Statement of Significance: 1 Bayside Drive, Lugarno is an impressive example of stone Federation house built in 1892 on a rock basement. It is one of the oldest residences in Lugarno and it is highly contributory to the streetscape. Characteristic elements of the Federation style include the wide verandah with timber posts and ornamental brackets, deep, shady verandah, Marseilles tiled roof, large board timber eaves with coronating timber finials. It was one of the earliest houses built in Lugarno.

Historical Notes or Provenance: One of the earliest houses built in Lugarno.

George Edward Chislett had a boot shop in Newtown. He bought 5 acres of land from John Henry Geddes on 8th April 1892. A stone house was built in 1892, and was the home of Mr Chislett senior. A weatherboard house was also built on the property for George Edward Chislett, Junior in 1909.

The Chisletts were flower growers who transported their goods to Como by launch and from there into the city by train to be sold at Searls in King Street and Miss Birmingham's in Oxford St.

The land sloping down to Lime Kiln Bay was terraced and stone paving was put down. Two wells were sunk; one well, some terraces and paving may be seen in Bayside Drive Reserve. The larger well near the house provided the stone from which the house was built.

After his parents died, George Chislett junior moved into the stone house. Following his death the property was sold to Horrie Martin and B. Craig. Around 1950 Mr Horrie Martin's

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son and wife came to live there. It was known as Craig's Nursery, then Martin's Nursery with the name 'The Hermitage' on the gate.

Physical Description: Sandstone house with a street facing gable topped with a timber finial, and roofed with corrugated iron. The Bayside Drive frontage has a later addition with dormer windows added and a verandah supported by grouped timber posts on stone bases. The house is built on stone foundations above street level. A new stairway has been constructed of stone leading to the side entrance.

Physical Condition: Good condition.

Modification Dates: Later modifications include the dual garage at the ground level dug into the rock foundation.

Recommended Management: The building should be retained and conserved. A Heritage Assessment and Heritage Impact Statement should be prepared for the building prior to any major works being undertaken. Archival and photographic recording, in accordance with Heritage Council guidelines, should be undertaken before major changes.

Further Comments:

Criteria a) The Hermitage in Lugarno is a late Federation style house.

Criteria b) Associated with The Chislett family, a local family of flower growers who transported their goods to Como by launch and from there into the city by train to be sold at Searls in King Street and Miss Birmingham's in Oxford Street.

Criteria c) 1 Bayside Drive, Lugarno is an impressive example of stone Federation house built in 1892 on a rock basement. It is one of the oldest residences in Lugarno and it is highly contributory to the streetscape. Statement of Significance: This house could not be inspected from the street due to its location at the river shore with only means of access being the private stairs and travelator.

Historical Notes or Provenance: Killarney is one of the few remaining riverside holiday house in Lugarno. It was built by S.R. Buttle in 1931. He was a wealthy businessman who built up 89 grocery stores - an early chain of cash and carry grocery stores - including one in Hurstville. Beside the house is a boatshed with a slipway to the river and a little way up the kill is a detached billiards room with a full size billiards table. Buttle invited well known billiards players to play there.

Behind the house is a small garden with mango trees. Views from the house include Great Moons Bay and the Georges River Recreation Area across the river. The vernacular architecture of Killarney, sited in an area retaining many of the natural features that attracted S.R. Buttle to the area in the 1930s is an important part of the history of Lugarno.

Buttle sold the property in 1936 for £1000, to the Coe family, who added the wooden venetians to the verandah. Later owners were Downes from 1950 and Curtis from 1966.

The National Trust of Australia classified Killarney in 1986.

Physical Description: Entry is opposite no.7 Bayside Drive, via concrete steps which lead to the stone path and steps. Made of hand cut sandstone the path is a rough track now paved in some parts, edged and with banks retained with cut stone blocks and mortar. Statement of Significance: This house could not be inspected from the street due to its location with only means of access being the private road.

Historical Notes or Provenance: Frederick W. Middleton purchased the 40 acres estate on 2nd November, 1885 for £1 325. Middleton was an accountant and the Managing Director of the British Australian Land and Building Company, The British Land Bank Company, Mercantile Finance and Depositors Company Ltd. And Orchard Company Ltd., all located at 161 Pitt Street, Sydney. He lived in Excelsior Parade, Marrickville at this time. With the coming of the railway to Hurstville in 1884, and its extension through Como in 1886, Middleton would have seen prospects for his land speculation companies and so he made several purchases in the district. The railway made it possible for a businessman to work in the city and live at Lugarno, which was fairly isolated at this time.

Middleton had a substantial house built overlooking Lime Kiln Bay in 1891. It was built of brick with a slate roof featuring an attractive pattern. He lived here from 1891, in which year the Census shows five males and three females in residence.

By 1892-3, rates and valuation book of Hurstville Council shows the house was vacant and the British Australian Land and Building Company was in liquidation, F.R. Bretnall being the liquidator. Middleton's company was apparently a victim of the depression of the 1890s. Between 1st April, 1891 and 4th May, 1900, the property was owned by the mortgagors S.A.Want, Celia Maddock and F.T.Humphrey, and occupied by various tenants. G.Ramaciotti held power of attorney for Celia Maddock, and may have lived in the house, and carried out improvements to it.

In 1895, L.C.Russell Jones leased the property, and Martin Burns occupied it from 1895 to 1897, then David Bradford from 1898 to 1899.

Adolph Heinrich purchased the property on 4th May, 1900. Mr Adolph Heinrich was born in Germany in 1853, and twenty one years later migrated to Australia, and lived in Waterloo whilst in 1885 Adolph had a new bakery built in Henderson Rd Alexandria. When the Heinrichs bought the house it had become derelict, and fishermen had used it to camp in. Mr Heinrich began restoring it, travelling from Alexandria to do so. Sam Pearce was made caretaker. The home was named 'Woodcliffe', a name later given to the street in which it stands.

A large launch owned by Heinrich was called 'Edelweiss', one of the first launches fitted with electric light, along with two other launches which he used to sail to Como in order to catch a train to the city.

the property was developed with the aid of friends and employees. A road from Forest Road down to the house was built. A workshop, stables and boatshed were build, and later an orchard and garden with rockeries and stone paths. Some of these are now in the Bayside Drive Reserve, and beside some stone steps the inscription 'Adolph Heinrich 1900' may be seen. Tennis courts and three fowl houses were established where the houses of Bayside Drive now stand. There was a well beside the house, and also an elaborate water supply system. Several tanks for catching rainwater were placed around the property, connected by pipes, and water was supplied to all parts of the property, even the boatshed. These tanks were bought at auction, and a trailer was made with wheels cut from the trunk of a tree. The bakery horses then hauled the tanks, loaded on this trailer, along the roads to 'Woodcliffe'. Adolph Heinrich retired from the bakery and went to live permanently in Lugarno in 1914. After his death In 1923 Adolph's son, Ernst Heinrich inherited the property and subdivided the estate, retaining only the original 10 acres upon which the house was built. Town water was piped to the area and the water tanks removed from the property. In 1938 his family moved into the house and remodelled the property. Additions were made the house primarily of brick and fibro construction, to create a new kitchen and bathroom at the western end of the house, as well as some art deco interior fittings like leadlight windows in the eastern facade, light fittings, and fireplaces. In the 1950s a brick sunroom was also added to the north-western corner of the house.

After Ernst Heinrich's death, the remaining 10 acres was subdivided in 1966 and 1968 by his widow. The house and the adjoining properties created by these divisions remained within the Heinrich family.

After the death of Mrs Heinrich in 1985, her three children inherited the house and was occupied by her son, Ernest until 1996, during which time much of the original slate roof was replaced with the original pattern being retained, but unsuitable proprietary clips being used rather than nailing.

In 1997 the house was purchased by Duncan and Lisa Stodart as a family home

It is the oldest remaining house in Lugarno, and the first house to be built of brick in Lugarno.
