Part 1 - Objectives or Intended Outcomes

Part 3 – Justification

Section A - Need for the planning proposal.

1. Is the planning proposal a result of any strategic study or report?

Council received funding from the Heritage Branch of the Department of Planning to determine whether items listed as having State heritage significance in the Newcastle LEP 2003 and not on the State Heritage Register (SHR) should be included on the SHR.

In order to clarify the status of items listed as having state significance in the NLEP 2003, the Heritage Branch offered Council a \$50,000 grant to review the potential significance of these items in accordance with current Heritage Council requirements for SHR listing. Council has also contributed \$15,000 to assist this project.

The consultants, Heritage Assessment and History (HAAH), engaged to undertake the review, completed an assessment of 68 items in total and have nominated 37 items for inclusion on the SHR and have recommended that 31 items have their listing changed from 'State' to 'Local' significance.

2. Is the planning proposal the best means of achieving the objectives or intended outcomes, or is there a better way?

To enable the recommendations of the heritage consultants report of having the 'State' significance 31 items changed to 'local' (20 items in the Newcastle LEP 2003 and 11 items from the Newcastle City Centre LEP 2008) a planning proposal is required.

3. Is there a net community benefit?

The planning proposal will clarify the heritage status of these items which will alleviate the current confusion / time delays when a development application is made regarding the potential for development of the items.

Section B - Relationship to strategic planning framework.

4. Is the planning proposal consistent with the objectives and actions contained within the applicable regional or sub-regional strategy (including the Sydney Metropolitan Strategy and exhibited draft strategies)?

The planning proposal is consistent with the objectives and actions contained in the Lower Hunter Regional Strategy. In particular the planning proposal is consistent with the outcome that:

All places, precincts and landscapes of cultural heritage significance in the Region are identified and protected in planning instruments.

5. Is the planning proposal consistent with the local council's Community Strategic Plan, or other local strategic plan?

The Newcastle Urban Strategy is Council's local strategic planning document. The planning proposal is consistent with the document in that

8. Is there any likelihood that critical habitat or threatened species, populations or ecological communities, or their habitats, will be adversely affected as a result of the proposal?

The proposal intends to protect a number of existing buildings and items, and as such there is no likelihood that critical habitat or threatened species, populations or ecological communities, or their habitats, will be adversely affected as a result of the proposal.

9. Are there any other likely environmental effects as a result of the planning proposal and how are they proposed to be managed?

No other environmental effects not already discussed have been identified.

10. How has the planning proposal adequately addressed any social and economic effects?

The planning proposal intends to protect a number of items and buildings of heritage significance by placing them on the heritage schedule of the Newcastle LEP 2003.

Section D - State and Commonwealth interests.

11. Is there adequate public infrastructure for the planning proposal?

The planning proposal involves minor administrative changes to the instrument.

12. What are the views of State and Commonwealth public authorities consulted in accordance with the gateway determination?

No consultation has been carried out at this stage. Consultation will occur with relevant State and Commonwealth Public Authorities identified as part of the gateway determination.

Part 4 – Community Consultation

The planning proposal is considered to be of low impact, in that:

- it is consistent with the pattern of surrounding land uses;
- is consistent with the strategic planning framework;
- presents no issues with regard to infrastructure servicing:
- is not a principle LEP; and
- does not reclassify public land.

In accordance with "A guide to preparing local environmental plans" it is proposed to publicly exhibit the planning proposal for a period of 14 days.
