Council is seeking an authorisation to exercise its plan making delegations. As the Planning Proposal is considered to be dealing with matters of local significance, it is appropriate that an authorisation to exercise its plan making delegations be issued to Council.

The RPA has provided a project time line which estimates that the LEP will be ready for finalisation and notification by November 2015. A 6 month time frame for completion of the proposal is recommended to ensure sufficient time is available to complete the proposal.

Guyra LEP 2012 was notified on 30 November 2012.

Assessment Criteria

Need for planning proposal :

The Planning Proposal is not the result of a strategic study or report.

The need for the proposed changes, and the increased planning flexibility that will result, has been identified by Council through the operation of the current LEP since 2012.

Consistency with strategic planning framework:

While no Regional Strategies apply to the Guyra LGA, the New England North West Strategic Regional Land Use Plan does apply. The Planning Proposal is considered to be consistent with the provisions of the Strategic Regional Land Use Plan.

The proposal is considered not to be inconsistent with Council's local growth management strategy (New England Development Strategy) that was approved by the Director General in March 2010. While Council's local strategic planning work does not specifically address the issues of rural boundary adjustments or detached dual occupancies, the Planning Proposal is not considered to be inconsistent with the intent of the strategy (particularly in relation to detached dual occupancies as no increase in potential dwelling density will result as attached dual occupancies are already permissible in the zones).

The Planning Proposal has been identified as being consistent with all applicable SEPPs and section 117 Directions, except in relation to the following:

4.3 Flood Prone Land

While not specifically identified by the relevant planning authority, this Direction is relevant as the Planning Proposal will affect land that is flood prone. The proposal will result in the potential for detached dual occupancies to be built in areas that are subject to flooding. Council's LEP has controls relating to flood prone land and the inconsistency with this Direction is considered to be minor due to the development controls already in place.

4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection

This Direction is relevant to the proposal as it will apply to land identified as being bushfire prone. The Direction requires the RPA to consult with the Commissioner of the NSW Rural Fire Service after a Gateway Determination has been issued. Until this consultation has occurred the consistency of the proposal with the Direction remains unresolved.

It is noted that the proposal currently states that is consistent with all applicable s117 Directions. To better inform the public, it is considered appropriate that the proposal be amended prior to public exhibition to identify the current inconsistencies with s117 Directions 4.3 Flood Prone Land and 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection.

Environmental social economic impacts:

No significant environmental impact has been identified as resulting from the Planning Proposal. It is considered that any site specific issues can considered and assessed appropriately at the development stage.

The increased flexibility associated with the proposed changes are likely to have positive social and economic impacts for landowners.
