Re: Planning Proposal to allow for a clustered rural residential proposal of up to 30 lots at 8360 Monaro Highway, Royalla (Lots 1 & 2 DP 456367, Lot 2 DP 131294 and Lot 1 DP 1067259)

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated 15 September 2009 requesting a Gateway Determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ('EP&A Act') in respect of the planning proposal to amend Yarrowlumla Local Environmental Plan 2002 to allow for a clustered rural residential proposal of up to 30 lots at 8360 Monaro Highway, Royalla.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning, I have now issued a Gateway Determination, which is attached. The Determination is that the matter should not proceed for the reason listed in the attached Determination schedule.

Gateway Determination

Planning Proposal (Department ref: W09/00115): To allow for a clustered rural residential proposal of up to 30 lots at 8360 Monaro Highway, Royalla (Lots 1 & 2 DP 456367, Lot 2 DP 131294 and Lot 1 DP 1067259).

I, the Director General as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 56(2) of the EP&A Act that an amendment of the Yarrowlumla Local Environmental Plan 2002 to allow for a clustered rural residential proposal of up to 30 lots at 8360 Monaro Highway, Royalla **should not proceed** for the following reason(s):

- 1. The proposal is considered to be inconsistent with the requirements of the Sydney Canberra Corridor Regional Strategy as it is not supported by a LGA wide strategy.
- 2. The proposal is likely to set an undesirable precedent for further spot rezonings for rural residential development in the vicinity.
- 3. The proposal will result in the fragmentation of rural lands outside of a strategic and planned approach and is not in accordance with the Rural Lands Planning Principles in the Rural Lands State Environmental Planning Policy.
