Aboriginal Heritage Consideration and Due Diligence for Aboriginal Sites

A search of the NSW Aboriginal Heritage Information Management System (AHIMS) was undertaken on the 12th March 2024. The search was conducted across an area surrounding the Tate Ski Club lease area and found no Aboriginal sites being recorded in the location nor were any declared Aboriginal places found in the search location. The search results are attached.

The proposed activity is considered maintenance and improvement to existing premises, involving minimal ground disturbance and access along existing developed roads. The activity is of low impact involving maintenance of existing infrastructure, outlined in Item 7.5 of the Due Diligence Code of Practice (DECCW 2010). In addition to the AHIMS search not identifying Aboriginal sites or places, additional measures are presented below to ensure the activity is of low impact.

Additional Safeguard Measures

In addition to no Aboriginal sites or declared places being identified in the AHIMS search, the following safeguard measures will be undertaken during the proposed works:

- Access to the site will be via the existing developed roads and shared concrete driveway on the west and north of the lodge.
- Construction vehicle parking will be limited to the same concrete driveway and established parking area.
- All building materials will be stored on hard stand areas, particularly on the shared concrete driveway and established parking area to the west and north of the lodge.
- No earthworks will be undertaken in relation to the proposed works
- Where scaffolding is required for the works, wooden pads will be placed beneath the scaffold legs, for safety, and to reduce any potential impact to the soil surrounding the lodge.

Tate Ski Club considers it has taken all reasonable steps to identify items of Aboriginal heritage and put in place additional measures to reduce potential impacts given the proposed activity is of low impact and only involves maintenance of existing infrastructure.


