- The house is used for residential and garage is used for storage but we want to turn it into a beauty salon
- What is the proposed use of the property?
 - To turn garage into a Beauty Salon

- Put chemicals in sealed containers away from heat
- Dispose of waste properly
- 2. Physical Injuries

Hazards: Sharp tools (nail files, cuticle pushers, scissors), slips/trips Risks: Cuts, punctures, falls

Control Measures:

- Keep workspace clean and organised
- Use tools with proper technique
- Have a first aid kit available
- Ensure floors are dry

3. Noise

Hazards: Electric nail drills, nail fans Risks: Hearing strain, headaches Control Measures:

- Very minimal noise, no control measures needed
- 4. Dust and Fumes

Hazards: Acrylic powder, filing dust, fumes from polishes and removers Risks: Respiratory issues, allergic reactions, eye irritation Control Measures:

- Wear a mask and safety glasses
- Vacuum after each service and ventilation system (open doors)
- Regularly clean surfaces and tools
- 5. Ergonomic Risks

Hazards: Poor posture, repeating hand movements, Risks: Back pain, wrist strain Control Measures:

- Use an adjustable chair with back support
- Take regular breaks
- Maintain proper posture

6. Fire/Explosion Risks

Hazards: Flammable chemicals (acetone, alcohol-based products), electrical equipment Risks: Fires, burns

Control Measures:

- Store flammable materials away from heat
- Use grounded electrical outlets
- Keep a fire extinguisher nearby
- No toleration of smoking or open flames in the garage salon

Waste Management:

What types of waste will be generated, and what are the segregation, handling, storage, and disposal plans?

Types of Waste

- Chemical Waste: Acetone, acrylic liquids
- Sharp waste: Blades and needles
- General Waste: Paper towels, gloves, cotton balls, masks, waxing bad paper, nail buffer, pedicure spa lining

Segregation, Handling and disposal

- General waste into red bin
- Store chemicals in sealed containers to prevent leaks and place in general bin
- Sharp waste will be placed in a mini recycling bottle purchased from supplier and when full, will be taken to the hospital nearby for disposal

What are the proposed waste minimisation and recycling programs?

- Buy in bulk to reduce packaging waste
- Control product usage to avoid more waste
- Reuse bottles for storage of chemicals like acetone and alcohol
