MAYORAL MINUTES

Putting a Halt to Bill Posters

Most of us would have seen unsightly posters and placards stuck to power poles and elsewhere throughout our City that promote nightclubs, bands and more.

This is illegal and considered a form of vandalism. These posters make our City look unsightly and they are a blight on the streetscape.

Legislation exists to penalise those responsible and under the Protection of the Environment Operations Act 1997, fines of up to \$400.00 can be imposed for illegally mounting promotional material in public spaces and without authorisation.

But unfortunately, unless a person is caught in the act, it is very difficult for Council to prosecute.

These posters sometimes contain explicit and/or offensive content that cannot be regulated and under the current State law, Council does not have the discretionary power to request their removal from responsible parties.

It is evident that organisations are producing promotional material designed specifically for advertisement on power poles and so I believe an initiative that holds those responsible, accountable for their actions and potentially, even the cost of cleanup would quickly put a stop to this mischievous practice.

Tonight, I ask Councillors to support me in requesting Council staff to write to the NSW Minister for the Environment, the Honourable Robert Stokes MP, to call for a review into the policies currently in place and to allow for more transparent measures to identify those responsible, issue fines and seek the removal of offensive material.

Mayoral Car

For many years now the Councillors Expenses and Facilities Policy provides for the allocation of a Mayoral vehicle as part of the facility provided to the Office of the Mayor. This is also customary for Mayors across local government generally.

Upon being elected Mayor in 2012 however, I took the decision to not accept the Mayoral car. I took this decision as I already had a car and felt the money could be better used as a contribution towards the provision of community programs and services.

The Mayoral vehicle has been historically turned over approximately every 12 months and I am conscious that I don't wish my decision to speak for the circumstances of future Mayors. My choice of declining the vehicle should not be seen as establishing a permanent removal of a Mayoral vehicle, rather, I believe that myself or future Mayors should have the choice to avail themselves of this benefit or otherwise.

This is a decision which I believe should be at the discretion of the Mayor, and be reaffirmed or altered each 12 month period throughout the electoral term.

I also believe that there would be specific community benefit in circumstances where myself or any future Mayor could choose not to accept the Mayoral vehicle or to choose to take a lower cost vehicle if we were to re-allocate the corresponding or remaining budget to an appropriate donation fund for the direct use and support of future community initiatives.

Tonight I seek my fellow Councillors' support for this initiative by affirming the following motion. Accordingly I move that:

The Councillor Expenses and Facilities Policy be amended to permit flexibility for the Mayor of the day to determine whether they obtain access to the Mayoral vehicle or to determine the redistribution of funds allocated for the Mayoral vehicle to the Mayoral Community Benefit Fund.

That Council establish a Mayoral Community Benefit Fund that would enable the Mayor to nominate worthy causes from within the City deserved of financial support which, following Council endorsement, would be drawn from the funds that would otherwise have been expended on a Mayoral vehicle.

Through this process, myself and future Mayors will be given the choice and the opportunity to provide additional funding towards programs and services that would otherwise not be funded through the existing budget allocations. In effect, by not taking the car, any future Mayor is able to directly influence additional money being made available to the community.

It is my intention that following confirmation of this motion, that I will forgo access to the Mayoral vehicle for a further 12 months.
