Mr Blanton employed two live-in gardeners, a live-in maid, a laundress and a music teacher. His sporting interests were catered for by converting the croquet lawn to a tennis court, the original living room to a billiard room, and the stables to a gymnasium.

In 1928, the land around 'Ithiel' was subdivided, leaving one acre and twelve and three quarters perches surrounding the house.

In October, 1942, 'Ithiel' was sold to Horace Edgar Frank Pinnock, a scientific instrument maker and amateur astronomer. Further subdivision of the land took place in 1954, leaving two roods five and one half perches around the house.

The following year, the house was sold to Stanley Vernon Royal, a chemist who purchased the house as an investment and converted it into four flats. Modifications were made to the interior and staircases leading to the first floor units were added to the exterior. Further subdivision in 1955 reduced the grounds to one rood seven and one quarter perches.

In 1968 'Ithiel' was sold to Light-Master Holdings Pty. Ltd. who kept it for ten years. It was maintained as four flats duing this time, the house was painted its present grey colour, the original slate roof was replaced with galvanised iron, and the tiled front verandah was removed.

Kenneth Robinson purchased 'Ithiel' in 1978 and converted the two flats on the ground floor into his home. He then progressively worked on restoring the house to its original condition.

The Commonwealth Government purchased the property to become a post office on 22nd January, 1952, and transferred it to the Australian Postal Commission on 17th May, 1985.

Postal services in Penshurst were first established at the Penshurst Railway Station on 20th January, 1902. The Post office moved to the premises of William Henry Todd, who became postmaster on 1st January, 1909. A letter reciever was placed at the post office on 10th March, 1909, and a telephone cabinet was installed about the same time. The letter receiver was most likely moved to the grounds of this post office at Penshurst in 1909.

After this it was used as the practice of a GP.

They have an overall symmetrical facade with some decorative guoining brickwork, and is covered with a hipped terracotta tiled roof. A central gable with half timbered end decoration projects across the front of the house, above the main entry to each house to form part of the verandah. The verandah is supported with timber posts with simple timber brackets, and is enclosed at each end with small panes of multi-coloured glass.. The entire house has wide eaves with exposed rafters, and 106 has a gabled dormer window built in to the second storey roof space. The facade of each house is a mirror image of the other, with a door on the inner side and two double sash windows to the outer side. The front yards are grassed with some shrubs of a variety of sizes, and 106 is enclosed by a plain brick fence with piers and picket infill. The two yards are seperated with a simple picket fence. Both houses also feature tall rendered chimneys with moulded tops and terracotta pots. Physical Condition: Good condition. **Modification Dates:** Recommended These semi-detached house should be retained and conserved. A Heritage Assessment and Management: Heritage Impact Statement should be prepared for the semis prior to any major works being undertaken. Archival and photographic recording, in accordance with Heritage Council guidelines, should be undertaken before major changes. Management: **Recommended Management** No Action, follow existing management contols **Further Comments:** Criteria a) These semi-detached houses are of historical significance as part of the Federation period development in Penshurst following subdivision of the Penshurst Park Estate in 1886. Criteria b) Research to date does not indicate any historical association with a person or groups that are important to the historical development of the area. Criteria c) These single-storey brick Federation style semi-detached houseshave high level of aesthetic significance featuring typical characteristics of their style in a well executed and maintained manner. Their landscaped and well maintained gardens add to their streetscape setting and contribution. Criteria d) Social significance of the semis requires a more detailed study to ascertain their value for the local community. However, it could be anticipated that the semis' Federation style would provide a historical connection to the local community. Criteria e) These semi-detached houses have high potential to provide evidence on the construction system of Federation period semis in the area. There semis are one of limited numbers of Federation semi-detached houses in Penshurst. Criteria f) Criteria g) The subject semi-detached houses are representative of the Federation style semi-detached houses in the area.
