MINUTES FROM THE MAYOR

⁵² Vale Douglas Holleley - last World War Two veteran of the 18th Battalion (Ku-ring-gai Regiment)

File: CY00455/4 *Vide: MM.1*

It is my sad duty to advise my Councillor colleagues and the Ku-ring-gai community of the passing of the last surviving member of the 18th Battalion (Ku-ring-gai Regiment) who served in World War Two.

Mr Douglas Holleley was a longstanding resident of Pymble, having settled in Hamilton Parade in 1955 and having lived there with his wife Mary until early this year.

Douglas' connection with the 18th Battalion was forged early in the war, when he enlisted and underwent basic training with the Ku-ring-gai Regiment. Unfortunately he was badly injured during this training, to such an extent that he was hospitalised for around two years. However this did not dim his willingness to serve his country, and he finally began active service with the regiment in 1941 until his demobilisation in 1946. Due to his training accident, Douglas was unable to serve on the front line but performed a valuable and testing task guarding POWs in the Pacific islands north of Papua New Guinea.

After the war, Douglas trained as an accountant with Price Waterhouse, eventually setting up his own accountancy firm which traded successfully until his retirement. Once retired, Douglas devoted himself to keeping the historical memory of the 18th Battalion alive. He was President for 10 years of the Battalion's Association, organising events and researching the history of Battalion members. He was also Patron of the Battalion's Rifle Club. Douglas worked closely with Ku-ring-gai Council to help preserve the Battalion's historic buildings at St Ives Showground. The Battalion occupied the site for the duration of World War Two and a considerable number of concrete platforms and brick buttresses can still be seen today where wash houses, mess huts and the battalion headquarters once stood. His passing marks the watershed moment in the Battalion's history, made more poignant by the commemoration of the Centenary of ANZAC between 2014 and 2018.

Douglas was a devoted and loving husband to his wife Mary. He sadly passed away on the day of their 68th wedding anniversary. He is lovingly remembered by Mary and his three sons Douglas, David and Robert and their families.

May he rest in peace.
