Re: Planning Proposal to rezone land at Moama

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated 12 April 2010 requesting a Gateway Determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") in respect of the planning proposal to amend the Murray Local Environmental Plan 1989 to rezone land at Nicolas Drive, Moama (Lots 232 and 233 DP 751152) from 1(a) General Rural to 2(v) Village or Urban.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning, I have now determined that the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway Determination.

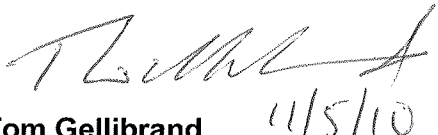
The Gateway Determination requires that the planning proposal be made publicly available for a period of 28 days. Under section 57(2) of the Act, I am satisfied that the planning proposal, when amended as required by the Gateway Determination, is in a form that can be made available for community consultation.

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 9 months of the week following the date of the Gateway Determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the Planning Proposal within four (4) weeks from the week following this determination. Council's request for the Department to draft and finalise the LEP should be made six (6) weeks prior to the projected publication date.

The State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under s54(2)(d) of the EP&A Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.

Gateway Determination

Planning Proposal (Department Ref: PP_2010_MURRA_001_00): to rezone land at Nicolas Drive, Moama (Lots 232 and 233 DP 751152) from 1(a) General Rural to 2(v) Village or Urban.

I, the Deputy Director General, Plan Making & Urban Renewal as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 56(2) of the EP&A Act that an amendment to the Murray Local Environmental Plan 1989 to rezone land at Nicolas Drive, Moama (Lots 232 and 233 DP 751152) from 1(a) General Rural to 2(v) Village or Urban should proceed subject to the following conditions:

1. The public exhibition of the planning proposal shall contain a map which identifies the land as an Urban Release Area and as such a State Public Infrastructure funding clause will apply.
2. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") as follows:
 - (a) the planning proposal is classified as low impact as described in *A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning 2009)* and must be made publicly available for **28 days**; and
 - (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 4.5 of *A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning 2009)*.
3. Consultation is required with the following public authorities under section 56(2)(d) of the EP&A Act:
 - Aboriginal Land Council
 - Department of Community Services
 - Department of Corrective Services
 - Department of Education and Training
 - Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water
 - Department of Housing
 - NSW Rural Fire Service
 - Roads and Traffic Authority

Each public authority is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and any relevant supporting material. Each public authority is to be given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal, or to indicate that they will require additional time to comment on the proposal. Public authorities may request additional information or additional matters to be addressed in the planning proposal.

4. No public hearing is required to be held into the matter under section 56(2)(e) of the EP&A Act. This does not have any bearing on the need to conduct a public hearing under the provisions of any other legislation.
5. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be **9 months** from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
