Murrumbidgee Local Environmental Plan 2013 - Amendment No. 1

Heritage listing of Toganmain Woolshed

Part Lot 1, DP750901, Sturt Highway, Darlington Point

Gateway Determination

At the Ordinary Council meeting held on Tuesday 26 June 2018, Murrumbidgee Council resolved to endorse Amendment No. 1 to the *Murrumbidgee Local Environmental Plan 2013* ("the LEP") and forward a copy of the Planning Proposal (enclosed) to the NSW Department of Planning & Environment requesting the issuing of a Gateway Determination.

More specifically, the Planning Proposal seeks to include the Toganmain Woolshed building located on land described as Part Lot 1, DP750901, Sturt Highway, Darlington Point within Schedule 5 of the LEP as a local heritage item.

The attached Planning Proposal has been prepared in accordance with Section 3.33 of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (EP&A Act) and the Department of Planning's *A Guide to Preparing Planning Proposals* and *A Guide to Preparing Local Environmental Plans*.

Accordingly, Murrumbidgee Council requests a Gateway Determination on the Planning Proposal from the Minister for Planning in accordance with Section 3.34 of the EP&A Act. Please find enclosed a copy of the Council resolution and Planning Proposal report.

It is also requested that Murrumbidgee Council receive written authorisation to exercise delegation and the functions of the Minister for Planning under section 3.36 of the EP&A Act.

Murrumbidgee Council considers the Planning Proposal to be a 'low impact proposal' for the purposes of public exhibition and would be seeking a public exhibition period for a minimum of 14 days only, due to the positive social and economic impacts of the proposal and the need to avoid any further delays in applying for heritage grant funding opportunities.
