e) List any other matters that need to be considered: The objective of Section 117 Direction - 2.3 Heritage Conservation is to conserve items, areas, objects and places of environmental heritage significance and indigenous heritage significance.

The planning proposal involves the inclusion of 10 State Heritage items previously excluded in error from the Warringah LEP 2011. This is of minor significance and does not require the Director General's approval.

In relation to the 2 local items proposed for deletion, Council has identified that these items have been modified significantly over time and no longer warrant listing.

In relation to the 3 local items proposed to be modified, Council proposes to expand their listing to include significant vegetation considered endangered under the

Threatened Species Conservation Act 1995 (TSCA 1995). This is of minor significance and does not require the Director General's approval.

Overall, the proposed changes are considered to be minor inconsistencies and do not require the Director General's approval.

Comments in relation to Principal LEP:

The Warringah Comprehensive LEP 2011 was made in December 2011. The planning proposal aims to correct anomalies, make amendments and include new Heritage items in the Warringah LEP 2011 by amending Schedule 5 and the relevant Heritage Maps.

Assessment Criteria

Need for planning proposal :

This planning proposal is a direct result of recommendations of the Warringah Community Based Heritage Review (WCBHR), which was completed in February 2013.

The review of existing heritage items in the WCBHR identified anomalies and errors in the current Heritage list.

Council invited the community to nominate new listings between 9 April 2011 and 29 April 2011. In response, 69 submissions were received and over 100 properties were nominated.

All nominations were assessed in accordance with the criteria contained within the NSW Heritage publication "Assessing Heritage Significance". Council also used heritage specialists on its Warringah Heritage Panel to assess each nomination and determine whether or not it met the criteria for heritage listing.

The nomination/assessment process resulted in the recommendation to - list fifteen (15) new local heritage items;

- expand the existing listing of three (3) items; and
- remove two (2) existing local items.

On 26 March 2013, Council resolved to remove one recommended item and modify another, leaving a final list of (14) new local heritage items.

A planning proposal is necessary to implement these changes.

Consistency with strategic planning framework:

The planning proposal is consistent with the objectives and actions of the draft North East Subregion Strategy, the Metropolitan Plan for Sydney 2036 and the draft Metropolitan Strategy for Sydney 2031.

Warringah Council has advised that the planning proposal is consistent with its Strategic Community Plan 2012 in that updating the heritage list was a listed action for the 2012-2016 period

Environmental social economic impacts :

Council has advised that the planning proposal will likely have no affect on threatened species, populations or ecological communities or their habitats.

There is also unlikely to be any environmental effects as a result of the planning proposal.

Council has advised that the social benefits related to the preservation of European heritage and identifying how Warringah has changed is the key purpose of the planning proposal.

Council has also advised that the economic effects will be minimal. The development potential of the listed properties will be affected; however council acknowledges that this does not prohibit development.
