of the invitation and the advertisement, 15 individuals/organisations responded. One group requested that their details not be disclosed. The registered groups are listed in Table 3.

3.2 Notification to Heritage NSW of Registered Aboriginal Parties

On 17 July 2023, a Notification of Registered Aboriginal Parties was sent to Heritage NSW. A copy was also sent to the Gandangara LALC on the same day.

3.3 Stage 2 & 3

3.3.1 ACHAR methodology review

A copy of the proposed assessment methodology was sent to the RAPs by email on 6 July 2023, requesting comments at the close of 28 days (3 August 2023). The draft assessment methodology presented information about the project and invited feedback on the cultural significance of the area. Six organisations responded to the assessment methodology. A summary of their comments is presented in Table 4. One proposed assessment methodology was emailed out one week late but included the full response time of 28 days (ie response due on the 14 August).

3.4 Stage 4

3.4.1 Review of draft ACHAR

The draft ACHAR was circulated to the RAPs on 28 August 2023 with a 28 day response date (25 September 2023). One RAP responded and was in agreement with the findings of the ACHAR. Table 5 records the response.

4.0 ABORIGINAL HISTORIES OF THE AREA

4.1 Southern Sydney, Georges River

Aboriginal people traditionally lived in small family or clan groups that were associated with particular territories or places. The language groups occupying the current study area are thought to have been the Bidjigal clan of the Darug people, the Dharawal, and the Gandangara (Attenbrow 2010).

The Dharawal language group was largely coastal and is thought to have extended from the Shoalhaven River, north to Botany Bay and then inland to Camden (Attenbrow 2010). Historical records show that the Gandangara were located to the west and southwest of the Dharawal and into the southern Blue Mountains. It is not known whether this distribution represented recent displacement patterns as a result of European colonisation or was part of a longer-term interaction with the Dharawal (Karskens 2010:496). The Darug language group occupied much of the Cumberland Plain between the Blue Mountains and the coast, with the language being divided into coastal and hinterland dialects (Attenbrow 2010).

s linguist Jeremy Steele has noted, it is difficult to be precise about traditional language 'boundaries' in the Sydney region today. To the south and east of the large northern loop of the Georges River, it seems the Norongerragal group of the Dharawal language group bordered the Cabrogal across the river. Resource rich areas such as the upper reaches of the Georges River – where the tidal influence reaches nearly 30 kilometres inland - may have shared boundaries, or boundaries with accepted access rights. Indeed, the ease with which Aboriginal people moved in nawi (tied-bark canoes) along the waterways of the Sydney basin suggests hard boundary distinctions may have been limited (Goodall & Cadzow, 2009).

The heartlands of the Cabrogal (or Gabrogal) lie in low land surrounding three creeks that run into the Georges River. Described on a 1791 map by William Dawes as 'bad country frequently overflowed' this was where over 200 million years ago the Hawkesbury sandstone that underlies much of the Sydney region sagged or subsided and created an extensive swampland that was gradually cut by meandering estuarine streams. This so-called 'bad country' was in fact incredibly rich with resources for the Aboriginal people who lived there. There were breeding grounds for fish and shellfish, as well as birds in the mangroves and swamp oaks or banga'ly as they are known in the Sydney language (Dawes & Hunter, 1788).

The creeks and rivers of the region were also 'pathways' for people with a 'canoe culture'. The Georges River offered an east to west and vice versa access way for Gweagal people from Kamay (Botany Bay) right up to its headwaters near modern day Appin. These pathways may also have been boundaries – for example, the engravings and artwork in the Cubbitch Barta National Estate, at the ex-Holsworthy military lands, has been found to be distinct from artwork to the north of the Georges River.

While the upper stretches of the river from just below its junction with Prospect Creek to modern day Liverpool are relatively accessible, the lower reaches of the river are rugged, with steep sandstone ridges running down to the water's edge. This meant the early colonists avoided exploiting the lower Georges River, and their avoidance of the area offered safety for the Bidjigal and other Aboriginal people right through into the 20th century.

In the early 1800s relationships between the Aboriginal people of the area and the European settlers were generally amicable. Grace Karskens notes several examples of close relationships between landowners and local Aboriginal people, including Charles Throsby who gave the Dharawal protection on his Glenfied Estate during later less peaceful times (Karskens 2010).

Relations between Aboriginal people and colonists did not remain amicable. A sustained drought during 1814 and 1815, and continued disenfranchisement, lead to tensions between farmers and the Aboriginal people who remained to the southwest of Sydney. The Aboriginal people were accused of stealing corn and potatoes and spearing cattle. Several farmers were killed on their properties. In a dispatch Governor Macquarie wrote that

'The Native Blacks of this country...have lately broken out in open hostility against the British Settlers residing on the banks of the River Nepean near the Cow Pastures'.

Aboriginal people were targeted, and Aboriginal men were strung from trees after they were killed to serve as an example of their fate (Turbet 2011:234).

Open resistance to colonisation was headed by individuals such as Pemulwuy. After the death of Pemulwuy in 1802, his son Tedbury continued raids and attacks on farms and appears to have based his warriors in the Georges River area. Tedbury was reported attacking 'Mr Bond's farm at Georges River' in 1809, forcing Bond to abandon the farm (Kohen 2006).

In 1816 these tensions culminated in the Appin massacre in which Aboriginal people were pursued by a detachment led by Captain James Wallis. Fourteen Aboriginal people of the Dharawal nation were shot or driven over a cliff to their deaths by the soldiers. The bodies of two of the Aboriginal men were strung up at the site (Turbet 2011). Although the numbers of Aboriginal people in the area decreased as settlers and farmers moved into the locality, communities remained living at Camden Park and along the Georges River near Liverpool (Liston 1988).

After European colonisation Aboriginal people of the Sydney Basin often continued to manufacture tools, sometimes with new materials such as glass or ceramics. There are several sites in Western Sydney where flaked glass has been recorded, for example at Prospect (Ngara Consulting, 2003) and Oran Park (JMcDCHM, 2007).

4.2 Riverlands Golf Course area

Throughout the 19th century and early 20th century Aboriginal people were recorded living in nearby locations such as the junction of Harris Creek and Georges River and were known to make a living from fishing the river and supplementing their foods with traditional sources. These practices occurred up and down the river and its banks and tributaries.

In 1934, a Mr C. Giles 'while ploughing along the George's River near the Quarries [near Liverpool] ... unearthed a stone axe and part of a spear and boomerang'. A Mr. R. Tapping, 'an old resident of the town, recalled that the Georges River tribe had a camp there, and that the aborigines made frequent hunting trips in the country between George's River and the Nepean' (Fowlie, T., 'History of Granville', 1918, ML, SLNSW, p. 10; Gapps, Cabrogal to Fairfield, p. 29; 'Aboriginal Relics Liverpool', Sydney Morning Herald, 13 February 1934, p. 101).

It is unclear where 'near the Quarries' in the 1930s along the river would be – there were numerous quarries for sandstone and sand and gravel mining and dredging were often called 'quarries'. However it should be noted there is a 'Quarry res' marked on a 1918 map (Figure 2) of the area known as the Bankstown/Milperra Soldier Settlement (Artefact 2023 Appendix). It should also be noted that a search of other historical maps did not reveal any other information regarding a previous quarry site.

William's grant and William's Creek




Both Harris and Williams Creeks to the south of the study area have a tidal limit, making them ideal locations for Aboriginal campsites, providing fresh water and having access to the riverway.

By the early 1800s, as more and more traditional Aboriginal lands were being occupied by colonists to the south of Sydney, Dharawal and other people tried to negotiate new ways of living with this impact. The so-called 'Chief of the Liverpool Tribe' Kogi had moved his family onto the property of Charles Throsby at 'Glenfield' during the conflict and warfare around southern Sydney in the 1810s, but then moved to the Georges River, toward less accessible and safer terrain. Kogi was also at this point given a 'king plate' or breastplate with 'King of the Georges River' inscribed on it. By the 1830s Kogi's family included his wives 'Nantz' and Mary and their children, including a son Jackey and they were recorded in the 'Returns of Aboriginal Natives' (Liston 2011:58).

Kogi's family lived during the 1840s and 1850s on an area of land at the junction of the Georges River and Harris and Williams Creeks that, like much of the early land grants along the river, remained unoccupied. The 100 acres had been granted to a Captain J T Williams but it seems he died or left the colony and the land remained unoccupied. In 1857, Kogi's grandson Jonathan Goggey, petitioned the government for security of tenure, saying their family had been living there for 21 years (since 1836) (Goggey 1857).

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At this stage, there was no formal government policy of establishing reserves for Aboriginal people and many were camping on unoccupied land, near their traditional homelands. Further downriver, other families such as the Malones, Rowleys and Mahroot's family continued to live and work in small fishing communities around the Cook's and Georges river mouths and in Kamay-Botany Bay. A strong Aboriginal community formed at Salt Pan Creek. (Goodall and Cadzow, 2009: 57-61)

During the 1850s from the Goldrush boom, pressure intensified on Aboriginal people in such communities and as the European population dramatically increased, 'unoccupied land' was increasingly prized. The Gogey family was challenged by a nearby ship building operation under John Rowley. However the portion of land on the 'Williams grant' remained 'unoccupied' well into the early 20th century.

In fact, it was not unoccupied at all. A neighbour to the William's grant recalled as a small boy in the 1940s an Aboriginal family living there. Apparently, there were 5 houses, a small orchard and farm. In 1943, the Commonwealth expanded the Holsworthy military base and these lands were resumed by the government.

Whether Aboriginal people were using nearby trees for traditional canoe-making or other items into the late 19th century is unknown, however another nearby Aboriginal family, the Leanes, petitioned the government for a boat – suggesting they may have needed to use bark canoes at times.

Aboriginal families lived on the Williams grant across the river from the study area from the 1830s to the 1940s and would undoubtedly have used local resources in a wider area than the land grant. While traditional bark canoe- making may have been redundant by the late 19th century, it could well have been continued in the George River through the 1830s to 1850s during the Goggey family occupation of the Williams grant.

5.0 ARCHAEOLOGICALCONTEXT

5.1 Historic land disturbance

The Georges River was explored by Captain Watkin Tench in January 1788, and later by the French Naval officer Jean-Francois de La Perouse. While Botany Bay was found unsuitable for settlement, the Georges River was determined to be equally unsuitable, considered as shoal water and not worth travelling further along (Lawrence, 1999). The Georges River remained un-explored until the arrival of Mathew Flinders and George Bass in the mid-1790s who brought an eagerness to explore the new colony. Their expedition found the land along the river to be favourable for agricultural purposes, and in 1797, Governor Hunter explored the river up to Prospect Creek (Lawrence, 1999). The Georges River was named after the British monarch, King George III (NSW Office of Environment and Heritage, 1999).

While the first land grant in Canterbury was made in May 1793, the first land grant in Bankstown was not made until December 1797 to George Bass. Matthew Flinders received an adjacent 300 acre grant shortly after, but neither of the blocks of land were farmed. The first Milperra land grant was made shortly after in 1799 to William Heath.

An Aboriginal pathway led along the Georges River, which was surveyed twice: once in 1796 by Charles Grimes, and again in 1807 by James Meehan. It is now referred to as the Georges River Old Road and considered to be the oldest road in the colony constructed by farmers (Lawrence, 1999).

By 1795, soldiers, marines and pardoned convicts had been granted 500 hectares in the area, many of which were used for farming. Due to frequent flooding however, these farms did not prosper. The economic industry of Bankstown changed in the early 1800s with encouragement being placed on the farmers to gather timber for dock yards and ship building (Lawrence, 1999). Milperra itself was not settled until the 1850s, initially being referred to as Heathfield, and later renamed to Thorn's Bush after a family of landowners in the 1870s. By 1891, Milperra was settled by two families, and then became a military horse training site for the Boer War (1899-1902).

From 1917 soldiers were given settlements in Milperra when they returned from the First World War. This was part of the rehabilitation projects to repatriate servicemen who had served overseas (Allison, 2010). One of these settlements was located to the east of the study area.

The following historical Imagery shows the contrast between conditions in the study area in 1929 (Figure 3) and 1960 (Figure 4). In 1929 the northern section of the study area has been subdivided into fairly small blocks, which sit among open woodland that extends and becomes denser towards the creek line to the south. The central section of the study area appears almost entirely cleared, and the southern section with its dark coloration likely represents densely vegetated wetland. The area of the future golf course is open woodland. In 1960 the golf course had been developed and trees were removed and ground disturbance is apparent in the imagery. In contrast, the study area of this report appears largely in common with land use in 1929, albeit with some changes in regrowth of vegetation.

5.2 AHIMS search

NOTE: The location of Aboriginal sites is considered culturally sensitive information. It is advised that this information, including the AHIMS data appearing on mapping below must be removed from this report if it is to enter the public domain.

An extensive search of the Aboriginal Heritage Information System (AHIMS) was undertaken on 19 December 2022 (Client Service ID: 741767) to determine the location of Aboriginal sites in relation to the current study area. An area of approximately 2.8 km (east-west) by 3.5 km (north-south) was included in the search. The AHIMS search provides archaeological context for the area and identifies whether any previously recorded Aboriginal sites are located within or near the study area The AHIMS search parameters were as follows:

GDA, Zone 56 311259 - 314019 mE

6241030 - 6244526 mE

Buffer 0 m Number of sites 25

There were 25 AHIMS registered sites located within the search area. There were no AHIMS registered sites within the study area. The results of the AHIMS search are mapped in Figure 5. The nearest AHIMS sites to the study area are shown in Figure 6.

Aboriginal occupation covered the whole of the landscape, though the availability of fresh water and resources was a significant factor in repeated and long-term occupation. Certain site types, such as culturally modified trees, are particularly vulnerable to destruction through historical occupation. As a result, more resilient site types, such as stone artefacts, are predominant in the archaeological record. Because of this, the nature and location of registered Aboriginal sites is an imperfect reflection of past Aboriginal occupation. Furthermore, the surviving archaeological record is also a reflection not only of historical land-use, disturbance, and the post-depositional events, but also reflects the sampling bias of previous archaeological investigation.

5.2.1 Listings of recorded AHIMS sites within the search and study area

Within the search area there are 16 trees described as Modified Trees (Carved or Scarred) that were recorded by the Bankstown Bushland Society Inc (2015). These appear on Figure 5 and Figure 6 as the predominant site type in the search and study area. In 2016 these trees were revisited by OEH (Heritage NSW) who determined that the scarring on these trees was caused naturally or by machine and not by Aboriginal people. In addition, the age and size of the trees were not characteristic of trees that would usually be found as living scar trees. OEH issued a clearance letter which stated that while the trees would remain recorded on the AHIMS register, they would be denoted on AHIMS as 'not a site' (see Table 6).

5.2.2 Site distribution

The predominant site types in the search area are isolated or low density artefact deposits (n=5), which when added to Artefact and PAD combined site (n=1) constitute at total of five sites, being 66.6% of total. These are distributed across the landscape inland from the floodplains of the Georges River. One scarred tree (AHIMS ID 45-5-3209) is located south of the M5 motorway, is apparently preserved woodland. AHIMS ID 45-5-5334 is a low count artefact site (n=2) located on a terrace above and some 400m to the east of the Georges River. The remaining AHIMS sites in the search area are located to the south of the M5 motorway on elevated ground.

5.2.2.1 Summary

The location of existing valid AHIMS sites in the search area, and the absence of any AHIMS sites in the study area potentially indicates a negative relationship between site occurrence and low-lying lands adjacent to the flood prone Georges River. The effects of historical utilisation of the study area are likely to have impacted the preservation of Aboriginal archaeological sites within it. Apart from those sites that have been reclassified on AHIMS and recorded as Not a Site, and the AHIMS listings of scarred tree AHIMS ID 45-5-5286 (PAD), there are no AHIMS sites within 200m of the study area.

5.3 Previous relevant archaeological reporting

The archaeological understanding of the early Aboriginal settlement of the Sydney Basin and surrounds is constantly expanding and developing. At present, the earliest occupation known is associated with deposits on the Parramatta and Nepean Rivers, which have been dated to c.25,000 – 30,000 years before present (BP) and 36,000 BP (JMcDCHM 2005 & AHMS 2012). Two coastal sites south of Wollongong at Bass Point and Burrill Lake in the Shoalhaven have both been dated to around 20,000 years BP (Lampert 1971 & Nanson et al 1987). Evidence at Lake Mungo, NSW has been dated to 50,000 – 60,000 years BP (Bowler et al 2003). The excavations conducted by AHMS across the Georges River, 3.8 km to the west at Moorebank Intermodal Terminal are dated to 18,000 years BP due to the association with artefact bearing deposits (AHMS 2015).

It should be understood also that the existing archaeological record is limited to certain materials and objects that were able to withstand degradation and decay. As a result, the most common type of Aboriginal objects remaining in the archaeological record are stone artefacts. These artefacts can be analysed in their contexts to provide a basis for the interpretation of change in material culture over time. Technologies used for making tools changed, along with preference for raw materials. Different types of tools appeared at certain times: stone hatchets are first observed in the archaeological record around 4,000 years BP in the Sydney region (Attenbrow 2010:102). It is argued that these changes in material culture were an indication of changes in social organisation and behaviour.

There have been a number of archaeological surveys undertaken which include the study area: these include AHMS 2012, Comber 2019 and Artefact 2019, 2022, 2022a and 2023. The following section is largely restricted to a summary off these most relevant reports.

5.3.1 Archaeological & Heritage Management Solutions survey (2012)

A survey of land including the study area was carried out by Archaeological & Heritage Management Solutions (AHMS) on 3 November 2011. Participants in the survey included representatives from the Darug Aboriginal Corporation, Darug Aboriginal Heritage Assessments, and the Darug Tribal Aboriginal Corporation. The aim of the survey was to document landscape conditions and ground disturbance to assess the potential for Aboriginal objects to be present within its study area.

Survey effectiveness was low due to dense grass/vegetation cover across the whole site resulting in very low ground surface visibility. No areas of exposed natural soils were identified during the AHMS survey. Several old growth trees were found but none featured any evidence of intentional Aboriginal modification. AHMS identified the eastern parts of the study area as having a high likelihood for Aboriginal values to be present because the area was located on an elevated terrace near the Georges River. AHMS determined that the site overall had moderate-high archaeological sensitivity and should be subject to archaeological test excavation prior to any proposed impacts.

5.3.2 Comber Consultants Survey (2019)

Comber Consultants' (2019) archaeological survey was undertaken in two survey units. Survey Unit 1 included the study area and comprised the river flat. This area was assessed by Comber (2019) as being of low archaeological potential due to erosion from regular inundation from the Georges River.

Comber (2019) Survey Unit 2 did not incorporate the study area. It was located further east on a raised terrace formation and was assessed as being an area of archaeological sensitivity due to the similarity to the Moorebank Intermodal Terminal landscape located due west on the western bank of the Georges River where Aboriginal artefacts were recovered in 2014 by Navin Officer Heritage Consultants (see below).

The extent of Comber (2019) survey area is shown on Figure 8 The Comber team completed full coverage survey of their assessment area but did not identify any Aboriginal objects on the ground surface. This observation was attributed to low ground surface visibility across the assessment area. No modified trees were identified. Comber (2019) referenced the OEH findings regarding the 16 scarred trees listed on AHIMS (see Table 6) and did not recommend any further work or protection as they were not listed as sites (see 5.2.1).

In conclusion, Comber (2019) concluded in keeping with findings of AHMS (2012), that the eastern, raised elements of their study area was of moderate-high archaeological sensitivity and should be subject to archaeological test excavation prior to any proposed impacts. The study area was not deemed of archaeological sensitivity due to its location on low lying, flood-prone landform.

5.3.3 Navin Officer 2014. Moorebank Intermodal Terminal Aboriginal Heritage Assessment

Navin Officer (2014) completed an Aboriginal Heritage Assessment for the proposed development of the Intermodal Terminal (IMT) at Moorebank, 5.5 kilometres west of the study area.

Navin Officer identified three zones of Aboriginal archaeological potential within the project area. These were:

Georges River Riparian Corridor – 100 metres either side of the Georges River

Minor Tributary Riparian Zones - 100 metres either side of tributary

drainage lines

The elevated slopes and riverside margin of a locally elevated tertiary alluvial terrace edge situated adjacent to the Georges River

- zone 100 metres wide.

Field survey identified five artefact sites, three scarred trees and three PADs as well as the sensitive landforms identified above.

A test excavation program was conducted in 2012 by Navin Officer. A total of 59 test pits were excavated across the sensitive landforms and identified areas of PAD with 264 artefacts recovered from 26 pits. There were no artefacts recovered from PAD2. Further excavations were conducted along the western side of Georges River in 2013. A total of 45 test pits were excavated with 14 artefacts recovered from nine test pits.

Analysis of the excavated sites showed that where intact deposits occur, Aboriginal occupation appears to be focussed upon the tertiary terrace edge. These elevated areas are in close proximity to higher order drainage, i.e. the Georges River, were interpreted as / or determined to be favoured locations for repeated and/or longer-term encampments. In summary, the excavation results from this site were found to indicate a relatively continuous, moderate to high density distribution of artefacts with a diverse range of artefact and material types present.

These excavations along the floodplain on the western side of the Georges River found that the extent of fluvial deposition of sands inhibited the testing of the lower pre-1836 floodplain deposits. It was considered that sandy deposits at or below 10 metres Australian Height Datum (AHD) within the Casula-Moorebank section of the Georges River Riparian Corridor are likely to be the result of sedimentation processes caused by the construction of the Liverpool Weir (c. 1836).



In conclusion, the indications of findings by Navin Officer (2014) for the study area, are that locations such as the study area that are located on floodplain immediately near the Georges River are unlikely to be of archaeological sensitivity having been subject to effects of flood action.

5.3.4 Artefact Heritage 2022. Riverlands Golf Course, Milperra. Archaeological Test Excavation Report. Report to Mirvac.

Artefact Heritage was engaged by Mirvac to provide a test excavation methodology for the area east of the study area that had been rated by AHMS (2012) and Comber (2019) as of moderate-high archaeological sensitivity and that should be subject to archaeological test excavation prior to any proposed impacts. During preparation of that test excavation methodology the area of moderate-high archaeological sensitivity was registered on the AHIMS database as Riverlands Golf Course PAD (AHIMS ID 45-5-5286). A total of 7.75 square metres was excavated in that PAD resulting in the identification of two stone artefacts in one test pit, within soils that were likely to have been redeposited. As a result of the test excavation program, the extent of Riverlands Golf Course PAD (AHIMS ID 45-5-5286) was considered to be of low archaeological potential. AHIMS was updated to show Riverlands Golf Course PAD (AHIMS ID 45-5-5286) as 'not a site'. The location of the two retrieved artefacts was listed as a small discrete site - AHIMS ID 45-5-5334 which was assessed as of low scientific significance. The recommendations of Artefact Heritage (2022) included that an ACHAR should be prepared to support an AHIP to allow impacts to AHIMS ID 45-5-5334. The location of Site AHIMS ID 45-5-5334 and results of test excavation are shown below in Figure 7.





5.3.5 Artefact Heritage 2022a. Riverlands Golf Course, Milperra. Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report. Report to Mirvac.

The 2022a ACHAR report was prepared to incorporate results of Artefact Heritage (2022) in accordance with the Guide (OEH 2011) and the Consultation Requirements DECCW 2010b in order to support an AHIP application (AHIP 5014) allowing harm to AHIMS ID 45-5-5334. As part of that process, wider assessment was made of cultural values and significance relating to AHIMS ID 45-5-5334 and its surrounds. No specific historic values associated with the site of artefacts retrieved through test excavation (RGC2020-AS01 AHIMS ID 45-5-5334) were identified. Aboriginal stakeholder consultation identified that study area as highly significant to Aboriginal people. That study area was considered to be of moderate aesthetic significance due to the presence of traditional landscape features. However, that study area has been significantly disturbed through frequent flooding events and RGC2020-AS01 (AHIMS ID 45-5-5334) lacks sufficient archaeological integrity required for additional research. Furthermore, the site is considered to be of low rarity, representativeness, and educational value. As a result, RGC2020-AS01 (AHIMS ID 45-5-5334) was rated as of low significance. The southern tip of the study area overlaps with RGC2020-AS01 (AHIMS ID 45-5-5334), see Figure 8. Therefore the conditions of AHIP 5014 apply to the portion of the study area which overlaps with that of Artefact Heritage (2022a).

5.3.6 Artefact Heritage Review of Scar Trees within the Former Riverlands Golf Course (2023)

The former Riverlands Golf Course, located to the east of our study area, has 16 trees previously described as scar trees (see 5.1 and Table 6 above) which have been the subject of several Aboriginal heritage assessments (for example AHMS (2012) and Comber (2019)). Comber (2019) discussed these trees and referenced the OEH clearance letter. Both studies assessed the landform to hold moderate-high archaeological sensitivity and recommended archaeological test excavations prior to any development or works, neither of these studies identified any of the 16 trees mentioned above to be potential Aboriginal sites (carved /scar trees). These sites remain on the AHIMS register but have been reclassified by OEH as 'not a site'.

The status of these trees was reviewed by Artefact in 2023. Artefact (2023) confirmed the previous assessments of AHMS (2012) and Comber (2019) based on the following:

- The 16 scar trees identified as 'not a site' did not meet scar tree assessment criteria and were thus confirmed as not of Aboriginal significance
- Previous corroborating Gandangara GLALC Officer and OEH Officer assessment findings of 2016 that the 16 trees registered on AHIMS were not 'Culturally Modified Trees' (CMTs)
- Recent comments from Gandangara GLALC representatives made during a community site walk inspection (made in February 2023) that most of the trees were either not, or were not likely to be, Aboriginal CMTs
- An officer from the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) identified the trees as not likely to be 'Culturally Modified Trees' (CMTs).
- Three independent Arborists corroborated the assessment findings saying the trees were either too young, semi-mature or not suitable/ideal for Aboriginal cultural modification practices
- Historical research did not identify any evidence of Aboriginal activity at the former Golf course in the early 1900s.

5.4 Summary of previous archaeological reporting

The study area and its immediately adjacent terrace have been subject to several stages of archaeological assessment, including survey by AHMS (2012) and Comber (2019). Both of those reports found that the study area was of low archaeological sensitivity, while identifying the elevated terrace outside and to the east of the current study area as being of moderate archaeological sensitivity. Both AHMS (2012) and Comber (2019) recommended archaeological test excavation in the elevated terrace and made no such recommendations for the flood plain within which the study area is located.

Archaeological test excavations carried out in the elevated terrace (Artefact Heritage 2022, 2022a) resulted in retrieval of only very small artefact numbers from soils that showed evidence of movement. As a result, the overall archaeological sensitivity of the river terrace was downgraded by Artefact Heritage (2022, 2022a) from PAD AHIMS ID 45-5-5286, to 'not a site', while a small and discrete site (AHIMS ID 45-5-5334) was registered for the location of the artefact finds.

The implication of this previous reporting for the current study area, are that adjacent local locations which were thought to have been of elevated archaeological potential have been shown as of low archaeological sensitivity. The current study area has been uniformly ranked as of low archaeological sensitivity.

6.0 LANDSCAPE CONTEXT

6.1 Soils & Geology

The study area is located entirely within the Richmond soil landscape which is a deep soil deposit comprised of poorly structured orange to red clay loams, clays and sands. Textures increase with depth with Quaternary alluvium consisting of sand, silt and gravels derived from sandstone and shale. The soils are of low to very low fertility and nutrient storage capacity. The surface soils are also moderately erodible with a high fine sand fraction and low organic matter content. The subsoils have a very high erodibility due to very low organic matter and a high fine sand and silt content. The implications of this are that while deep soils may have potential to contain stratified archaeological deposits, this potential is reduced by the erodibility and susceptibility of these soils to disturbance through flood processes.

The study area is located within the Cumberland Plain which includes several locations that contain suitable stone for tool manufacture (such as silcretes and basalt). Volcanic breccia is located about 20 kilometres north of the study area at Wetherill Park; dolorite and picrite are located about 30 kilometres northwest at Prospect; ferricrete bands are located around 5 kilometres to the west at Moorebank. Luddenham is located around 35 kilometres northwest, Plumpton Ridge and St Clair around 38 kilometres north and Erskine Park 36 kilometres to the northwest and all contain silcrete outcrops. About 55 kilometres north by northwest at the Rickabys Creek formation material such as chert, tuff, quartz, and quartzite can be found (Clarke & Jones, 1987; Smith, 1989a &1989b).

6.2 Vegetation

The Richmond soil landscape is traditionally associated with Australian red cedar (*Toona australis*), coachwood (*Ceratopetalum apetulum*), paperbarks (*Melaleuca spp.*), Sydney peppermint (*Eucalyptus piperita*), and aquatic plants include cumbungi (*Typha orientalis*, *Cyperus spp.*) and common reed (*Phragmites australis*) (Bannerman and Hazleton, 1990). The native vegetation that grows in this landscape would have been used by the Aboriginal people to produce baskets, coolamons, shields, and canoes (Baker et al 1986:136). It would have also provided both a marine and terrestrial habitat for animals consumed by Aboriginal people.

While the study area formerly contained a low open woodland, today it has been almost completely cleared.

6.3 Hydrology

The study area is located on the east bank of the Georges River within the Parramatta/Georges River Hydrogeological Landscape (HGL), characterised by the low-lying Quaternary and Tertiary Alluvial floodplains, extensive floodplains, and some ponding.


The valley in which the study area lies is one of the most flood prone areas of NSW. Flooding of the Georges River occurred at least 19 times in the years between 1873 and 1980 with the highest recorded flood level occurring in 1873 when the river height rose to more than 10.5 metres. Floods also occurred in 1986 and 1988 as part of a once in twenty-year flooding event, and in 1956 with a much higher flood level which is considered to have been a once in more than one hundred year-event (Brewsher Consulting, 2004).

Floodplain soils have been eroded and displaced due to these frequent flooding events. As a consequence Aboriginal artefacts located on the banks of the river or in the floodplain would have potentially been displaced or washed downstream.

6.4 Landforms

Located on the eastern bank of the Georges River within the Cumberland Plain the study area is on a gently undulating alluvial floodplain. The terrain is mostly flat and generally less than 1 metre (m) above the level of the Georges River. Other than through flooding, the likelihood of erosion hazards is generally low due to the low slopes and good vegetation cover. However, following periods of dry weather such as drought when vegetation is reduced, the possibility of erosion would increase when soils are subject to rain or flood waterflow.

7.0 SUMMARY AND PREDICTIONS

7.1 Regional and local archaeological character

Understanding of the Aboriginal settlement within the Sydney Basin is continually expanding and the existing archaeological record is limited to certain materials and objects which could withstand degradation and decay. The most common artefacts remaining are made of stone which when found in their contexts may provide the basis for interpretations of the change in material culture over time.

The study area is located on the Cumberland Plain region where Aboriginal occupation dates to the Pleistocene period with evidence from Cranebrook Terrace near Penrith in Western Sydney, possibly dating to 41,700 years BP, and a confirmed date at Shaw's Creek as 14,700 years BP. Occupation on Sydney coastal areas dates to 8,400 years BP at the modern-day site of the Prince of Wales Hospital.

Most sites within the Cumberland Plain are surface and subsurface artefact deposits with a marked characteristic 'background scatter' of low density artefact subsurface deposits, frequently comprised of worked silcrete derived from local sources.

7.2 Predictive model

7.2.1 Regional modelling

Over the past 30 years, sites on the Cumberland plain have been studied widely by survey, excavation, and desktop analysis. This has led to the development and refinement of a predictive model for Aboriginal occupation in the region.

Smith (1989) predicted that sites are likely to be found close to permanent creeks or within the vicinity of swamp margins. AMBS (2003) identified areas of PAD based on the associated topography, access to permanent water, distance from water and degree of previous land disturbance.

According to White and McDonald (2010), the Stream Order Model provides a sound basis for archaeological investigations in the Cumberland plain. A spatial and distributive analysis is provided for Aboriginal objects in relation to freshwater resources and along varying landform units. The study highlighted the relationship between the proximity to freshwater and the landscapes evident of Aboriginal occupation. Artefact densities were most likely to be on terraces and lower slopes that are within 100 metres of freshwater resources. Following this model, it is predicted that medium to high density artefact scatters will be located within the study area.

Owen and Cowie (2017) propose three models which can be said to accurately describe archaeological probabilities within a landscape. The Economic Resource Model, Activity Overprinting Model and Domiciliary Spacing Model.

The Economic Resource Model focuses on the resource zones. The confluences of creeks are considered high zones due to the richness in flora and fauna suggesting the evidence of Aboriginal activities will decrease with distance from these resource rich nodes. The Activity Overprinting Model was used to explain the density of sites at increasing distances from the creek and the Domiciliary Spacing Model was used to describe the features of spatial variation of a site.

The environmental context of the study area and previous study areas with a similar environment can also be used to inform possible archaeological finds such as:

- Materials used to manufacture stone tools which are abundant in the areas around the study area up to ~55 kilometres on the Cumberland Plain and could have been traded with neighbouring groups.
- Native vegetation which grows in the landscape would have been used to provide a habitat to animals consumed by Aboriginal people, as well as a source for materials used in the manufacturing of baskets, shields, canoes, etc.

7.2.2 Local modelling

Previous archaeological reporting in and immediately around the study area allows for more precise predictive modelling than the regional model summarised above.

For our study area, the following predictions for the identification of Aboriginal sites may be made:

- Given evidence of extensive clearance, it is unlikely that culturally modified trees will be present.
- If hills or raised ground such as terraces are present in the study area, these may be of low archaeological potential.
- Floodplain adjacent to the Georges River is likely of very low archaeological potential.
- Silcrete will be the dominant raw material present.
- Sites are likely to be open artefact scatters and isolated finds.
- The survival of subsurface archaeological material is likely to depend on a combination of natural erosion and sedimentation processes and historical and more recent land use patterns.
- Inundated or flood prone areas, including active mangrove are unlikely to contain sites.



8.0 METHODOLOGY

8.1 Aims

The aims of this archaeological survey are to:

- Test the predictive statements of the desktop assessment.
- Identify and record all Aboriginal objects visible within the study area.
- Identify and define areas of PAD (as defined by the predictive statements).
- Gather enough information to assess the values of identified Aboriginal objects.

8.2 Constraints and limitations

The study area is intersected by an unnamed watercourse, several areas of swamp and several densely vegetated and overgrown areas which were determined to be impassable. These constraints prevented the survey from being completed in a linear and efficient manner, necessitating frequent backtracking and attempts to circumvent obstacles. Overall, the study area is densely vegetated with thick layered grasses and rushes at head-height, regrowth of casuarinas and several areas of mangrove resulting in nil ground surface visibility.

8.3 Survey personnel

The survey was undertaken on the 9 June 2023 by Michael Lever (Heritage Consultant, Artefact Heritage) with the following representatives from Gandangara LALC and Mirvac Homes; Bronwyn Partell (Gandangara LALC), Stacey Gilbert (Gandangara LALC), Tessa Kore (Mirvac Homes), Larissa Tomlin (Mirvac Homes), and Damien Chand (Menai Civil Contrators).

8.4 Sample strategy

The study area is effectively one landform – a low floodplain. Nevertheless, for ease of description, and to reflect the way the survey was undertaken due to the accessibility of the terrain, the study area is described here in three zones: South, Central and North. The location of these zones is shown above (Figure 11).


As the terrain is discontinuous and obstructions occurred throughout the study area, the survey was divided into three survey units (see Figure 11 below):

- South Zone (Survey Unit 1), located between the M5 in the south and up to a point parallel with Prescott Parade in the north.
- Central Zone (Survey Unit 2), located between Survey Unit 1 in the south and up to the creek running along Keys Parade in the north.
- Northern Zone (Survey Unit 3), located between Survey Unit 2 in the south and up to the terminus of Auld Avenue to the north-east.

8.5 Survey procedure

A pedestrian sample archaeological survey was undertaken in accordance with the principles of the Code of Practice (DECCW 2010a). A handheld GPS was used to track the path of the survey team. Photographs of landforms, soil visibility, disturbance, and vegetation were taken using a GPS enabled tablet with notes entered to identify and analyse each photograph. A scale bar was used in the photographs. Each survey zone was walked twice with return trips from the point of entry.

9.0 RESULTS

9.1 Description of survey units

9.1.1 South Zone

The South Zone included an area in which the proposal would follow existing sealed roadway. No ground surface visibility was present in this location. The landform was level floodplain that had been subject to disturbance through road formation (Figure 12). The southern most extent of the study area near the M5, the old golf club, included neglected infrastructure which had been disturbed by road formation, car parking areas, dumped soils and waste (Figure 13). Ground surface visibility at the riverfront here, and throughout the study area overall, was effectively zero due to dense vegetation (Figure 14).

The riverbank itself exhibited large extents of concrete and brick bank-retainers, most of which had collapsed (Figure 15). Soil hummocking and buried modern waste such as bricks and metal were plentiful further inland (Figure 16). Further north, native grasses and rushes increased in abundance together with casuarina regrowth, resulting again in zero ground surface visibility (Figure 17). The northern extent of the South Zone comprised mangrove swamp (Figure 18), with the result that the survey could not continue further and relocation to the Central Zone was required.

9.1.2 Central Zone

The Central Zone included areas from the northern limit of the swamp in the South Zone (shown in Figure 18 above) to the creek running along Keys Parade (Figure 22). The area is mostly clear of trees and is level. It is covered in grasses that are lower and dryer than in other parts of the study area (Figure 19). Dense grass cover resulted in effectively zero ground surface visibility. One limited area of ground surface visibility displayed yellow clean sands (Figure 20). The foreshore constituted apparently clean silty soils with river levels less than 500 millimetres (mm) below ground surface (Figure 21). No evidence of ground disturbance was visible within the Central Zone. The Central Zone terminated at an impassable creek in the north (Figure 22).

9.1.3 North Zone




Figure 25: Dense casuarina growth along foreshore. View south

The North Zone comprised the balance of the study area north of the creek shown above and extended slightly past the terminus of Auld Avenue. The northern terminus of the study area included sports fields that have been heavily graded and formed (Figure 23). Land to the northwest of these sports fields was level floodplain covered by dense grass (Figure 24). Dense vegetation including very closely spaced casuarina regrowth impeded passage through the study area at the riverfront (Figure 25). Further east, vegetation comprised unrelieved rush growth to 1.6m tall, which appeared to continue southwards to the creek shown in Figure 22 above (Figure 26). Survey ceased at this point due to safety considerations and the very low likelihood of ground visibility within this dense vegetation.

9.2 Conclusions

9.2.1 Landform

The survey identified that the study area is located on low-lying flood prone land, generally situated only between 500mm and 1m above the level of water in the Georges River at the time of survey. This indicates that the study area is susceptible to flooding at episodes of even only mild to moderate rises in the Georges River level. The presence of incursive mangrove and swamp areas further illustrate the susceptibility of the study area to inundation.

Ground surface visibility and exposure was effectively zero. The species of vegetation that obscured ground surface provided further evidence for the damp and flood prone nature of the study area. These included casuarina species frequently associated with swamp and extensive areas of native reeds and rushes.

9.2.2 Ground Disturbance

- Much of the South Zone has been subject to disturbance as evidenced through the presence of roadway and dumped soils containing hard waste.
- Ground surfaces in the Central Zone appeared undisturbed.
- Apart from the presence of playing fields in the North Zone, no evidence of ground disturbance was observed.

9.2.3 Findings of survey

Although located within 200m of water, no Aboriginal sites were identified in the study area.

9.3 Analysis of survey coverage and effectiveness

9.3.1 Visibility and Exposure ratings:

Under the terms of the Code of Practice, ratings of Visibility and Exposure as provided below are to be rounded to the nearest 10%. Where these values from survey are less than 5% this results in an apparent zero total. This does not denote than survey has not taken place satisfactorily.

Effective survey coverage is outlined in Table 8, and landform survey coverage is outlined in Table 9.

9.4 Aboriginal sites

No new Aboriginal sites or locations of Potential Archaeological Deposit (PAD) were identified as a result of survey.

10.0 DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS

The results of this survey correspond closely to the findings of previous reporting in the study area: Comber (2019) assessed the current study area as not holding archaeological sensitivity due to its location on low lying, flood-prone landform. Comber (2019) also concluded, in keeping with findings of AHMS (2012), that the eastern, raised elements of their study area (outside the study area) was of moderate-high archaeological sensitivity and should be subject to archaeological test excavation prior to any proposed impacts.

Navin Officer (2014) undertook archaeological test excavations across the Georges River 5.5km from the study area and concluded that locations such as the study area that are located on floodplain immediately near the Georges River are unlikely to be of archaeological sensitivity.

In response to the rating of elevated areas to the east of the study area as being of moderate-high archaeological sensitivity, Artefact Heritage (2022) registered this area on the AHIMS database as Riverlands Golf Course PAD (AHIMS ID 45-5-5286). Artefact Heritage (2022) carried out archaeological test excavation on this elevated terrace. This resulted in the retrieval of two Aboriginal objects from 7.75m² of excavation. These artefacts were likely transported to site in water-born silts. As a result of these findings AHIMS was updated to show Riverlands Golf Course PAD (AHIMS ID 45-5-5286) as 'not a site', while the location of the artefact finds was ranked as a site of low significance (Artefact Heritage 2022a).

The implications for the study area are, that notwithstanding the proximity to the Georges River, the elevated landforms may be of low archaeological potential due to the effects on soils of inundation by the Georges River. The study area is of lower relief than the adjoining terraces in which Artefact (2022) carried out archaeological test excavation, identifying only very low numbers (n=2) of artefacts. This archaeological character of riverine terraces may only be local, as results of archaeological testing carried out on similar terrace landform (Navin Officer 2014) identified significantly higher artefact counts. Of more relevance to the current study area is the finding by Navin Officer (2014) that due to effects of flood action, areas located on floodplain of the Georges River are unlikely to be of archaeological potential. It may also have been likely that past Aboriginal utilisation of the study area was probably transitory, given that the area has been noted to have been used for fishing activity in the 19th and early 20th century. The presence of CMT more distant from the river indicate Aboriginal activity on higher elevations.

Given these factors, this report finds that the study area is unlikely to contain Aboriginal objects.

11.0 ABORIGINAL CULTURAL HERITAGE ASSESSMENT

11.1 Methodology

The cultural assessment in this report includes information collected through desktop assessment and Aboriginal community consultation undertaken in accordance with the Consultation process. This information was collected by Kieran Murray (Heritage Consultant, Artefact Heritage).

11.2 Cultural landscape

The World Heritage Convention of United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) defines a cultural landscape as one which has 'powerful religious, artistic or cultural associations of the natural element rather than material cultural evidence, which may be insignificant or even absent' (UNESCO and Intergovernmental Committee for the Protection of the World 2015). The relationship between Aboriginal Australians and the land is conceived in spiritual terms rather than primarily in material terms (Andrews et al. 2006). Aboriginal cultural knowledge has been defined as:

Accumulated knowledge which encompasses spiritual relationships, relationships with the natural environment and the sustainable use of natural resources, and relationships between people, which are reflected in language, narratives, social organisation, values, beliefs and cultural laws and custom (Andrews et al. 2006).

Aboriginal cultural knowledge was traditionally bequeathed through oral traditions from generation to generation. Within all Aboriginal communities there was a time of dislocation and upheaval associated with the arrival of colonial settlers. This widespread disruption resulted in much of the detailed knowledge and understanding of many of the elements of the cultural landscape being lost from the Aboriginal community, nonetheless many Aboriginal people maintain a strong connection to the land of their ancestors and collectively possess a wealth of knowledge passed down through the generations.

11.3 Identified Aboriginal cultural heritage values

Table 10 provides a summary of the Aboriginal cultural heritage values associated with the study area as gathered from historical information presented in this report and from the results of Aboriginal community consultation.

12.0 SIGNIFICANCE ASSESSMENT

12.1 Significance assessment criteria

In accordance with the Code of Practice, an assessment of the scientific value of an Aboriginal object is required in order to form the basis of its management. The Guide provides the following criteria for the assessment of scientific value:

- Research potential does the evidence suggest any potential to contribute to an understanding of the area and/or region and/or state's natural and cultural history?
- Representativeness how much variability (outside and/or inside the subject area) exists, what is already conserved, how much connectivity is there?
- Rarity is the subject area important in demonstrating a distinctive way of life, custom, process, land-use, function or design no longer practised? Is it in danger of being lost or of exceptional interest?
- Education potential does the subject area contain teaching sites or sites that might have teaching potential?

It is important to note that heritage significance is a dynamic value.

12.1.1 Historic value

Historic Value refers to the association of the place with aspects of Aboriginal history. Historic values are not necessarily reflected in physical objects, but may be intangible and relate to memories, stories or experiences.

The study area is not known to be associated with any people, events or activities of historical importance to the Aboriginal community. Furthermore, the previous surveys of the study area did not result in the identification of any Aboriginal objects. Therefore, there is no tangible evidence that the study area was a location of any significant event or activity in the pre-contact or post-contact past. At this level of assessment, the study area is considered not to be of historic significance.

While the RAPs did not mention specific historical events associated with the study area, its proximity to Georges River was noted as significant.

12.1.2 Aesthetic value

Aesthetic Values refer to the sensory, scenic, architectural and creative aspects of the place. These values may be related to the landscape and are often closely associated with social/cultural values. As the subject site is located within an urbanised setting, which has undergone significant clearance, modification and development; all aesthetic significance is lost.

The landscape surrounding the study area has maintained many of its traditional landscape features, such as the Georges River. As a result, the study area is considered to be of moderate aesthetic significance.

While the RAPs did not mention specific aesthetic events associated with the study area, its proximity to Georges River was noted as significant.

12.1.3 Socio/cultural value

Social/cultural heritage significance should be addressed by the Aboriginal people who have a connection to, or interest in the area.

One RAP, Kamilaroi Yanjintjatjara Working Group, stated that the Georges River which runs alongside the study area was highly sensitive and significant to Aboriginal people.

12.1.4 Scientific value

No Aboriginal sites or locations of Potential Archaeological Deposit (PAD) were identified in the study area as a result of this study. Therefore, no archaeological scientific values have been identified in the study area.

12.2 Statement of significance

In summary of information collated above the following statement of significance is made:

Historical value: There is no tangible evidence that the study area was a location of any significant event or activity in the pre-contact or post-contact past. At this level of assessment, the study area is considered not to be of historic significance.

Aesthetic value: The landscape surrounding the study area has maintained many of its traditional landscape features, such as the Georges River. As a result, the study area is considered to be of moderate aesthetic significance.

Socio/cultural value: The Georges River which runs alongside the study area was noted by one RAP to be highly sensitive and significant to Aboriginal people.

Scientific value: No archaeological scientific values have been identified in the study area.

13.0 IMPACT ASSESSMENT

13.1 Proposed works

Mirvac Homes propose construction of a shared pathway along the foreshore at the Mirvac Riverlands housing development in Milperra. The construction will consist of a foreshore cycleway and pedestrian access path along the foreshore of the Georges River, including a cyclist and pedestrian bridge over the mangroves and the Northern creek, and ancillary works. Detailed plans of these works are not yet to hand.

13.2 Aboriginal heritage impact

There are no registered Aboriginal sites within the study area (Figure 5). There are no valid registered Aboriginal sites within 400m of the study area (Figure 6). Registered Aboriginal sites and a PAD shown on Figure 6 as within 200m of the study area have been corrected on AHIMS as 'Not a Site' (Table 6).

There are therefore no identified impacts by the proposal on Aboriginal material heritage.

A summary of the impacts is provided in Table 11.

13.3 Ecological sustainable development principles

The Guide (OEH 2011) specifies that Ecological Sustainable Development (ESD) principles must be considered when assessing harm and recommending mitigation measures in relation to Aboriginal objects.

The following relevant ESD principles are outlined in Section 3A of the Commonwealth *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*:

- Decision-making processes should effectively integrate both long term and short term economic, environmental, social and equitable considerations (the 'integration principle')
- If there are threats of serious or irreversible environmental damage, lack of full scientific certainty should not be used as a reason for postponing measures to prevent environmental degradation (the 'precautionary principle')
- The present generation should ensure that the health, diversity and productivity of the environment is maintained or enhanced for the benefit of future generations (the 'principle of intergenerational equity').

13.3.1 The integration principle

Decision making processes should effectively integrate both long term and short term economic, environmental, social and equitable considerations (the 'integration principle'). The preparation of this ACHAR demonstrates regard for the integration principle by considering Aboriginal heritage values and impacts to these from the proposal during its planning phase.

13.3.2 The precautionary principle

If there are threats of serious or irreversible environmental damage, lack of full scientific confidence should not be used as a reason for postponing measures to prevent environmental degradation (the 'precautionary principle').

This report has assessed that no further archaeological investigations need be conducted. However, see the Unexpected Finds Policy below.

13.3.3 The principle of intergenerational equity

The proposed works would adhere, as close as possible, to the principle of intergenerational equity by collating scientific and cultural information on former Aboriginal occupation of the study area through the previous investigations and this ACHAR. The nature of the proposal is in itself one that contributes to the long term economic and social needs of current and future residents of the area through provision of recreational facilities.

13.4 Cumulative impacts

A cumulative impact is an impact on Aboriginal cultural heritage resulting from the incremental impact of the action/s of a development when added to other past, present and reasonably foreseeable future actions.

Aboriginal archaeology is by nature an irreplaceable resource and as such any harm to Aboriginal archaeology will have cumulative impacts. Based on the results of previous archaeological survey (AHMS 2012, Comber 2019) and test excavation carried out to the east of the study area (Artefact Heritage 2022) it is almost certain that the study area is not now and has not been of elevated archaeological potential. Therefore, the proposal's impacts to the study area will not comprise a cumulative impact. No further archaeological investigation is recommended. However, see the Unexpected Finds Policy below.

14.0 MANAGEMENT AND MITIGATION MEASURES

14.1 Guiding principles

No specific Aboriginal sites or PAD have been identified in the study area as a result of this assessment. No specific management or mitigation measures are therefore recommended. However, see the Unexpected Finds Policy below. The following principles would apply in the event a site was identified within the study area in the future.

The overall guiding principle for cultural heritage management is that where possible Aboriginal sites should be conserved.

Where unavoidable impacts occur then measures to mitigate and manage impacts are proposed. Mitigation measures primarily concern preserving the heritage values of sites beyond the physical existence of the site. The most common methods involve detailed recording of Aboriginal objects, archaeological test and salvage excavations, artefact analysis and, where appropriate, reburial of Aboriginal objects in a location determined by the RAPs.

Mitigation measures vary depending on the assessment of archaeological significance of a particular Aboriginal site and are based on its research potential, rarity, representatives and educational value. In general, the significance of a site would influence the choice of preferred conservation outcomes and appropriate mitigation measures, usually on the following basis:

- Low archaeological significance conservation where possible. An AHIP would be required to impact the site before work can commence.
- Moderate archaeological significance conservation where possible. If conservation was not
 practicable, further archaeological investigation would be required such as salvage
 excavations or surface collection in accordance with the terms of an AHIP.
- High archaeological significance conservation as a priority. Where all other practical
 alternatives have been discounted mitigation measured such as comprehensive salvage
 excavations in accordance with the terms of an AHIP.

Sites of unknown scientific value should be conserved where possible. Where conservation is not practical further investigation under the Code of Practice will be required to confirm the presence of Aboriginal objects and gather enough information to assess significance. Test excavation is not a mitigation measure, it is an investigatory action required to gather enough information to inform the development of appropriate mitigation measures.

As it is unlikely that Aboriginal objects will be present within the study area, no mitigation or management measures are required. However, to mitigate against the uncertainty of unexpected finds of Aboriginal objects, it is recommended that an unexpected finds policy is followed during the completion of the proposed works.

14.2 Unexpected finds policy

This unexpected finds policy outlines the steps required if unanticipated Aboriginal objects or human skeletal remains are identified and should be included as part of the Construction Environmental Management Plan for the project.

Aboriginal Objects



If unanticipated suspected Aboriginal objects are uncovered at any time throughout the life of the project, the following steps should be undertaken:

- Cease all activity within the vicinity of the find
- Leave the material in place and protect it from harm
- Take note of the details of the material and its location, take a photograph of the find in situ,
 preferably with a scale
- Inform the site manager/ area supervisor, who would then inform the superintendent/ principal

Once the find has been secured, a suitably qualified archaeologist should be contacted to assess the significance of the find and determine management requirements.

If the find is identified as a genuine Aboriginal object:

- Heritage NSW and Registered Aboriginal Parties (RAPs) must be notified and consulted
- A methodology for long-term storage of the find must be developed in consultation with RAPs
- The Aboriginal object should be registered on AHIMS
- Further archaeological mitigation may be required prior to works recommencing.

Works should not recommence until written consent is received from the project archaeologist.

An unexpected finds policy should be implemented in the event that Aboriginal objects or human skeletal remains are identified during construction.

Human Skeletal Remains

If suspected human skeletal remains are uncovered at any time throughout the life of the project the following steps should be undertaken:

- Cease all activity in the vicinity of the find
- Leave the remains in place and protect them from harm
- Notify NSW Police
- Engage a forensic anthropologist and archaeologist where required
- Notify Heritage NSW via the Environment Line 131555 to provide details of the remains and their location
- Notify the Gandangara LALC.

Excavation activity will not recommence unless authorised in writing by Heritage NSW.

14.3 Aboriginal stakeholder consultation

Aboriginal community consultation has been conducted in accordance with the Consultation Requirements (DECCW 2010a) and the National Parks and Wildlife Regulation 2019 (see Section 3.0).



14.4 Changes to the project area

Advice provided within this report is based upon the most recent information provided by the proponent at the time of writing. Any changes made to the project should be assessed by an archaeologist in consultation with the RAPs. Any changes that may impact on Aboriginal sites not assessed as part of the project may warrant further investigation and result in changes to the recommended management and mitigation measures.

14.5 AHIP 5014

Part of the study area overlaps with the AHIP 5014 issued to Mirvac Homes (NSW) Pty Ltd on 14 April 2023. Therefore the conditions of AHIP 5014 apply to that portion of the study area subject to the overlap (see Figure 27). While the proponent is also the permit holder of AHIP 5014 it remains a requirement that the conditions of the AHIP are met in those portions of the study area that overlap with the AHIP. The proponent must ensure that consultation is undertaken to ensure that conditions of the permit issued under NPW Act are met.

15.0 CONCLUSION

15.1 Conclusions

The following results and recommendations are based on consideration of:

- The requirements of Aboriginal heritage guidelines including:
 - The Code of Practice for Archaeological Investigation of Aboriginal Objects in New South Wales (DECCW 2010a) – known as The Code of Practice
 - Guide to investigating and assessing and reporting on Aboriginal Cultural Heritage in New South Wales (OEH 2011) – known as ACHAR guidelines.
 - The Aboriginal Cultural Heritage consultation requirements for proponents 2010 (OEH 2010b)- known as Consultation Guidelines)
- The results of Aboriginal stakeholder consultation to date
- The results of in-depth background research, archaeological survey

It was found that:

- Previous archaeological assessments of the study area found it to be not of archaeological potential due to its position on a flood-prone plain (AHMS 2012, Comber 2019)
- No previously unrecorded Aboriginal sites or objects were identified within the study area during a survey carried out on 9 June 2023 in conjunction with Bronwyn Partell and Stacey Gilbert of Gandangara Local Aboriginal Land Council (LALC)
- The study area was identified as having low elevation (500mm 1m) above the Georges River
- Vegetation through most of the study area comprised swamp species, including mangrove and extensive rush.
- This report concurs with the findings of previous archaeological assessments, that the study area is not likely of archaeological potential.
- The study area is close to the Georges River which was described in the consultation process as a highly sensitive and significant area for Aboriginal People.

15.2 Recommendations

Based on the results of this assessment and in accordance with Aboriginal heritage guidelines, the following recommendations are made:

- The portion of the study area which overlaps with AHIP 5014 is subject to the condition of the permit.
- Ground disturbing works within the footprint of the current design may proceed without further formal archaeological assessment (with note and consideration of the AHIP, above).

- If changes are made to the proposal that may result in impacts to areas not assessed by this ACHAR further assessment would be required.
- If changes to design are made when more than six months had transpired since last project communication with RAPs, a new consultation process would be required to assess new design.
- Interpretation of the importance of the Georges River to Aboriginal People should be considered for the study area.
- Unexpected Aboriginal objects are protected by the National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974. If
 any such objects, or potential objects, are uncovered in the course of the activity, all work in
 the vicinity should cease immediately. A qualified archaeologist should be contacted to assess
 the find and Heritage NSW and Gandangarra LALC must be notified in accordance with the
 Unexpected Finds Policy.
- If human remains, or suspected human remains, are found in the course of the activity, all
 work in the vicinity should cease, the site should be secured, and the NSW Police and
 Heritage NSW should be notified in accordance with the Unexpected Finds Policy.

However given the size and age of the trees they believe they would not be of the age group that you would have normally found living scar trees. The scaring was considered to be natural or made by machine and not modified by Aboriginal people. Considering the above information. OEH does not believe that these trees are Aboriginal Scar Tree's. and therefore not an Aboriginal site. Whilst the trees will still be recorded on the Aboriginal Heritage Information System (AHIMS), however their status will be shown as not a site. (see attachment) and therefore are not protected under the NSW National Park's and Wildlife Act. 

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

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

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

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

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

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
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Figure 1: Map of Study Area

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
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Figure 1: Map of Study Area

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
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Figure 1: Map of Study Area



























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
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Figure 1: Location of the study area

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
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Figure 1: Location of the study area

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
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Figure 1: Location of the study area

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
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Figure 1: Location of the study area

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
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Figure 1: Location of the study area


