The planning proposal be amended prior to exhibition to include maps in accordance with the Department's Technical Guidelines which indicate the removal of the foreshore building line from Map Sheets CL1_005C and CL1_006D; Prior to exhibition, the RPA consult with the Commissioner of the NSW Rural Fire Services. A community consultation period of 28 days is necessary. The Secretary or delegate note that an inconsistency with section 117 direction 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection remains unresolved until the Council consults with the NSW Rural Fire Service; The RPA consult with the Office of Environment and Heritage (Coastal Team) and the State Emergency Services;
	7. The planning proposal is to be completed within 9 months. No written authorisation to exercise delegation should be issued at this stage. Council should be advised to consider obtaining its own legal advice as to the effectiveness /authority of the proposed Development Control Plan provisions.
Supporting Reasons :	This planning proposal is based on thorough research work on coastal hazard issues and is a recognition of the significant coastal hazard in the Coffs Harbour area and ways to mitigate such hazard.
