Planning Proposal for 366 Dunoon Road, Tullera

At its Ordinary Meeting held on 8 November 2016 Lismore City Council considered a Planning Proposal for a LEP amendment to the minimum lot size at 366 Dunoon Road, Tullera to enable the creation of one allotment for a dwelling. Council resolved to:
