Report

Background

In October 2010 Council wrote to the Department of Planning seeking advice and direction on finalising a proposed instrument to deal with the deferred areas in the Wagga Wagga LEP 2010.

In reply, the Minister's letter of 10 February 2011, advised:

- Under the terms of reference of the Wagga Wagga City Council Planning Panel and the provisions of s54 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act, the Wagga Wagga City Council Planning Panel cannot be the Relevant Planning Authority to prepare a Planning Proposal for a proposed instrument to deal with the deferred matters in the LEP. (On the supporting advice of the Department of Planning, the Minister needed to appoint the Interim Planning Panel to finalise the deferred matters because the re-zoning of the deferred lands can only be effected by a Planning Proposal and the WWCC Planning Panel did not have the jurisdiction to do this).
- A Planning Proposal must be prepared in accordance with the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act to progress the rezoning of the deferred matters.
- □That Council contact the Regional Office (of the Department of Planning) to discuss the processing of the Planning Proposal to best recognize the existing work and consultation that has been completed.



Current Status

In relation to the Minister's request for Council to consult the Department about progressing the preparation of the Planning Proposal, Council accepted the Department's offer for it to address the Wagga Wagga Interim Joint Planning Panel.

The Department's representatives addressed the Interim Panel on 9 March 2011 following which, (and at the request of the Interim Panel) the Manager Strategic Planning then made a separate presentation to the three Councillor representatives on the Interim Panel on 8 April 2011, in relation to the issues associated with the deferred areas.
