Planning proposal to amend Lismore Local Environmental Plan 2012

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated 28 April 2016 requesting a Gateway determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 (the Act) in respect of the planning proposal to amend Schedule 1 of the Lismore Local Environmental Plan 2012 to permit an industrial land use within the south eastern corner of 354 Broadwater Road, Dungarubba (Lot 2 DP 8877) to enable the manufacturing of concrete fence posts for a period of 5 years.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning, I have now determined the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway determination.

I have also agreed, as delegate of the Secretary, the planning proposal's inconsistencies with S117 Directions 4.1 Acid Sulfate Soils, 4.3 Flood Prone Land and 6.3 Site Specific Provisions are of minor significance. No further approval is required in relation to these Directions.

Plan making powers were delegated to councils by the Minister in October 2012. It is noted that Council has now accepted this delegation. I have considered the nature of Council's planning proposal and have decided to issue an authorisation for Council to exercise delegation to make this plan.

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 6 months of the week following the date of the Gateway determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the planning proposal as soon as possible. Council's request to draft and finalise the LEP should be made directly to Parliamentary Counsel's Office 6 weeks prior to the projected publication date. A copy of the request should be forwarded to the Department of Planning and Environment for administrative purposes.

The State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under section 54(2)(d) of the Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.

Gateway Determination

Planning proposal (Department Ref: PP_2016_LIMSO_005_001): to amend Schedule 1 of the Lismore Local Environmental Plan 2012 to permit an industrial land use within the south eastern corner of 354 Broadwater Road, Dungarubba (Lot 2 DP 8877) to enable the manufacturing of concrete fence posts for a period of 5 years.

I, the Director Regions, Northern at the Department of Planning and Environment as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 56(2) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act) that an amendment to the Lismore Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2012 to amend Schedule 1 to permit an industrial land use within the south eastern corner of 354 Broadwater Road, Dungarubba (Lot 2 DP 8877) to enable the manufacturing of concrete fence posts for a period of 5 years should proceed subject to the following conditions:

1. Prior to public exhibition the Planning Proposal and draft Additional Permitted Uses Map be amended to reflect that it applies only to the 2ha south eastern corner part of Lot 2, DP 8877.
2. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Act as follows:
 - (a) the planning proposal is classified as low impact as described in *A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning and Infrastructure 2013)* and must be made publicly available for a minimum of **14 days**;
 - (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of *A Guide to Preparing LEPs (Department of Planning and Infrastructure 2013)*; and
 - (c) Any mapping material must meet the specifications in the current *Standard Technical Requirements for Spatial Datasets and Maps* (Department of Planning and Environment 2015).
3. No consultation is required with public authorities under section 56(2)(d) of the Act
4. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 56(2)(e) of the Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).

5. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be **6 months** from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
