Council has prepared a Planning Proposal to rezone 49 Fitzroy Street, Tatton (Lot 34 DP 1061134) from R1 General Residential to RE1 Public Recreation.

A report on the Planning Proposal (Item RP-7) was considered by Council's Planning Standing Committee on 29 November 2011. The Committee supported the issues raised in that Planning Proposal which were to:

1. Receive and note the Planning Proposal to rezone 49 Fitzroy Street, Tatton (Lot 34 DP 1061134) from R1 General Residential to RE1 Public Recreation; and
2. Forward the Planning Proposal for the change of zone over the subject land to the Department of Infrastructure and Planning under section 56(1), requesting that the Minister issue a "gateway determination" that will allow the Planning Proposal to proceed.

The Council's Planning Standing Committee recommendation was adopted and confirmed at Council's Ordinary Meeting held on 12 December 2011.
