**Historical notes of provenance:** Tenders were called for the "erection of a new building, Public School, Aria Park" by the Department of Works on 5th March, 1908. The Parents and Citizens Association was active by November, 1908. School commenced on this new site on 30th November, 1908. In 1909 the association moved to have the new school grounds enclosed, a horse paddock provided, and a teacher's residence built. Work on a residence was under way in mid 1910. In March 1914 the enrolment had reached 100, "and the work was getting beyond the present staff of two". The Aria Park School opened as a Provisional School in April, 1899 and continued as such until September, 1904, when in October, 1904, it was reclassified as a Public School. It operated as a Public School until December, 1943, when it opened in January, 1944 as a Central School until December, 1948. From January, 1949 until December, 1950, it was once again classed as a Public School. It was then reclassified as a Central School starting January, 1951, and has continued in that category to the present day (1993).
