	A most significant site for the Trungley Hall community, being the centre of the German Lutheran congregation and burial site of many that came from South Australia, Victoria and Southern NSW in the 1890's and early 1900's, as well their descendants.						
	This cemetery was first recorded as the General Cemetery at Narraburra, located 15 kilometeres north of Temora. The plans for the cemetery were drawn up and approved on October 30th, 1896. In 1897 the Duck Creek Farmers & Settlers Association successfully applied for a grant of land for a public cemetery which was dedicated on June 9th, 1897. A letter was sent to Messrs A. C. Waldron, E. A. Schliebs and J. M McNamara from the Treasury of NSW on June 23rd, 1898 indicating 30 pounds had been lodged in an account for the purpose of clearing and enclosing the general cemetery, Duck Creek. Originally this cemetery was divided into separate denominations with a road through the middle. However, only the Lutheran section was ever used and the rest of the area has remained vegetated. At a meeting of the Farmers and Settlers Association on September 30th, 1899, an account of 10 shillings was passed for payment to Mr. Schubert for a gate at the cemetery. There about 100 graves in the cemetery, the oldest grave marked with a headstone is of the 1890's, some with inscriptions in German. The first resident pastor of Trungley Hall, Pastor Backen, is also buried here. Although it
