Intent of draft LEP:

Retain the core structure of the existing commercial office building and redevelop as a refurbished commercial building with new additions including new floor space, atrium and event space.

The above redevelopment will be facilitated through the insertion of a site-specific clause into the LEP to increase maximum building height to 25 metres and maximum FSR of 4:1 for a compliant commercial scheme only.

Additional Supporting Points/Information:

Commercial office use is being retained on the site, located in close proximity to Central Sydney, contributing to the retention of creative and high value employment uses in Surry Hills.

Significant ESD benefits from the proposed design including embodied carbon retention, removal of all onsite car parking and NABERS 6 star rating.

Proposal will encourage use of active and public transport connections due to proximity to these networks, i.e. Central Station, light rail and bicycle paths.
