BLACK SPOT FUNDING TO BOOST SAFETY

A \$70,000 upgrade to a Mildura roundabout will be among projects to be funded under the Federal Govern-ment's latest Black Spot Program. Minister for infrastructure and Transport Darren Chester will make the announcement in Mildura this morning. Mr Chester will be Joined by Member for Mallee and Victorian Black Sport Consultative Panel chair Andrew Broad at the roundabout at Etiwanda Avenue and Fourteenth Street for the funding announcement. "By fixing and upgrading road

locations where crashes are occurring through safety measures such as traffic signals and roundabouts, we are helping to make our local roads safer for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians," Mr Chester said. Mr Broad said the latest investment in black spot projects would deliver safer roads in 31 local government areas throughout Victoria. "Locally, we'll see \$70,000 from the government go to Mildura Rural City Council to help them upgrade the roundabout at Fourteenth Street and Etiwanda Avenue," he said.

A FOUR to five star tourist accom-modation precinct, covering almost 700ha and comprising resort villas, serviced apartments and holiday homes, has been proposed for Gol

said. "All we're doing at this stage is get-ting the council's approval to get to the next steps of the process." Stakeholders, which include former councillor and Wentworth property developer Bob Wheeldon, believe the resort proposal fits in with the NSW Government's draft strategy for West-ern NSW and its plans to grow and maximise tourism. The proposed development would cover a 679ha site, located just east of the Gol Gol township, stretching from the banks of the Murray River, travers-ing the Sturt Highway and backing on to the Gol Gol Swamp. The proposal is to go before Went-worth Shire Council tomorrow. The development's proponents will request a rezoning of the proposed

site from Primary Production to tour-ism, commercial and mixed use. The business case for the devel-opment stated the land in question "has been sitting dormant for a long time and not contributing to the local economy". The council's health and planning division enlisted the Aurecon Group to complete an independent assessment of the proposal so a "fresh set of eyes" could review the business case. Twenty points of suggestions -mainly to do with planning, economic and employment, and servicing - were recommended by Aurecon so further justification could be given for a large scale development, which the propo-nents responded to. The business case stated commu-nity consultation was proposed and believed a 28-day consultation period was appropriate at later stages of the planning process.

"Constructing new overtaking lanes, as well as improving existing rest areas and building new ones will make the journey safer for truck drivers and all other motorists," Mr Chester said. "The Australian Government's record investment is building crit-ical infrastructure projects such as this, helping prepare for future traffic growth, deliver safer roads and cut travel times and costs for local producers. Every dollar we invest in upgrading roads helps to save lives and reduce serious injuries." Member for Mallee Andrew Broad applauded the extra funding for the Calder Highway and said it was a great result for the residents and industries of the region. "I drive the Calder Highway a lot and I know firsthand how dangerous it can be," Mr Broad said. "This corridor has seen traffic grow by roughly a third over the last five years. "It provides a link to the Hen-ty Highway and supports a lot of freight movement from Sunraysia to south-western Victoria. "Adding these extra overtaking lanes and better rest stops is great for road freight operators and all other motorists." The Australian Government's \$10 million investment will be matched by the Victorian Government.
