- If any previously undetected historical archaeological site or relic is unearthed or uncovered, work must cease in the vicinity of that site or relic and advice sought from Council's Heritage Advisor and/or the New South Wales Heritage Office on a suitable course of action.
- 8. All employees and/or contractors engaged in the future redevelopment of the site should be advised that it is an offence under the *Heritage Act 1977* to disturb or excavate a relic.

Mr Khan conducted an Aboriginal cultural heritage assessment to evaluate the likely impact of the proposed development has on the cultural heritage of the land. A scientific survey was carried out at the same time by consulting archaeologists Jillian Comber of Comber Consultants Pty Ltd

Our representatives reports that visibility was poor because ground cover and no Aboriginal cultural material (in the form of stone artefacts, for example) had been found on the surface.

Deerubbin LALC therefore, recommends that further investigations be undertaken with a program of test excavations across the study area.
