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Gateway Determination

Planning Proposal (Department Ref: PP_2017_SYDNE_007_00): for the Sydney Metro Martin Place Station Precinct.

I, the Acting Deputy Secretary, Planning Services at the Department of Planning and Environment as delegate of the Greater Sydney Commission, have determined under section 56(2) of the *Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979* (the Act) that an amendment to the Sydney Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2012 should proceed subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Prior to community consultation, the urban design study and Planning Proposal are to be revised to:
 - (a) provide further justification for why the proposal would create a better design outcome than the current planning controls.
 - (b) how the proposal will protect and enhance Martin Place's civic and ceremonial functions;
 - (c) how the proposal will protect and enhance pedestrian amenity, heritage, existing sunlight and wind conditions, important vistas including view of the sky and building scale for Martin Place, Elizabeth Street, Hunter Street, Castlereagh St, as well as Richard Johnson and Chifley Squares; and
 - (d) address the recommendations of the *Martin Place, area of special* significance : proposal for Urban Design Development Controls (1993) prepared by Denton Corker Marshall Pty Ltd for the City of Sydney Council.

The revised urban design study and Planning Proposal must be submitted to the Department for review and approval.

- 2. Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Act as follows:
 - (a) the Planning Proposal must be made publicly available for a minimum of **28** days; and
 - (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of Planning Proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with Planning Proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of *A Guide to Preparing Local Environmental Plans* (Department of Planning and Environment 2016).
- 3. Consultation is required with the following public authorities under section 56(2)(d) of the Act and/or to comply with the requirements of relevant section 117 Directions:
 - Transport for NSW;
 - Office of the Government Architect;
 - Infrastructure NSW;

- Office of Environment & Heritage;
- Roads and Maritime Services;
- Department of Infrastructure and Regional Development;
- Sydney Airport Corporation;
- Civil Aviation Safety Authority;
- Airservices Australia;
- City of Sydney Council;
- The Greater Sydney Commission;
- Ausgrid; and
- Sydney Water.

Each public authority is to be provided with a copy of the Planning Proposal and any relevant supporting material, and given at least 21 days to comment on the proposal.

- 4. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 56(2)(e) of the Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example, in response to a submission or if reclassifying land).
- 5. The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be **9 months** from the week following the date of the Gateway determination.
