It had a high single-pitched iron roof, and included a choir loft. A skillion extension was added to one side. It was used as a church from 1893 until the new one built on the southern side of the road in 1911. It was used continuously as a Lutheran Day School from 1906 until 1948, despite two World Wars. The building was demolished prior to 1949 when a new hall was created by transferring a building from Burilyang to south of the church.**Themes:** **National theme**
