Planning Proposal to amend Schedule 5 (Environmental Heritage) and the Heritage Map in Wagga Wagga LEP 2010 to correct a number of anomalies.

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated 18 October 2011 requesting a Gateway Determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") in respect of the planning proposal to amend Schedule 5 (Environmental Heritage) and the Heritage Map in Wagga Wagga LEP 2010 to correct a number of anomalies with 91 heritage items.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, I have now determined that the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway Determination.

In regards to the planning proposal's inconsistencies with S117 Direction 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection, Council is to consult with the Commissioner of the NSW Rural Fire Service prior to undertaking community consultation and take into account any comments made as per the requirements of the Local Planning Direction.

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 9 months of the week following the date of the Gateway Determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the Planning Proposal within four (4) weeks from the week following this determination. Council's request for the Department to draft and finalise the LEP should be made six (6) weeks prior to the projected publication date.

The State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under s54(2)(d) of the EP&A Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.

## **Gateway Determination**

Planning Proposal (Department Ref: PP 2011 WAGGA 002 00) to amend Schedule 5 (Environmental Heritage) and the Heritage Map in Wagga Wagga LEP 2010 to correct a number of anomalies

I, the Deputy Director General, Plan Making & Urban Renewal as delegate of the Minister for Planning and Infrastructure, have determined under section 56(2) of the EP&A Act that an amendment to Schedule 5 (Environmental Heritage) and the Heritage Map in Wagga Wagga LEP 2010 to correct a number of anomalies with 91 heritage items, should proceed subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") as follows:
  - the planning proposal must be made publicly available for 28 days; and
  - (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 4.5 of A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning 2009).
- Consultation is required with the following public authorities under section 56(2)(d) of the 2. EP&A Act:
  - Heritage Branch, Office of Environment and Heritage

Each public authority is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and any relevant supporting material. Each public authority is to be given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal, or to indicate that they will require additional time to comment on the proposal. Public authorities may request additional information or additional matters to be addressed in the planning proposal.

- Council is to consult with the Commissioner of the NSW Rural Fire Service prior to 3. undertaking community consultation and take into account any comments made as per the requirements of S117 Direction 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection.
- A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under 4. section 56(2)(e) of the EP&A Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).
- 5. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be 9 months from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
