1. Site Overview

- Location: Lot 101, Jarrick Way, Jindera NSW

- Use: Bulk landscape supply and recycling yard
- Area: Approx. 15,000m² with hardstand surface and perimeter fencing

4. Flood Preparedness Measures

- Maintain clear drainage around site perimeter
- Store materials and equipment above ground level where possible
- Elevate electrical equipment and fuel storage

Bushfire Emergency Plan

- Keep sandbags on site for use at key entry points
- Designate elevated zones for relocating sensitive stock or assets

5. Flood Emergency Response

- Monitor BOM and SES alerts during severe weather
- Stop operations immediately if flood warnings are issued
- Move staff and mobile equipment to elevated zones
- Block potential water entry paths with sandbags
- Evacuate all personnel if directed by emergency services

6. Post-Flood Actions

- Do not re-enter until safe and cleared by relevant authorities
- Check for water and electrical hazards
- Record and photograph any damage for insurance purposes
- Begin clean-up with PPE and dispose of any contaminated materials appropriately
