Planning proposal to amend Port Macquarie Hastings Local Environmental Plan 2011

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated 25 October 2013 requesting a Gateway determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") in respect of the planning proposal to permit eco-tourist facilities in certain zones and include additional local provisions to facilitate eco-tourist facilities being appropriate in scale to their location.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, I have now determined the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway determination.

I have also agreed the planning proposal's inconsistencies with S117 Directions 1.5 Rural Lands, 3.1 Residential Zones, 3.4 Integrating Land Use and Transport and 4.1 Acid Sulfate Soils are of minor significance. No further approval is required in relation to these Directions.

Council will still need to obtain the agreement of the Director General to comply with the requirements of S117 Direction 1.3 Mining, Petroleum Production and Extractive Industries and S117 Direction 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection. Council should ensure that this occurs prior to the plan being made.

The Minister delegated his plan making powers to councils in October 2012. It is noted that Council has now accepted this delegation. I have considered the nature of Council's planning proposal and have decided to issue an authorisation for Council to exercise delegation to make this plan.

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 6 months of the week following the date of the Gateway determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the planning proposal as soon as possible. Council's request to draft and finalise the LEP should be made directly to Parliamentary Counsel's Office 6 weeks prior to the projected publication date. A copy of the request should be forwarded to the department for administrative purposes.

The State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under section 54(2)(d) of the EP&A Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.

Gateway Determination

Planning proposal (Department Ref: PP_2013_PORTM_009_00): to permit eco-tourist facilities in certain zones and include additional local provisions to facilitate eco-tourist facilities being appropriate in scale to their location.

I, the Regional Director, Northern Region at the Department of Planning and Infrastructure as delegate of the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, have determined under section 56(2) of the EP&A Act that an amendment to the Port Macquarie Hastings Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2011 to permit eco-tourist facilities in Zones RU1 Primary Production, RU2 Rural Landscape, R1 General Residential, R5 Large Lot Residential, SP3 Tourist and E4 Environmental Living and include additional local provisions to facilitate eco-tourist facilities being appropriate in scale to their location, should proceed subject to the following conditions:

1. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") as follows:
 - (a) the planning proposal is classified as low impact as described in *A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning & Infrastructure 2013)* and must be made publicly available for a minimum of **14 days**; and
 - (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of *A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning & Infrastructure 2013)*.
2. Consultation is required with the following public authorities under section 56(2)(d) of the EP&A Act and/or to comply with the requirements of relevant S117 Directions:
 - NSW Rural Fire Service
 - Department of Primary Industries – Minerals and Petroleum

Each public authority is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and relevant supporting material and given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal.
3. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 56(2)(e) of the EP&A Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).

4. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be **6 months** from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
