Historical notes This building was formerly the Federal Hotel. The site was in the very early days occupied by the original of provenance: Grenfell Hotel, also known as Press's Hotel. This hotel burned down in a spectacular fire on 1st April, 1901, together with several other shops in the vicinity. In 1903 it was valued at 1200 pounds. R. J. King and then his wife Elizabeth Ann King, owned it until 1949. George Elliott was the lessee from at least 1903 until c1920. In the 1905-06 rate period, George Williams had a shop within the building. Its value in 1905 was 1,200 pounds, becoming 1,300 pounds in 1906. In 1908 Mrs L.H.G. Hughes was listed as widow-occupier, while the property was valued at 2,740 pounds. Its 1911-13 value was 2,800 pounds, followed in 1912-14 as 3,700 pounds. From the 1914-19 rates, R.J. King's widow Elizabeth Agnes King was the owner, and Owen Smith the lessee and the sub-lessee was George Elliott. In 1920-22 Owen Smith was still the lessee. The 1940 Rates showed its value as 6,000 pounds and E. A. King the owner. In the 1947-49 Rates, the property was owned by the estate of Elizabeth Agnes King. Lessees included the Shields family in the mid 1950's According to the date on the façade, the Federal Hotel building was built in 1912. However, it may have been in use before that date. Along with other buildings in Temora's main street, it lost its verandah balcony and posts in the late 1960's campaign to get rid of verandah posts in the town. This was replaced by the current (2007) suspended awning. Even though the Federal Hotel was of solid brick construction, unlike the earlier Grenfell Hotel, its life as a licensed hotel was brought to a sudden close when a disastrous fire in the bar and other parts of the ground floor took place on Saturday, 24th February, 1996. Fortunately, the hotel was vacant at the time of the fire, which was discovered by a passer-by shortly before 1-30 a.m. While the fire damage appeared to be mainly confined to the lower floor and bar area, there was smoke and heat damage to the upper level. Damage was estimated at \$50,000, and it appears that the owners at the time made no attempt to repair or rebuild the hotel. Then Barry Smith owned it for a short time. It was subsequently purchased by Mr. Graham Granleese in 1996. Since then the building has been beautifully renovated and has been occupied by Mrs Helen Granleese as "Patches of Heaven", specialising in handicraft and other specialised services, as well as catering for overnight accommodation. Paul & Theresa McCrone bought the building from Granlon Pty ltd 12 September 2006 and operate a 15 bedroom Bed & Breakfast upstairs trading under the name of Patchwork Inn B & B. Helen Granleese operates at street level a fabric/gift shop known as "Patches of Heaven" where the old bar was located. Belinda Maxwell has operated her beautician business from 171 Hoskins Street shop since 10 December 2003. The ground level building on the north side of the Hoskins street carriage-way entrance is currently (2007) occupied by the South West Slopes Credit Union. Previously it had been Lynch's Hairdressing.

The Federal Hotel was on the site originally occupied by the original Grenfell Hotel, also known as 'Press Hotel'. The Grenfell Hotel burned down in a spectacular fire on 1st April, 1901, together with several sohps in the vicinity. According to the date on the now façade of the Federal Hotel the building was built in 1912. However, it may have been in use before that date. Along with other buildings in Temora's main street, it lost its verandah balcony and posts in the late 1960's campaign to get rid of verandah posts of the town. This was replaced by the current suspended awning.

The Federal Hotel was of a solid brick construction (unlike the earlier Grenfell Hotel), but it too was brought to a sudden close when a disastrous fire in the bar and other parts of the ground floor took place on Saturday, 24th February, 1996. Fortunately the hotel was vacant at the time of the fire, which was discovered by a passer-by shortly before 1:30am. While the fire damage appeared to be mainly confined to the lower floor and bar area, there was smoke and heat damage to the upper level. Damage was estimated at \$50,000 and it appears that the owners at the time made no attempt to repair or rebuild the hotel. The Federal Hotel building was advertised for sale by tender on Thursday, 8th May, 1997. There was interest at the time by the Temora Shire Council and the Community Centre to turn the facility into a Tourist Information Centre, Community Art Gallery, Community Centre and options to incorporate a permanent home for Playgroup. This proposal was based on receiving substantial grant funding, however the proposal did not eventuate. Barry &

Gai Smith and Rob & Lyn Cartwright bought the premises at tender, and then sold off the licence to a hotel in Sydney for the upcoming 2000 Olympics. They then sold the building to Granlon Pty Ltd in 1996 (which was a syndicate of Mr & Mrs Graeme & Helen Granleese & Mr & Mrs Bill & Libby Hanlon). Granlon Pty Ltd beautifully renovated the building and converted the front lower section of the hotel for retail usage. They then turned the rear section and upper level into a Bed and Breakfast style accommodation.

This similar usage has continued with the new owners Mr & Mrs Paul and Theresa McCrone; the accommodation is called Patchwork Inn B & B accommodation. Cellar The cellar is still able to be accessed through

the front retail shop, however, the timber has been unfortunately taken to by termites. The beer lines are still intact and the old ice tongs are kept down there for luck. Metal Gates The metal gates that are now locking off the access from the main street to the rear of the premises are believed to be from the Old Temora Cemetery. Unique Stories Ghosts A lady clairvoyant once stayed in the B & B accommodation approximately in 2013 and stated that there was a little girl ghost named 'Belle Belle' that was gracing her presence in the upper level of the building. Belle Belle had apparently fallen off a clairvoyant said that Belle Belle was dressed in a tunic dress and that her parents wanted her to go home. Belle Belle was sent home by the clairvoyant and remarkably funny occurrences then too vanished. The vacuum never went off again and the doors and windows in rooms 7 & 9 were able to be closed during the day. The lady clairvoyant story supports a guest stating at an earlier time, that one night she was awoken by a little girl tugging on her sleeve and the girl requested her to get up and play. Similar instances have occurred in the premises of the Credit Union; funny unexplainable things have happened over the years.
