**Statement of significance:** Contributing. This silo structure dominates the Arianh Park skyline, illustrating the significance of the grain industry to the Arianh Park district. # 4701737 on Australian Institute of Architects (NSW) registry listing.

**Historical notes of provenance:** In 1908 a wheat storage shed of 20,000 bag capacity was applied for by the Arianh Park branch of the Farmers and Settlers association. This was completed by November, 1909 and leased by the local F & S. The Governemnt scheme to build concrete silos in the wheat growing areas began in 1918, with the first silos being built in the Riverina. By the end of March, 1918, work had begun on building six 70 ft. high silos adjoining the Arianh Park railway siding. Peak Hill was the first completed, with trial loadings on 4/5th August, 1918. Apparently work had halted at Arianh Park, possibly giving time to assess any needs etc following the trials at Peak Hill, as work did not recommence at Arianh Park until January, 1920. The intention would have been to have the silos operational for the 1920-21 season.
