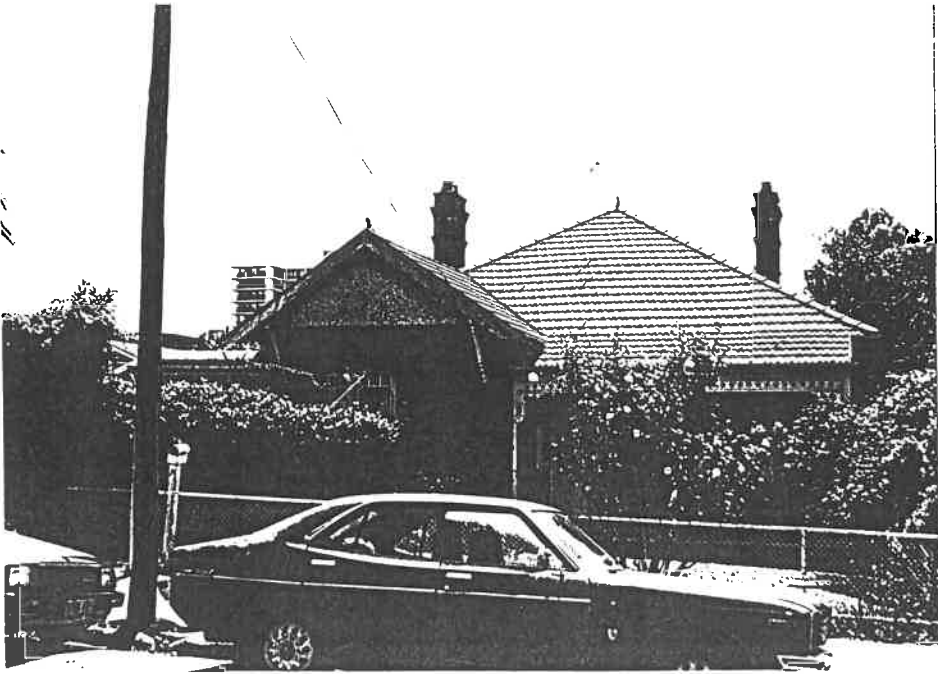

DESCRIPTION, HISTORY, SIGNIFICANCE A single storey, brick, Federation house with a Marseilles tiled hip and gable roof with terra cotta finials. An asymmetrical facade features a stuccoed gable, turned timber verandah posts, timber brackets and valance, arched window with brick voussoirs and elaborate timber brackets to the gable. The verandah to the west has a corrugated iron bull nosed roof and has been infilled. This Federation house built early this century of local significance for its retention of detail, form and scale and illustrates the good quality cottage development close to the railway in Strathfield in the period around the turn of the century.
