Integrated Development Application s100B - SFPP - Other Tourist Accommodation 7693 KOSCIUSZKO RD WILSONS VALLEY NSW 2624, 30//DP725492

I refer to your correspondence dated 13/10/2025 seeking general terms of approval for the above Integrated Development Application.

The New South Wales Rural Fire Service (NSW RFS) has reviewed the submitted amended information. General Terms of Approval are now re-issued, under Division 4.8 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act* 1979, and a Bush Fire Safety Authority, under section 100B of the *Rural Fires Act* 1997, are now issued subject to the following conditions.

Access - Property Access

The intent of measure is to provide safe operational access for emergency services personnel in suppressing a bush fire while residents are accessing or egressing an area.

- 1. Access roads for special fire protection purpose (SFPP) developments must comply with general requirements of Table 6.8b of *Planning for Bush Fire Protection 2019* and the following:
 - SFPP access roads are two-wheel drive, all-weather roads;
 - access is provided to all structures;
 - traffic management devices, including the proposed boom gate, are constructed to not prohibit access by emergency services vehicles. Where gated access is unavoidable suitable arrangements such as those outlined in the Bushfire Risk Assessment prepared by Firebird ecoConsultants, ref: Kosciusko Mountain Retreat Raheja Projects February 2025, dated 28/02/2025 are to be provided.

NB - It is noted that the secondary access currently provided may not be supported by TfNSW. Where possible this should be maintained as emergency access purposes.

Emergency and Evacuation Planning Assessment

The intent of measure is to provide suitable emergency and evacuation arrangements for occupants.

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- 2. A Bush Fire Emergency Management and Evacuation Plan must be prepared in accordance with Table 6.8d of Planning for Bush Fire Protection 2019 and be consistent with the following:
 - The NSW RFS document: A Guide to Developing a Bush Fire Emergency Management and Evacuation Plan and include planning for the early relocation of occupants and;
 - detailed plans of all emergency assembly areas, including on-site and off-site arrangements as stated in AS 3745 'Planning for emergencies in facilities', are clearly displayed.

This letter is in response to an assessment of the application based on the submitted further information and supersedes our previous general terms of approval dated 26/05/2025.
