Supporting Reasons	1. The Proposal will provide additional housing opportunities by rezoning a parcel of land from RU4 Primary Production Small Lots to R2 Low Density Residential. This will		
	increase housing supply in the area and contribute to meeting the objectives of the Wollondilly Growth Management Strategy		
	2. The rezoning of the land is in keeping with the existing housing density of the area and provides an opportunity for additional housing choices.		
	 This is an appropriate landuse as the proposal is 1km from Tahmoor Train Station and 1.3km from Tahmoor's employment area. The land is in an existing residential area with urban services provided and will contribute towards the prevention of isolated rural areas being used for more intensive residential developments.

	1. Prior to undertaking public exhibition, Council is to amend the project timeline within the planning proposal to reflect the 12 month timeframe allocated for completing the LEP.		
	2. Council is to demonstrate that the planning proposal satisfies the requirements of State Environmental Planning Policy (SEPP) 55 – Remediation of Land. Council is to prepare an initial site contamination investigation report to demonstrate that the site is suitable for rezoning to the proposed zone. This report is to be included as part of the public exhibition material.		
	3. Prior to undertaking public exhibition, Council is to include additional information on flora and fauna to demonstrate consistency with S117 Direction 2.1 Environment Protection Zones and address the proposals consistency with State Environmental Planning Policy (SEPP) 44 – Koala Habitat Protection.		
	4. Council has identified that additional information regarding heritage, hydrology, traffic and transport and bushfire hazard is to be prepared to support the planning proposal. This additional information is to be placed on public exhibition with the planning proposal.		
	5. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Environment Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") as follows:		
	 (a) the planning proposal must be made publicly available for a minimum of 28 days; and (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made 		
	publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of A Guide to
