Planning proposal to amend Bega Valley Local Environmental Plan 2010

I am writing in response to your Council's letter dated of the 29th May 2014 requesting a Gateway determination under section 56 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") in respect of the planning proposal to reclassify and rezone Council owned land.

As delegate of the Minister for Planning, I have now determined the planning proposal should proceed subject to the conditions in the attached Gateway determination.

I have also agreed the planning proposal's inconsistencies with s117 Directions 2.1 Environmental Protection Zones and 6.2 Reserving Land for Public Purposes are of minor significance. In relation to s117 Direction 6.2 Reserving Land for Public Purposes, I have agreed to the reduction of land for public purposes at:

- Lake Street, Merimbula on the basis that a long standing encroachment matter can be resolved; and
- Moore Wrens Road, Tarraganda on the basis that it has limited public access.

No further approval is required in relation to s117 Directions while the planning proposal remains in its current form.

I have considered the nature of Council's planning proposal and have decided not to issue an authorisation for Council to exercise delegation of the Minister's plan making powers to make this plan. A number of the reclassifications will require the approval of the Governor.

The amending Local Environmental Plan (LEP) is to be finalised within 9 months of the week following the date of the Gateway determination. Council should aim to commence the exhibition of the planning proposal as soon as possible. Council's

request for the Department of Planning and Environment to draft and finalise the LEP should be made 6 weeks prior to the projected publication date.

The State Government is committed to reducing the time taken to complete LEPs by tailoring the steps in the process to the complexity of the proposal, and by providing clear and publicly available justification for each plan at an early stage. In order to meet these commitments, the Minister may take action under section 54(2)(d) of the EP&A Act if the time frames outlined in this determination are not met.

Gateway Determination

Planning proposal (Department Ref: PP 2014 BEGAV 003 00): Reclassification and rezoning of Council owned land.

I, the Acting General Manager, Southern Region at the Department of Planning and Environment as delegate of the Minister for Planning, have determined under section 56(2) of the EP&A Act that an amendment to the Bega Valley Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2010 to reclassify and rezone Council owned land should proceed subject to the following conditions:

- 1, Community consultation is required under sections 56(2)(c) and 57 of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979 ("EP&A Act") as follows:
 - the planning proposal must be made publicly available for a minimum of 28 (a) days; and
 - (b) the relevant planning authority must comply with the notice requirements for public exhibition of planning proposals and the specifications for material that must be made publicly available along with planning proposals as identified in section 5.5.2 of A guide to preparing LEPs (Department of Planning and Environment 2013).
- 2. No consultation is required with public authorities under section 56(2)(d) of the EP&A Act.
- 3. A public hearing is not required to be held into the matter by any person or body under section 56(2)(e) of the EP&A Act. This does not discharge Council from any obligation it may otherwise have to conduct a public hearing (for example as in this case if reclassifying land).
- The timeframe for completing the LEP is to be 9 months from the week following 4. the date of the Gateway determination.
