

Garden Type	Description
1 - Communal Garden	Central open space with shared open lawn and smaller garden beds for residents use. Components: Open turf area Low mass planting: Deciduous tree: <i>Liriodendron tulipifera</i> Individual beds for residents use
2 - Ornamental Gravel Garden	Combining a ground surface of gravel and ornamental rocks with mass planting and feature deciduous trees. Components: Gravel Feature rocks in range sizes Timber bench Deciduous feature tree: <i>Magnolia sp.</i> <i>Acer palmatum</i> <i>Prunus sp.</i> Shade mass planting: <i>Plectranthus argenteus</i> <i>Viola hederacea</i> <i>Anthropodium cirratum</i>
3 - Fern Garden	Located in shaded areas of site, creates lush areas of an intimate scale to walk through. Components: Groundcover: <i>Dichondra repens</i> Shrubs: <i>Adiantum aestivum</i> <i>Asplenium nidus</i> <i>Plectranthus argenteus</i> <i>Cleranthe oppositifolia</i> <i>Anthropodium cirratum</i> Trees: <i>Cyathea cooperi</i> <i>Dioscorea antarctica</i> <i>Glochidion ferdinandi</i>
4 - Kitchen/ Sensory Garden	Productive communal gardens of herbs, seasonal vegetables and citrus trees. Raised planters along paths provide easy access for all users and create a sensory experience when travelling through. Components: Gravel path Precast paver steppers Herbs: <i>Salvia officinalis</i> <i>Lavandula</i> <i>Cymbopogon citratus</i> <i>Rosmarinus officinalis</i> <i>Thymus vulgaris</i> Trees: <i>Citrus limetta</i> <i>Citrus sinensis</i>
5 - Screen Planting	Located in areas of the site with privacy requirements can act as a screen for walls, courtyards and level changes. Components: <i>Leptospermum flavescens</i> 'Cardwell' <i>Elaeagnus eumundi</i> <i>Grevillea Moonlight</i> <i>Osmanthus fragrans</i>
6 - Wild Garden	Located at the southern boundary of the site, the area provides a level entrance to the apartments through a wild garden of groundcovers, mixed deciduous and evergreen trees and open lawn areas. Components: Timber seats Turf Groundcovers: <i>Dichondra repens</i> <i>Hardenbergia violacea</i> <i>Wahlenbergia communis</i> <i>Anemone x hybrida</i> <i>Viola hederacea</i> Grasses: <i>Dianella caerulea</i> <i>Themeda australis</i> <i>Lomandra 'Erindale'</i> Shrubs: <i>Gaura rubroidea</i> <i>Hebe pimeleoides</i> 'Quicksilver' <i>Westringia muniti</i> Trees: <i>Syncarpia glomulifera</i> <i>Glochidion ferdinandi</i> <i>Flindersia australis</i> <i>Magnolia sp. (deciduous)</i>
7 - Woodland Garden	Forming the transition gardens between the street and inner courtyards. Tall trees with grass underplanting create shaded spaces to move through. Components: Turf Grasses: <i>Themeda australis</i> <i>Imperata cylindrica</i> <i>Poa</i> <i>Lomandra 'Erindale'</i> Trees: <i>Eucalyptus sideroxylon</i> <i>Eucalyptus leucosylon</i>
