Hi David,

Thank you for the help. One of the issues we've come across is the permissibility of secondary dwellings. Council mentions in its proposal that following consultation with NSW RFS and Police, secondary dwellings do not pose a great evacuation risk. This is what resulted in the change from the proposed zoning of E3, to E4 zoning (which permits secondary dwellings with development consent).

I was seeking any written advice(email/letter) from RFS to the effect that they don't pose a great evacuation risk. Council provided the attached minutes from 24 July 2013 following the exhibition of the draft KLEP 2013. The meeting was held with Council staff and representatives from the NSW RFS and Police. However it isn't too clear regarding RFS's position on secondary dwellings.

• Currently, secondary dwellings (through the SEPP for Affordable Housing) are permitted, subject to development consent, in the deferred areas.

• The proposed zoning, E4 Environmental Living, would also permit secondary dwellings (subject to development consent).

In effect, the proposed new zoning would maintain the status quo of what is already permissible regarding secondary dwellings. As is consistent with RFS's previous advice, are you satisfied to maintain the status quo regarding secondary dwellings?
