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## Introduction

The purpose of this Planning Proposal is to update Schedule 5 Environmental Heritage of Bathurst Regional Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014. The Planning Proposal aims to consider heritage listing the following items:

- a) 62 Seymour Street, Bathurst as an example of a Colonial Period dwelling.
- Increase the curtilage of the existing heritage listed Agricultural Research Station to include all buildings associated with the early Government research station.
- c) The gantry crane located on Bathurst Railway Station lands not currently included on heritage listed lands.
- d) 13 natural landscapes as recommended by the Bathurst Region Heritage Study 2007 including:
  - Abercrombie Caves Caves Road, Abercrombie River
  - Winburndale Nature Reserve Winburndale Dam Road, Napoleon Reef
  - Copperhannia Nature Reserve Colo Road, Trunkey Creek
  - Stevens Park and Weir Budden Street and Peppers Creek, Rockley
  - Wattle Flat Heritage Lands Wattle Flat
  - Trunkey Creek Memorial Park Arthur Street, Trunkey Creek
  - Devil's Marbles 2396 Ophir Road, Rock Forest
  - Macquarie Woods Cashens Lane, Vittoria
  - Lions Club Drive Trees Lions Club Drive, Kelso
  - Beyer's Avenue Trees Beyer's Avenue, Hill End
  - Wallaby Rocks 557 Hill End Road, Sofala
  - Victoria Park Howick Street, Bathurst

- e) Include more descriptive property addresses for several currently listed heritage items.

The Planning Proposal will not involve a review of the existing heritage items currently under Schedule 5 of the LEP.

If the Planning Panel so determines, Council will accept the delegated functions offered to it pursuant to Section 59 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979.

The Planning Proposal has been prepared in accordance with Section 55 of *the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act) and the relevant Department of Planning Guidelines, including *A Guide to Preparing Local Environmental Plans* and *A Guide to Preparing Planning Proposals*.

## Part 1 Objectives or intended outcomes

#### 1.1 Introduction

The purpose of this Planning Proposal is to update Schedule 5 Environmental Heritage of Bathurst Regional Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014. The Planning Proposal aims to consider heritage listing the following:

a) 62 Seymour Street, Bathurst as an example of a Colonial Period dwelling.

Council has a long established set of criteria for assessing the contribution of a building to the streetscape. This is known as the Bathurst Conservation Area Management Strategy (BCAMS).Council uses this information during the development assessment process.

Council officers, in conjunction with its Heritage Advisor, undertook a review of the BCAMS listing of the buildings within the Bathurst City, West Bathurst and Kelso Heritage Conservation Areas. As part of the review a visual inspection was undertaken to ascertain the approximate age of the building and how the building contributes to the streetscape. It should be noted that the age of the building is based on a visual inspection, identifying building features that represent a period of construction.

As part of this process it was found that of the 6 colonial properties identified in the Heritage Conservation Area, 62 Seymour Street is the only property without heritage listing. The Planning Proposal aims to rectify this to ensure all 6 colonial properties identied under BCAMS are heritage listed.

b) Increase the curtilage of the existing heritage listed Agricultural Research Station to include all buildings associated with the early Government research station.

The Bathurst Experiment Farm of the New South Wales Department of Agriculture was established in 1895. It consisted of a dryland farming section on the slopes of Mount Panorama and an irrigated farming section on the banks of the Macquarie River, and supported a farm school which was conducted intermittently between 1897 and 1941. The buildings were built 1902 - 1909, designed by NSW Govt. Architect Walter Liberty Vernon, as part of 'Experiment Farm', later became the Bathurst Agricultural Research Station.

c) The gantry crane located on Bathurst Railway Station lands not currently included on heritage listed lands.

This 25-ton gantry crane is a 'moveable' item of local significance being a rare and intact example of a large railway workshop crane. The crane was constructed in 1918 at the wagon repair siding to lift defective wagon (according to information within the 2002 SHI by Simpson Dawbin). It belonged to the 1880s Bathurst Locomotive Workshops since demolished, leaving it an isolated object / industrial relic on the far north-west corner of the Fabrication Yard.

It is a well-known local landmark, being clearly visible from the Rocket Street Bridge and strongly associated with the former railway workshops and a relic from Bathurst's industrial past. Research by Sydney Trains suggests that 25-ton gantry cranes are rare, possibly no others still exist with 25-tons being a large crane.

- d) 13 natural landscapes as recommended by the Bathurst Region Heritage Study 2007 including:
  - Abercrombie Caves Caves Road, Abercrombie River
  - Winburndale Nature Reserve Winburndale Dam Road, Napoleon Reef
  - Copperhannia Nature Reserve Colo Road, Trunkey Creek
  - Stevens Park and Weir Budden Street and Peppers Creek, Rockley
  - Wattle Flat Heritage Lands Wattle Flat
  - Trunkey Creek Memorial Park Arthur Street, Trunkey Creek
  - Devil's Marbles 2396 Ophir Road, Rock Forest
  - Macquarie Woods Cashens Lane, Vittoria
  - Lions Club Drive Trees Lions Club Drive, Kelso
  - Beyer's Avenue Trees Beyer's Avenue, Hill End
  - Wallaby Rocks 557 Hill End Road, Sofala
  - Victoria Park Howick Street, Bathurst
  - Centennial Park Bentinck Street, Bathurst.

The Bathurst Regional Heritage Study 2007 identified the above list of natural landscapes/features be listed as individual heritage items. The places were recommended to be items within the Bathurst Regional Local Environmental Plan 2014 but were subsequently removed at the preparation of the instrument from direction from the Department of Planning.

e) Include more descriptive property addresses for several currently listed heritage items.

Several existing heritage items within Schedule 5 have a very limited property description. It is proposed to include greater property information on these items to make them more easily identifiable. This is particularly relevant for heritage items in the road reserve (such as Council's bridge assets). The current description only identifies the road reserve which is very difficult to search. It is proposed to identify these items in the road reserve by indicating the nearest adjoining Lot and DP. Additionally, some update of Lot and DP details is required as subdivision has occurred and a new title created.

The Planning Proposal will not involve a review of the existing heritage items currently under Schedule 5 of the LEP.

## 1.2 The subject land

The subject lands affected by the Planning Proposal are indicated in Part 2.

## Part 2 Explanation of Provisions

#### 2.1 Introduction

The Schedule 5 Environmental Heritage Planning Proposal involves an amendment to the Bathurst Regional Local Environmental Plan 2014 ("the LEP"), to include additional items in Part 1 of Schedule 5.

This is to be achieved by:

a) Amending Part 1 of Schedule 5 of the Bathurst Regional LEP 2014 to include the following:

## PART 3 Justification

#### Section A – Need for the Planning Proposal

1. Is the Planning Proposal a result of any strategic study or report?

Yes. The Bathurst Regional Heritage Study 2007 identified several natural landscapes/features be listed as individual heritage items. Another recommendation of that report was to continue to review and update heritage items where more information comes to light about places that illustrate history and significance; this is the case for the Research Station, 62 Seymour Street and the Gantry Crane.

Council has subsequently resolved on 3 February 2016 to prepare a planning proposal to reclassify the subject land.

It is proposed that the Planning Proposal will be publically notified by:

- a) a notice in the Western Advocate newspaper on at least 2 occasions; and
- b) written notification to all landowners affected by the Planning Proposal; and
- c) notification on Council's website.

Council will notify the relevant government public authorities concurrently with the public exhibition period with respect to the Planning Proposal.

Following the public exhibition period, this section will be altered to reflect the extent of consultation that was undertaken, including any issues which were raised as a result of the consultation.

Located 289 km west of Sydney and 72 km south of Bathurst, Abercrombie Caves are the most accessible cave system in New South Wales.

This particularly attractive collection of limestone caves offer the usual array of stalagmites and stalactites. There is a river with a couple of particularly beautiful pools and the caves themselves have an array of columns and shawls with names like 'Hall of Terpischore', 'Angel's Harp', 'Plum Pudding' and 'Diamond Cascade'.

The local Aborigines, the Burra Burra group who were part of the larger Wiradjuri tribe, knew of the caves although, interestingly, there have been no artifacts found in the Arch Cave, (However Bill Allen a local aboriginal , has mentioned the remains of an Aboriginal were found and were dated at approximately 10,000 years old. Apparently the hands and feet had been amputated and the male was left to die in the cave). In 1977 a research team found stone tools and animal bones (some from extinct animals) in a shelter north of the Great Arch.

There is some doubt as to who was the first European to see the Arch Cave. As early as 1821 the Sydney Gazette reported that 'a cave of considerable dimensions has been recently discovered in the neighbourhood of Bathurst' although, at the time, there was no confirmation that this report referred to Abercrombie Caves.

Throughout the 1830s people from the surrounding properties would visit the main cave and by the 1840s it was a popular visiting place. A survey was carried out in 1842. The Sydney Morning Herald reported on a visit to the caves in 1843 and the immensely gifted artist, Conrad Martens, arrived and made a number of sketches in May, 1843.

The discovery of gold in the area in the 1850s (Tuena - 1851, Mount Grey - 1854) resulted in a huge increase in visitors to the caves. In 1860 the miners at Mount Grey built the first stage in the Arch Cave. It was replaced in 1880 and the replacement is still used occasionally today.

The discovery of gold also meant a dramatic increase in bushranging in the district and, once again, the caves became a popular retreat when bushrangers were being chased. In his book 'The Abercrombie Caves', author Geoff Bates claims 'It is believed that Ben Hall and his gang (including Frank Gardiner and John O'Meally) spent considerable time at the caves in the years 1863 to 1865.'

By 1870 the caves were popular with visitors from Sydney and by 1888 a temporary keeper was employed to look after the caves which were suffering from graffiti and vandals. By 1895 more than 1000 people a year were visiting the caves.

Winburndale Nature Reserve is dominated by a major ridge system running in an east and north-east direction. The ridge system is the remains of an eroded plateau, which now forms rocky slopes from the ridgetops to the watercourses and creeks.

The change in vegetation association on these portions reflects the diverse habitats over the altitudinal and geographical range. There are stands of snow gum at Mt. Horrible, while at locations slightly less exposed, snow gum-mountain gum association occurs. At lower altitudes the eucalyptus association can be mountain gum, broad and narrow leaved peppermint and Red Stringybark. On the cooler slopes, red stringybark becomes dominant. On the western slopes, scribbly gum is very common, often in conjunction with a slate strewn ground surface. The gullies, as well as containing several species of tall-growing acacias, harbour a wet sclerophyll vegetation and include such eucalypt species as rough barked manna gum, brown barrel and apple box. At the lowest altitudes red box and yellow box occur. The vulnerable capertee stringybark is found on the midslopes within the Nature Reserve.

The diverse vegetation communities provides a habitat for a number of animals, including four species of macropod, a wide range of arboreal mammals, wombats, echidnas, a variety of bird and reptile species and the Purple Copper Butterfly, one of the rarest species of butterfly in Australia. This species is endemic to NSW and depends upon blackthorn, an understorey plant species, for survival. Both quolls and Koalas have been recorded in the past.

The National Park area was proclaimed a nature reserve on 21 April 1972 with an original size of 2,529.34ha. To date there have been three additions of land, on 14 December 1979 (714ha), 19 December 1980 (251ha) and 22 October 2004 (2.95ha) which have increased the total area reserved to 3,497ha.

The original nature reserve was made up of unreserved Crown Land and the Copperhannia Trigonometric Station Reserve 20857. Subsequent reserved lands included a Public Utility Reserve 73568, a Special Purpose Lease 12117, Crown Lease 1976/1 and a Crown Reserve R95544 that incorporated both a Mining Lease (506) and Gold Lease (10). The nature reserve ranges in elevation from 500m along the western edge of the reserve at Hells Hole and Rocky Bridge Creeks' to 966m at the Copperhannia Geodetic Trigonometric Station.

Historic Heritage

Six historic sites have been found in the reserve and consist of one mine shaft, four modified survey trees with scar markings and one cave. Three off-park sites are located along the boundary of the reserve and these consist of modified survey trees, two of which have portion details carved into the scar.

The mine shaft was part of Crown Lease R95544 and was associated with a mining lease area MLA 506 Gold Lease G10) where gold bearing quartz was extracted. Given the proximity of the mine shaft to Arkell Ridge Road, the mine was capped in June 2002 by NPWS staff.

There is anecdotal evidence that, a rugged mountain range within the catchment of the Wyangala Dam. John Piesley and perhaps also the Bushranger John Vane. The remains of a hut that is said to have been utilised by the bushrangers, their associates and families is believed to exist in the reserve but remains undiscovered to date.
