The Planning Proposal be revised to include an accurate reference to Local Planning Direction 7.1 (Implementation of the Metropolitan Plan for Sydney 2036) and demonstrate consistency of the Planning Proposal with the Metropolitan Plan for Sydney 2036. The reference to 'Attachment A' included on page 12 of the Planning Proposal should be also be revised to read 'Attachment E';</li> <li>3. The Planning Proposal be exhibited for 20 days;</li> <li>4. The Planning Proposal be completed within 6 months;</li> <li>5. Council note that the Director General is to be satisfied that the summary (the material to be exhibited) provides sufficient details for community consultation. Council is to be requested to provide this summary to the Director General as required under section 57(2) of the Environmental Planning &amp; Assessment Act 1979; and that</li> <li>6. 6. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be 6 months from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
