Dear Mr Lamont,

Planning Proposal (PP_2016_NARRO_001_00) to amend Schedule 5 of *Narromine Local Environmental Plan 2011* to identify a Fowler steam engine as a moveable heritage item

I am writing in response to Council's request for a Gateway determination in respect of the planning proposal to amend Schedule 5 of *Narromine Local Environmental Plan 2011* to identify a Fowler steam engine as a local (moveable) heritage item.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning, I have now determined the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway determination (**Attachment 1**).

I note that Council has resolved to make a submission to the Heritage Council for heritage listing of the steam engine on the State Heritage Register. Council is required to consult with the Office of Environment and Heritage to confirm whether the steam engine is to be identified as an item of 'local' or 'state' heritage significance under Schedule 5 of the Narromine LEP 2011.

I have also agreed that the planning proposal is consistent with section 117 Direction 2.3 Heritage Conservation and no further work or approval is required.

The Minister has delegated plan-making powers to Councils in October 2012. It is noted that Council has requested to be issued with delegation for this planning proposal. I have considered the nature of the planning proposal and have decided to issue an authorisation for Council to exercise delegation to make this plan (**Attachment 2**).

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 9 months of the week following the date of the Gateway determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the planning proposal as soon as possible. The request to draft and finalise the LEP should be made directly to Parliamentary Counsel's Office (parliamentary.counsel@pco.nsw.gov.au) 10 weeks prior to the projected publication date.

A copy of the request should be forwarded to the Department of Planning and Environment (westerregion@planning.nsw.gov.au) for administrative purposes.

There is no requirement for LEP maps and GIS data in this case.

State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete the LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under section 54(2)(d) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* if the time frames outlined in the determination are not met.

In accordance with 'A guide for the preparation of local environmental plans' - attachment 5 Delegated plan making reporting template (**Attachment 3**) is enclosed for Council's information. Table 2 of the attachment is to be completed and included in Council's section 59 submission and forwarded to westernregion@planning.nsw.gov.au when requesting the planning proposal to be finalised.

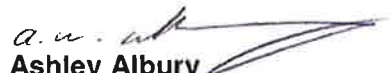
Gateway Determination

Planning proposal (Department Ref: PP_2016_NARRO_001_00): to amend Schedule 5 of the Narromine Local Environmental Plan 2011 to identify a Fowler steam engine as a moveable heritage item.

I, the Director Regions, Western at Department of Planning and Environment as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 56(2) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (EP&A Act) to amend Schedule 5 of the Narromine Local Environmental Plan 2011 to identify a Fowler steam engine as an item of moveable heritage, should proceed subject to the following conditions:

1. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the EP&A Act as follows:
 - (a) The planning proposal is required to be made publicly available on exhibition for 28 days as described in A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning and Infrastructure 2013).
 - (b) The relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of A Guide to Preparing LEPs.
2. Consultation is required with the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) under section 56(2)(d) of the EP&A Act. OEH is to be provided with a copy of the planning proposal and any relevant supporting material, and given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal.
3. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 56(2)(e) of the EP&A Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).
4. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be 9 months from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
