Council has prepared the planning proposal to enable listing of the subject site as an item of local heritage significance in Schedule 5 of Leichhardt LEP 2013. Council has commissioned two heritage studies, one to support the interim heritage order, and secondly, a report to support the planning proposal, which verify that the site is of local significance and worthy of heritage listing.

Assessment Criteria

Need for planning proposal:

Council initiated the planning proposal in response to a pre-development assessment application received for the subject site, which proposes demolition of the existing

structures and the erection of new residential development.

Council resolved to make an interim heritage order (IHO), which was published in the NSW Government Gazette on 27 September 2013. The IHO was supported by a preliminary heritage assessment.

Following the IHO, Council commissioned a further detailed heritage study to support the planning proposal, which confirms the site exhibits many characteristics of a heritage item.

Consistency with strategic planning framework:

The proposal is consistent with the objectives of the Metropolitan Plan for Sydney 2036 and draft Metropolitan Strategy for Sydney 2031 in that it seeks to protect places of special cultural, social and community value.
