External Supporting Notes :	During the exhibition of draft Warringah LEP 2009, Warringah Council received correspondence from the (then) Department of Environment, Climate Change and Water (DECCW) which raised concerns in relation to the Warringah Land Zoning Map and the correct identification of National Parks and Reserve areas.
	On 28 August 2012, Warringah Council resolved to prepare a planning proposal to accurately record boundaries of National Parks within the LGA. The planning proposal was created in coordination with Warringah Council, Crown Lands and National Parks and

Wildlife Service (NP&WS).

The matter to correct the National Park boundaries was separated from other proposals because it required sufficient time to accurately research land parcels and liaise with relevant stakeholders.

Comment : The statement of objectives advises that the planning proposal is to reconcile: 1. parcels of land that should be zoned E1 National Parks and Natural Reserves but currently are not so zoned; and 2. parcels of land that are currently zoned E1 National Parks and Natural Reserves and should not be so zoned.

Comment :

The explanation of provisions is considered to be adequate.

The planning proposal is an amendment to the Warringah LEP 2011 to rezone multiple parcels of land. The land is numbered on the index map on page 6 of Attachment 1 - Planning Proposal.

The proposed changes to the affected parcels of land, which include amending the Land Zoning Map, Lot Size Map and Height of Buildings Map, can be found between pages 7 to 26 in Attachment 1 - Planning Proposal, which includes extracts from the Land Zoning Maps.

	Council has not mentioned any other SEPPs as relevant to the proposal. Council should refer to SEPP (Infrastructure) 2007 as certain land parcels include SP2 Infrastructure zone access roads and SEPP 71 - Coastal Protection as some land parcels are close or include waterways as boundaries.

If No, explain :	It is noted that large parcels of land to be rezoned E1 are located in Bushfire prone land areas. Council has not identified 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection as a Direction for consideration, but has stipulated SEPP No19 - Bushland in Urban Areas as being
	relevant to the proposal.
	Inconsistencies have not been adequately justified and further consideration as per conditions above maybe required.

Comment :	The maps are not considered to be adequate as they do not clearly indicate current and proposed provisions including land use zoning, floor space ratio, height of buildings and minimum lot size. The maps should be prepared before exhibition to clearly indicate these current and proposed controls.

Comment :	Council proposes to exhibit the planning proposal for 28 days.
	Council has advised that it will advertise the planning proposal in the local newspaper and on the Council's website at the start of the exhibition period. Council will also exhibit the planning proposal for a period of 28 days from the date it appears in the newspaper. Council further advises it will notify affected land and owners of adjoining properties.
	Council intends to consult with Crown Lands and NP&WS as they are the majority land owners and will be most affected by the proposed changes. Council should also consult with the Office of Environment and Heritage, NSW Rural Fire Service, Sydney Water and RMS as boundary changes and rezoning affect land and waterways under administration of these organisations.

The planning proposal be amended by: a) the 'Statement of Objectives' should advise the planning proposal aims to correct errors and anomalies in the WLEP 2011 with the Land Zoning Maps, Lot Size Maps and Height of Buildings Maps to reconcile parcels of land and redefine boundaries relevant to the National Parks and Wildlife Service; and
	b) including maps which are consistent with WLEP 2011 format clearly showing current and existing Land Zoning, Lot Size, Height of Buildings and Floor Space Ratio controls

	for all affected land parcels.
	5. Council should consider Section 117 Directions 2.2 Coastal Protection, 2.3 Heritage Conservation, 3.4 Integrating Land Use and Transport, 4.1 Acid Sulphate Soils and 4.4 Planning for Bushfire Protection which may be of relevance to the planning proposal.
	6. Inconsistencies with Section 117 Directions 2.1 Environment Protection Zones and 4.3 Flood Prone Land are considered to be of minor significance and the Director General's approval to proceed under this Delegation is granted. No further consideration of Section 117 Directions is required.
	7. Consultation is required with Office of Environment and Heritage, Department of Trade and Investment - Crown Lands, NSW Rural Fire Service, Sydney Water and Transport for NSW - Roads and Maritime Services.
	8. No further studies are required to be undertaken.
Supporting Reasons :	The proposal should be allowed to proceed as it updates zoning on Maps and corrects errors with boundary lines for land parcels related to National Parks and Wildlife Services in the Warringah LEP 2011.
